PRE-ROTTNEST INFO.

One of my favourite spots.

Types of fish we have caught in April:-

- Salmon - (We have consistently caught these)
- Yellow Tail - (Sometimes - but if they come on are they fun)
- Skippy & Herring - Patchy
- Tailor - Patchy

We catch the ferry at either Perth or Fremantle. One hour from Perth to Fremantle, another hour from Fremantle. Field Officer will quote times. We have a truck and bus organized at Rotto to get to the other end.

Most of us fish at West End.

Surfcasters have excess to a hut (unfortunately for MALES only) at West End, others set up Tents.

The key is to travel light with your fishing gear, camping gear, clothing food and eskies. Its best if you can work it out with a mate and share things like eskies, cooking gear etc.

Things you need:-

- Camping Gear:-
 - Tent & pegs rope
 - Sleeping bag
 - Cooking Gear
 - Pots & Pans
 - Food
 - Drinks & Water
 - Eskies

- Fishing Gear:-
 - Beach Rod
 - Flick Rod
 - Selection of rigs (at times fish and reef can cause heavy loss of rigs) SINKERS.
 - Back Pack
 - Small First Aid Kit

- Bait:-
- Mudies
 - White Bait/Blue Sardines
 - Prawns
- Clothing:-
- Light weight shirts & shorts
 - Warm gear
 - Waders/Wetsuits
 - Wet weather gear

For new members review this punch list with some of the old Rotto die hards.

West End is fairly hard fishing off the reef wading, scrambling up the cliffs and so on.

Some of the other venues are little less strenuous, off beaches and the like.

The club usually team up in the hut after Saturday afternoon early evening fishing. All take stews, curries etc., come out and mixed with a bit of elbow bending as it makes for a good session for fishing stories.

Sunday mornings are generally crisp and clear and can be spent chasing Tailor, Salmon and Herring.

Weigh in at midday, compare notes, break up camp then catch the bus and truck back to the ferry.

That trip to Rotto three years ago when both Salmon and Yellow Tail turned up in force. Let's hope we find them like that again.
