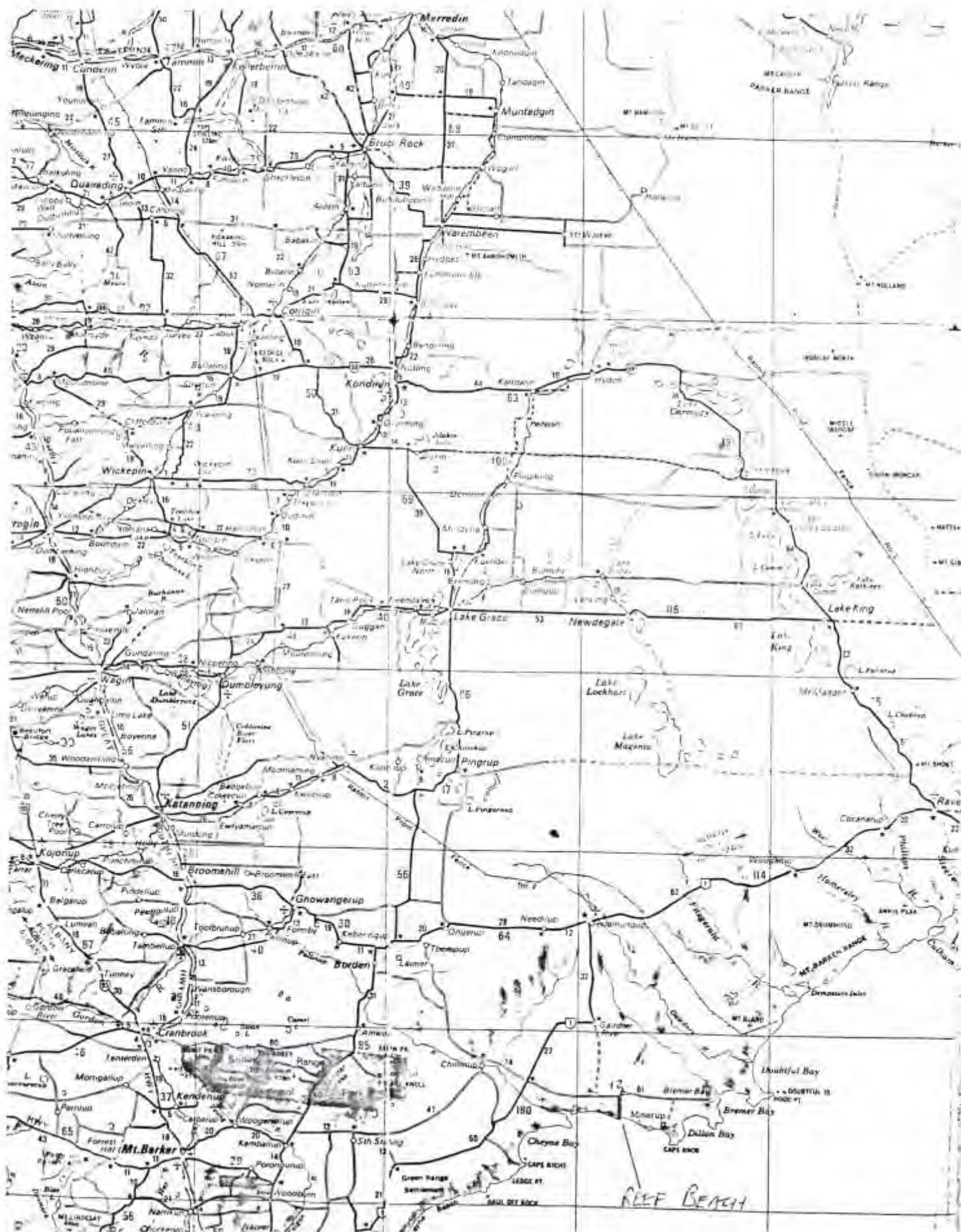

# REEF BEACH *Field Day*

SEPTEMBER 28TH - 30TH

Southern Game Fish territory!! This venue has produced some of the most exciting salmon and shark fishing that club members have experienced. It is a few years since the club has had a field day there and I personally am anticipating some hot fishing. There are some very deep gutters coming close inshore with reefs on the seaward side. These reefs are split by channels. It is through these channels and into the gutters that the salmon school. Once inside the sharks can then heard them up and have an eating frenzy. It is a common occurrence to see large sharks cruising along near the beach. Live salmon put out on heavy gear is usually rewarded by a very quick response, namely a blistering run followed by a long hard fight. This is where a game rod, reel and harness could be used for beach fishing to advantage. For those not into the big fish there is also skippy, silver bream and whiting.

Reef Beach is about 465 kilometres from Perth and 40 kilometres west of Bremer Bay. There is a couple of alternative routes to get there.

The most common route is Albany Hwy to Arthur River, Wagin, Katanning, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup and then south through Gardner River to the Bremer bay road. Approx 12K towards Bremer Bay is a wooden sign post labelled Reef Beach OSFC. You turn off here and drive down to the Off Shore Angling Clubs Hut.

If you miss the sign on the Bremer Bay road just further on you come to a farm on the left named PARNOO. A little further on is a road to the left sign posted Devils Creek South Road. go back and find the turnoff.

The alternative route is through Borden and then you cut across S.W. to the Bremer Bay road coming out 27K south off Gardener River. See attached map.

Having checked and balanced the books, it is clear to see that without; Social Fundraising, Sinkers Fund, Ali Cans, 20c in, and Trophy donations, the club would be in financial trouble.

**KALBARRI BUILDING ACCOUNT**

A deficit of \$824.86 between 30.6.90 to 30.6.91 is due to the economic climate causing a very low occupancy rate. Consideration should be given to having a permanent tenant. Due to lower interest rates, our returns on the savings and long term deposits are also lower than last year.

**GENERAL ACCOUNT**

Reel Talk expenses of \$1386.70 account for a large part of the general running expenses, but it must be noted that this is also an important form of communication amongst the members. During the year a transfer of \$498.20 was made from the Social Account to the General Account, half the profits from the Mandurah 500, to keep the General Account in credit. The purchase of Scales (June '90) and the video recorder (Dec '90) was also a large expense, \$550.00 total. This amount should have been paid from the Social Account, by doing this the General Account would not have been running so tight. Subs should be paid on time if at all possible.
