Our records now extend back to May 1956, as well as a few very early ones thanks to Doug Edwards.

SHARKS CAUGHT ON FIELD DAYS.

All eligible sharks caught on a Field Day are entered in the points per pound section - Section 1, in the Field Day competition. The 10 lb minimum is only enforced for Section 4 of this competition. Example, an 8 lb. Bronze Whaler is entitled to 8 points in Section 1, this same shark can win the heaviest Shark Award in the sweep on the Field Day, but can not be entered in Section 4 of the Field Day Competition. This is the same as a 4 lb. Tailor - is entered in points per pound - can win the Heaviest Scale Fish on venue (sweep), but is not entitled to be entered in Section 6 of the F.D. Competition as there is a 5 lb. minimum weight in this Section.

DRYCASTING NEWS - MARCH 1966.

Heavy clouds in the south west showed the promise of rain, but this did not eventuate and strong winds prevailed all morning. Clouds dispersed and the weather became quite warm.

There were twenty one members present, and it was good to see a new face, M. Morrison with us.

Three members reduced their handicaps this month - Allan Bunnett from 46 to 45, George Holman 180 to 158, and Ian McLennan 162 reduced to 150.

In the L.L. distance, W. Bridger cast the longest distance with 438 ft. The winners of this event were I. McLennan first, G. Holman second, and a tie for third, R. Tichbon and A. Bunnett. Nice to see Dave Latto exceed 300 ft.

D.H. Accuracy - four members scored with all four casts, and this proved to be a difficult event as it was set at 74 yards and 54 yards. With the winds blowing from behind us, the boys failed to take this into account, and many casts passed the target. R. Jensen did well to take first place with 49/80, and B. Utting second with 46/80, and A. Bunnett third with 44/80.

S.H. Accuracy - these targets were set at 128 ft. and 98 ft. As you can see by the following results, the boys are getting good - D. Talbot was first with 27/40, R. Tucker 26/40, with three members running for third place with 25/40 - Eric Sullivan, A. Bunnett, and B. Utting. Five members scored with all their four casts, but out of the eight accuracy casts, only three were able to score each turn.

The overall winner for the day was Allan Bunnett with 115 points, followed by R. Jensen and B. Utting with 101 points, and third place went to R. Tichbon with 98 points.

Open Distance: This was the last day of the open distance competition for this year and our congratulations go to W. Bridger the outright winner of the year with 1778, followed by

A. Bunnett 1693, and third place to Ken Jones with 1612. The three best casts for this last day of the open were made by W. Bridger 448 ft., A. Bunnett 445 ft. and K. Jones 433 ft.

The loss of a hard won fish at a time when victory is in sight is generally the outcome of lack of attention to some small detail of tackle.
