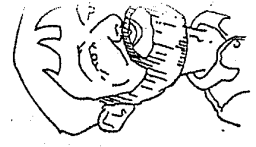
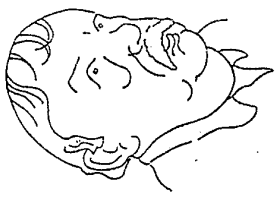
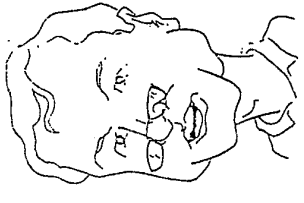
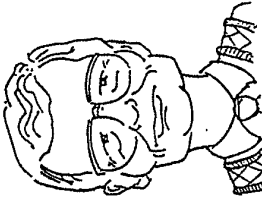
The fishing report:- Mulloway at Chinamans Beach to 11kgs (swimming hole) Chinamans Rock for Snapper to 4.25kgs, large Tailor 2ft at Blue Hole which still has craypots in it, everyone is cursing them because of the gear loss on hookups. Frustration is almost unfishable and all up here have given this spot away till Summer. Whiticarra some nights coughs up the odd large Mulloway with the occasional large Tailor. The coastal gorge fishing has been too treacherous with the large swells. Wagoes has had the odd Mulloway and Tailor the same as Whiticarra Ck. But the river is producing large Whiting, Yellow Eyed Mullet, Chopper Tailor, Silver Bream, Blue Manna Crabs and Muddies, up river above the rock bar. The river is still relatively clear as the rains from Paynes Find and Meekatharra have not yet filtered through. There is only a couple of longliners operating out of here and a shark netter who is getting very unpopular with his nets, but alas it is quite legal. The locals with the smaller boats are now going out, when the seas permit, and are trying for Yellowfin Tuna on light gear, trying to break the records - none have been successful as yet. Well the "Terrorists" have arrived this weekend, for the school "Hols" and there is hardly any Bum room for fishing so it looks like it is back to the rabbit traps tomorrow for a couple of weeks and dodging the stray bullets. Oh well, that's life up here. Hope to see you all once again. Must carve the roast goats leg for Maggie for tea tonight, so keep fishing, keep warm.

Above are the results of our present points system for the three categories of Club Competitions.

This is the first season of our adjusted points system and, in compiling the result, I feel justified in saying that this system works extremely well for any one person, whichever particular preference they may have in our two competitive facets ie. Fishing or Drycasting.

Any person competing in both areas consistently, with more than average results, can match a person who is perhaps a connoisseur of one area alone.

Having made this statement, I would like to draw your attention to two situations that may well upset our achieved satisfactory award system and should be addressed by Members and Committee ASAP.

- (1) On 9th May 1990, a motion was passed as follows;
"That the ten point bonus for attending the General Meeting applies for both Field Day and Drycasting if the member attends the General Meeting PLUS the Field Day PLUS the Drycasting."
- (2) In May 1993, another motion was passed as follows;
"All members who sign on for a Field Day shall receive ten (10) points for attendance providing that all members who attend the gazetted field day venue (not alternative local field day venue) shall be credited with an additional thirty (30) points ie. a total of 40 points.

Motion (1) as far as I know has not been implemented.

Motion (2) comes into the system in this 93/94 season.

Motion (1) if implemented will encourage the good club member with additional points.

Motion (2) obviously will only benefit members who have the ability to attend away field days.

SCENARIO:-

Bert is a new member. He attends General Meetings, Drycasting and Field Days for a twelve month season.

Motion (1) gives him 120 points, Motion (2) 480 points, a total of 600 points.

By contrast our Sportsman of the Year, J Reeley, received a total of 99 points.

I think this situation is greatly over compensated for and needs reassessment immediately by us all.
