### FLINDERS BAY TRIP

The camping area was superb, with flat grassy areas surrounded by Peppermint trees. We picked out our spot and the camp was up in no time.

Pat and I wasted no time in driving down the track to investigate possible fishing spots for Saturdays field day. There were several good looking possibilities and we decided to try one out for a couple of hours. Whilst the hole looked very promising it produced only one Herring and one decent sized Whiting. We called it a night and proceeded back to camp for a gathering around the camp fire and a few refreshments.

As I stood next to Tony all night and fished within twenty feet of his bait I think I still have some things to learn about fishing!!

We decided to return to the warmth of the campfire where most of the members were gathered, enjoying good conversation and drinks of all kinds. We retired at 1:30am and did not arise for the morning's fish, thus our catch on Saturday was all we weighed in. We didn't miss much as those that fished the morning had little to show for their effort.

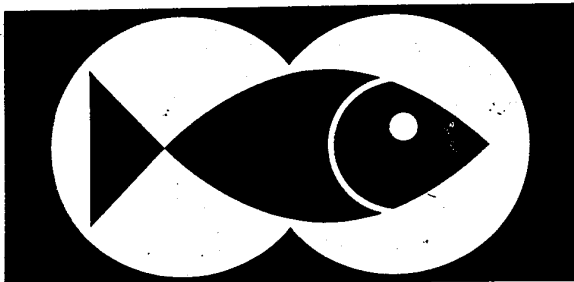

Congrats to those surfees concerned, they are top fish and weights to enter. Each one makes this job a privilege to carry out and so to you fellow casters go for it.

**GAME FISH BADGE**

**WHAT IS IT?** Just a small chromed pin badge for your hat, belt, whatever or as it was for me the culmination of an exceedingly challenging, tiring, adrenalin pumping exciting period of short sharp bursts over a very long period of time, three years to be exact. (Forget the expense, heart ache and disappointment) on having that fork tailed speed of lightening in the reel, the vibrations within your frame are unbelievable man!!

The following fish species are eligible: Albaore, Amberjack, Black Kingfish (cole), Bonfish, Dolphin fish, Marlin, Mackerel (all species), Queen fish (all species), Sail, Samson, Tunny or Tuna (all species), Trevally (all species), Wahoo, Yellow Tail King fish.

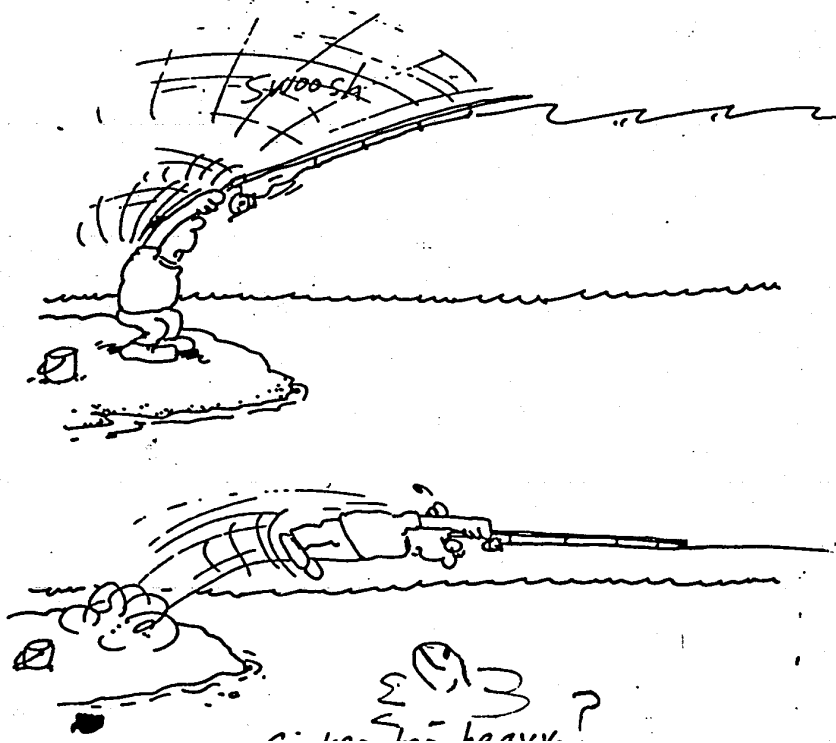

Further to our previous reports on our Reef Beach field, please note the following:

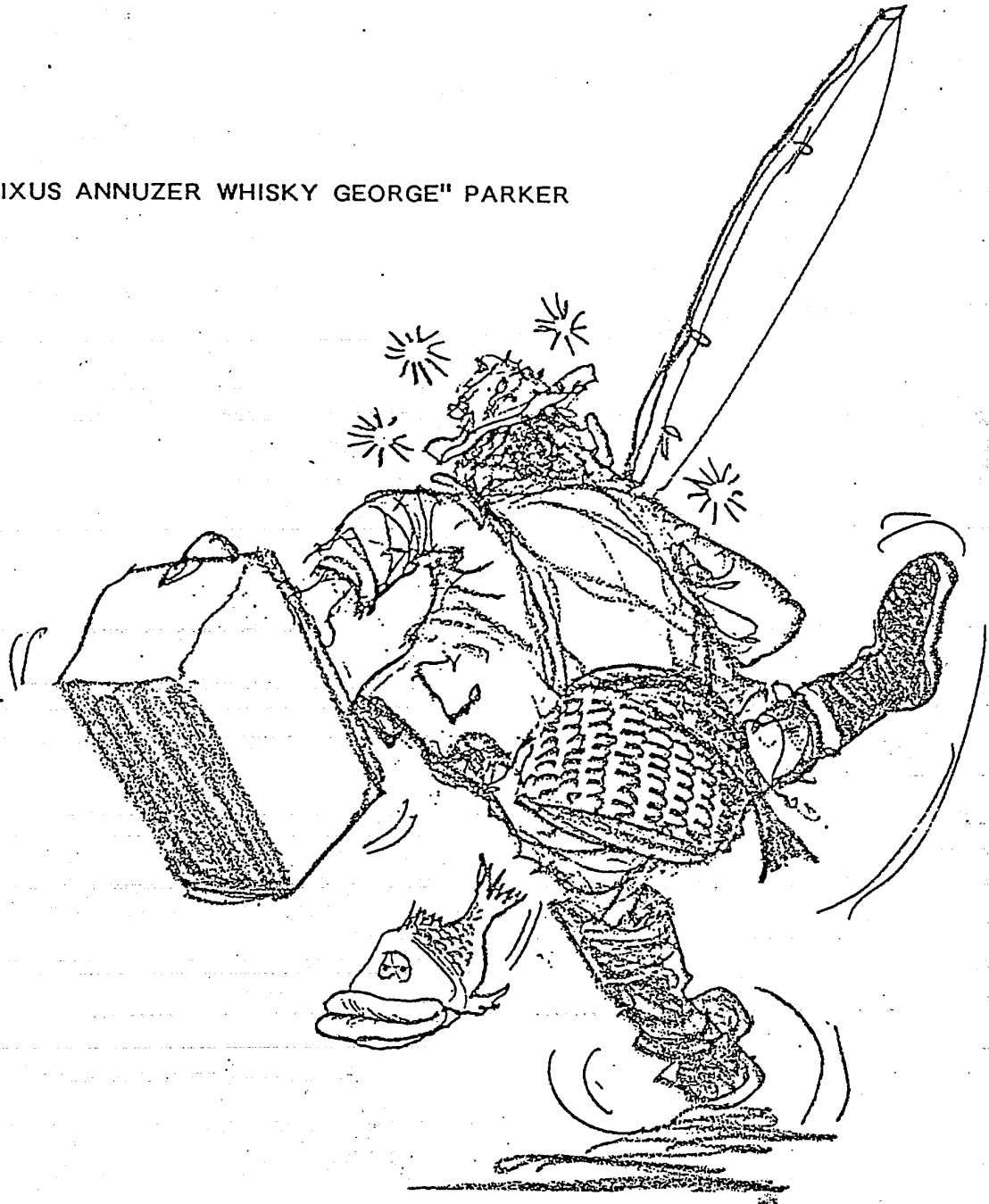
- \* This is one of our better southern trips - try and make it!!
