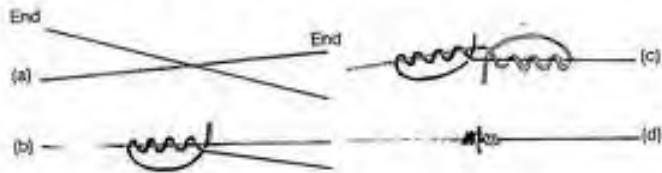

Blood Knot

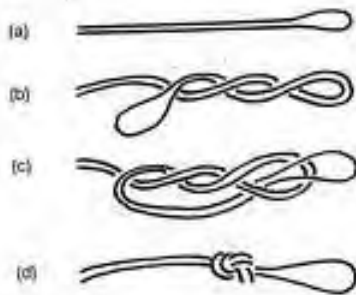
GOOD FOR JOINING LINES

Though only rarely used, the blood knot allows the angler to join two lines. This compact knot has good strength and travels through the runners fairly easily. It works best with lines of reasonably similar diameter. Sadly, when they differ considerably it is less successful. For example, you could use it to join lines of 6 kg and 4 kg, but not 10 kg and 6 kg.

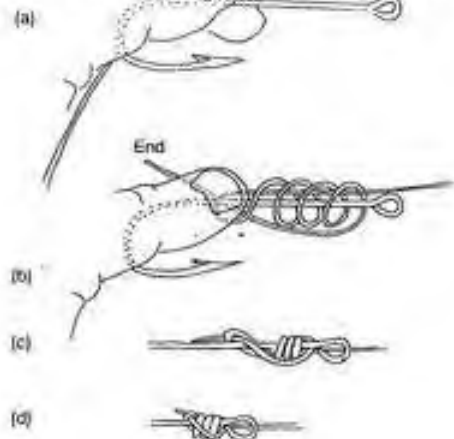


Blood Bight Knot

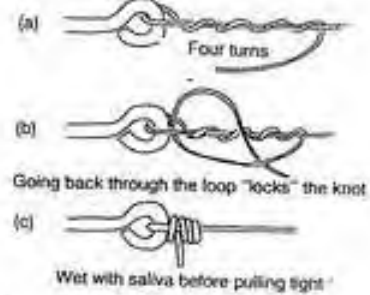
The blood bight knot is useful for creating loops in the main line, attaching a number of hooks or quick changing of bottom sinkers.



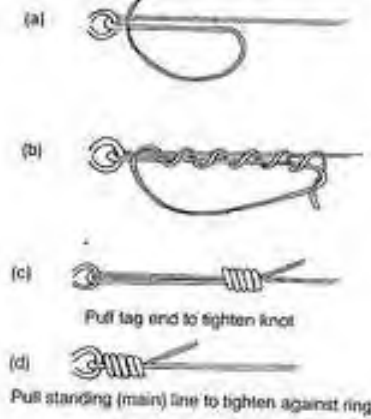

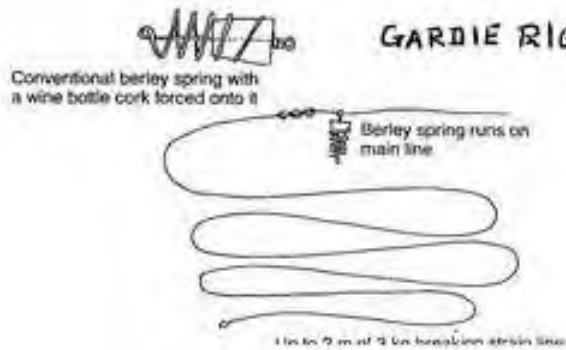
LOCKED HALF BLOOD KNOT

We saw a large shark, dolphins, a seal & mackerel all cruising around at the back of the reef but nothing would take our baits.

This was to be the format for the fishing side of things, however the break was great, the weather was terrific and given the right time of the year and weather conditions, these area's will produce good fish.

For those people with young children, both Horrocks and Port Gregory offer safe, sheltered beaches for swimming and fishing, plus easy boat launching facilities if you have a boat.

Horrocks and Port Gregory both have general stores which sell a variety of groceries, fresh bread baked daily, bottle shop in case you run out, petrol and diesel plus a fish & chip section for those who don't catch fish. " ME. "

Sample of menu Family Special :- 8 pieces fish, 4 squid rings, 4 crab sticks, 4 prawns, 2 scallops and \$5-00 of chips for \$20-00 and they were scrumptious. Half serves were also available.
