Attendance of 27 was high, with one visitor, seeing that quite a number of chaps were still away after the Murchison doing battle with the few fish left after the Field Day.

Glad to see Hew HoyYew with us again after his trip. Good to see a lot of new members joining in our casting activities, and showing great promise.

More than two thirds of members present this month cut big chunks from their handicaps -- this is very pleasing to see, and competition is becoming keener with everyone chasing to 'put one over the fence' - notably Tom Cairns who reduced his handicap by 125. This could possibly be a record on any one day - see what can be done next month Tom.

Ron Johnson had high hopes of a record cast with 458 ft., but this is still a few feet under Bill Bridger's mighty effort of 466 ft. set in 1965. A bit more practice Ron, and you'll be there.

Ken Jones has now reduced his handicap down to 12, just a little extra effort and Ken will have a nil handicap -- next month could be interesting - how about it Ken?

In the L.L. Distance event, this was won by Tom Cairnes and the longest cast made by R. Johnson with 458 ft.

MURCHISON FIELD DAY 1968.

One way or another, Ron (Killer) Kildahl, Ron (the hungry) Shirley and yours truly organised an extra day for this much-looked forward to trip. Not wanting to waste good daylight in travel, an overnight trip was planned. With ice and bait boxes full, a few cartons of grog, tucker and thermoses, plus mountains of gear, the trailer was loaded, lashed down, and we departed Como at 9.50 p.m. Thursday Feb. 29th.

1 a.m. arrived Marchagee, refilled the car and Shirley insisted on a snack before breakfast. The chap at the garage said Mackerel were being caught from Oyster Reef and good Kingies at the Chinaman. The boys want to know if we can go any faster.

With the back seat to himself, Killer had a good sleep before Marchagee so I kicked him out of the bedroom and put him behind the wheel. I was soon dreaming of big 'uns and whoppers, but was rudely awakened between Mingenew and Dongara.

Arrived Dongara 3.15 a.m. What an hour to yank a bloke out of bed for a few gallons of juice. Shirley needed another pre-breakfast snack so we all joined him.

Back to bed for me. Soon after I awakened to see the lights of Geraldton receding behind us. Getting close now. Where are we going to fish? Gardies or Mullet? What direction is the wind coming from? Hope we haven't forgotten anything.

5.30 a.m. we're at Kalbarri turn-off. First light coming up in the sky. Got a mouth like a cocky's cage. Feel like I've been up all night. Shirley's still hungry, Coffee and sandwiches again.

6.15 a.m. made our first kill. Unexpected and unpleasant. We were busy watching a roo that had jumped across the road in front of us when it's mate barged into the trailer. The poor thing broke a leg so we had to chase it into the bush and put it out of it's misery. They might be a pest, but there's something majestic about them in their natural environment. We must be softies. Everyone's gone quiet for the rest of the trip.

7 a.m. Arrived Kalbarri, we're sure we can see the Mackerel jumping five miles away. They come into better focus if you close your eyes. Gave Bob Lilly a blast on the horn but no response. His sleeping habits have'nt changed.

We're chomping at the hut. Who needs sleep when there's fish with your monogram on them. So off to the Bluff for a look see. There's Mackerel and Tuna jumping and not a soul to put a hook in them. Will we or won't we? Better get unpacked and settled in first.

A young chap fishing off the beach told us big fish were being caught, he got a five foot shark last night. The suspense is mounting, but we have to be practical. Back to the store to meet Mick Brogle, and soon after Bob put in an appearance. Mrs. Brogle gave us tea and toast which was very welcome, then Bob took us around to the new Kalgarrri Caravan Park. A good set up. Large annex on the aluminium caravan - those big, keep innerspring mattresses look inviting - electric light and hot water 24 hours a day, fish cleaning bench - the works.

Unpack, Whats it to be - bed or the Bluff. Can't be tired enough yet so grab some gardies and gear and off we go. Soon had the balloons sailing merrily on their way but we were too late, and weariness soon took the upper hand.

Back to the caravan, a lovely hot shower and onto that bed. To hell with the fish for a few hours.

Some Club boys have been here for a week, among them George Holman, Mike Dawson, Bob Hunter and Allan McLauchlan. George says there are big fish everywhere biting anything.

Later that evening George is a B----- liar. At 4 o'clock we treked over to frustration with high hopes. Beat the water to foam with the heavy gear. Although there was a strong sutherland blowing it was quite fishable. "I'm hungry" got three fish - 2 Tailor and a silver bream - total weight  $3/4$  lbs. I managed a pan size tailor and Killer nought. We retired in disorder about midnight and some silly bugger set the alarm for 5 a.m.

After a quick snack (you've got to keep feeding you-know-who) and a cuppa, we shot over to Oyster for another disastrous three hours. I had a bite off and Shirley dropped a good one. A lot of Club boys were there. Alan Bunnett, Doug Talbot and Bill Utting each got a good size kingie, and Bill also brought to gaff a beautiful 31 lb. Sea Kingie. Rudy Lerch also scored a good Mulloway. A few mackerel were taken along the reef and some other kingies, but I lost track of who caught what.

Terry DeJussing has moved into the caravan next to us and other

members are beginning to roll up for the Field Day which starts at 4 p.m. this afternoon.

After a feed and sleep we're going to tackle Frustration again this evening. Bob is coming with us and perhaps he'll be able to show us how.

Arriving at Frustration about 5 p.m. we found George Holman Mike Dawson and several others already fishing and had scored a few tailor. Before we were rigged up someone was onto a big one and in the subsequent excitement I lost track of what everyone caught outside our own party.

Rods were soon bending double and there were cries of "gaff! gaff!, gaff!" - "get your bloody line out of the water and let me land this fish", and "I'm onto one too!!", and so it went on. At some stages two or three bods were connected with big fish at the same time and cries went up:

"You're over me,  
You're under me,  
Jees - what a bloody mess."

Despite all this kingies were around the 20-lb. mark, and continued to come in. Then George got quite a nice shark, a bit later Killer got a bigger one, then I had a bite off only a few minutes after getting connected with a good one. Quickly re-rigging I was soon in business again, and this turned out to be an even bigger shark.

Although there was some slop coming over the front of the rocks it was quite fishable. It could be a bit dicey for anyone not experienced in the area, but our party have fished it for a number of years and know most of the traps. We keep an eye on the waves and one another, so there is always a helping hand if there is a spot of bother.

We stuck it out till 11.30 p.m., but George and his party carried on as they intended to stop the night. Boy they're keen. Our final tally for the even was Rom Shirley 24 lb. Malloway, Bob Lilly a nice Malloway and a shark, Ron Kildahl



two sharks, and you're truly 2 Malloway and a shark. We had to make two trips back to the boat - a half a mile each way, and by the time we got cleaned up and cooked a feed of shops, it was 2.30 a.m. before we hit the sack. We were up again at 6 a.m. Sunday. A bit late, but we arrived at Oyster in time to see Doug Talbot on his first trip to Murchison get a brack of Mackerel. "Jagger" was being freely bandied about by his mates. If that doesn't convert him to a Murchison fan, nothing will.

Ray Porter, an ex club-member, also on his first trip, got one too.

We missed the early run of fish, but we battled on after every one else had given it away without result. Doug, Bill and Alan had gone for a walk to look at Frustration and they returned as we were packing up. Doug decided to try a few more casts and immediately got a strike, where we had been trying for the best part of an hour. Unfortunately he was unable to convert the strike to a fish. So back to the camp for a feed, shower, then down to the boozier for a session where we expected to compare notes with those fishing the other spots. It was some time before any Club members turned up - too busy with gear and thoughts of where to fish tonight I guess. Finally Doug Newton, Snow Tate, Ron Mansfield and party turned up, they're here for a fortnight and the catches so far auger well for them. After a few coldies we hit the sack again for a few hours. Shirley decided to give the Chinaman a go. Killer and I returned to Frustration as did Bill Utting, Doug Talbot and Alan Bunnett. On arrival we found a junior there by himself contrary to Club rules, and when he reads this he will appreciate that we were acting in his best interests in reminding him of the rule.

And it was on again after a rather slow start. Although we did not fish long, Killer got four Malloway as did Alan Bunnett, plus a small shark. Bill Utting got a couple too, Doug Talbot a small shark and I managed two Malloway and a small shark. All the sharks taken in this area were black tip Whalers and good fighters. The junior also got a couple of very nice Malloway.

At the weigh-in, fish came in thick and fast, and as far as we could judge, everyone on the Field Day must have got atleast one good fish.

Heard that Rudy Lerch was involved in a humorous incident in landing a big Mulloway at the Chinaman. It seems that after getting fouled up with someone else and the fish getting snagged up somewhere, he had to hand line it in, but before getting it to gaff, it either broke off or threw the hooks so Rudy in after it and finally man-handled it ashore. He really deserved that one.

After dressing our fish, having a feed and a clean up, we cracked a few bottles with Bob and Mick Brogle. A rough tally showed about 1850 lbs after Sunday night's weigh-in.

We're not fishing in the morning as we want to get an early start on the return trip, so we'll have to wait till the next meeting to see what the final poundage is.

By 8 a.m. Monday we were packed and ready to go. After getting our fish out of the freezer, filling the tank and getting a few packets of sandwiches we were on our way by 9.15 a.m. What a stinking day it turned out to be. Ran into a sea breeze near Geraldton and thought we were in for a comfortable trip for the rest of the day. But when we turned east at Dongara, the heat hit us again. When we refilled at Minigenew the garage thermometer said 102°, and we did not strike the sea breeze again until approaching Pearce.
