Dear John,

RE: ROTTNEST HUT.

Currently this club is very concerned on the future of the hut at West End. It would appear that any excuse could cause the loss of the hut, an event which would be detrimental to both clubs.

Our committee has set down a list of minimum regulations for ourselves and clubs borrowing the hut, which are as follows:-

- (a) Only persons with the appropriate licence shall take (capture) crayfish and then only in accordance with the regulations of that licence.
- (b) The internal and external area of the hut AT ALL TIMES must be neat and tidy.
- (c) No fish are to be left exposed either inside or outside the hut.
- (d) Toilet facilities are located at Fish-Hook Bay and should be used.
- (e) By agreement with the Rottnest Island Board, women are not allowed to be accommodated at the hut.
- (f) Rottnest Island Board rubbish bins are to be taken out to the hut, used and returned for each separate fishing event or trip.

We call upon your members to adhere to these regulations as non-adherence will force us to change our shared hut situation, an arrangement which has been most successful for both parties to date. It is suggested we stall the inevitable eviction date as long as possible.
