This venue will be conducted at Margaret River over Saturday 17th and Sunday, 18th April, commencing at 4 p.m. on Saturday and ceasing at 8 a.m. on Sunday. The area to be fished will be 20 miles either way from the centre (as the crow flies). This is a new area for most members so come along and give it the once over.

APRIL DRYCASTING:

This competition will be conducted at the Floreat Park Oval on Sunday, 3rd April, commencing at 8 a.m. sharp. Casting will consist of the usual level line, double-handed and single-handed accuracy events. This is the last casting day for the season, so come along and end it with a large roll-up.

MARCH FIELD DAYMURCHISON

Eight Spanish Mackerel, Thirty-two Mulloway and Fifty-eight Sharks made up the bulk of 1709 lb total catch and made this a field day to remember.

Everyone signed in at the allotted time which was a great help, (thanks fellas), and then departed for points along the coast from Wago to Frustration Rock.

All our hopes were high as reports of catches prior to the field day were extra good. The Pres. Mr. Wu, and Doug Dalbot had each bagged Spanish Mackerel off Oyster Reef. GEORGE HOLMAN and GARRY GILDERSLEEVE had been doing well with Mulloway and LES REID, RUDY LERCH, ULRICH SCHUCHALLA (it's as hard to pronounce as it is to spell) and JOHN NUICH had also been giving the "Kingies" a nudge.

A fairly stiff southerly was blowing at the commencement of the competition but this eased at about eight o'clock and made fishing more comfortable.

Only four anglers fronted for the first weighin; LES REID, JOHN NUICH, TONY SMITH and Yours Truly. John and Les had been fishing the "Cutting" area which resembled a porcupines back; everyone and his dog were there. John was highly delighted with his 21lb 4oz Mulloway. Les hadn't scored at this time. Tony and I had fished "Oyster". Tony had a couple of small sharks and I had a shark and a kingie.

Sunday morning a fresh South Easterly was blowing, which made for very pleasant conditions. The weighin at 10 o'clock kept us really busy. GARRY GILDERSLEEVE had done a ghoster off "Chinaman's" and produced five Mulloway for a total of 103 lb, knocking off Section 11 (Heaviest Bag of Mulloway) - he also had a greynurse shark of 61 lb - not a bad night's fishing eh!

The Pres., DOUG TALBOT and LES REID, got into the Mackerel off Oyster - Ron's went 28 $\frac{1}{4}$ lb, Doug had two 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 24 $\frac{3}{4}$ lb and Les topped the lot with a 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ pounder which also took off heaviest scale fish. JOHN DEVITT got himself a mackerel off "Frustration" on Saturday evening which went 21 lb cleaned.

The boys who went to Wago came back with the biggest swag of "bities", we have ever seen. GEORGE HOLMAN had 11, COL BUCHANAN and GRAHAM BASKERVILLE had 9 a piece and BRIAN MOLLET (V) (George's mate) had 5. All had been smashed up at least a couple of times by "unstoppables"; - no wonder they looked as though they were sleepwalking!

BARRY REYNOLDS did his Snapper trick again, only a little one - $4\frac{1}{4}$ lb - but a snapper all the same. LOFTY GRIFFITHS came in with a good mixed bag containing a 6 lb mackeral, a tailor, a mulloway, 3 sharks and 2 tarwhine. Sunday night he added a 64 lb whaler shark and another mulloway to his collection.

KEITH FLEMING, BOB FREDERICKS and V. FREDERICKS (V), left the tailor on the bite to make the weighin. Keith had 29 lb, Bob $10\frac{1}{2}$ lb and V.-10lb. HEW had 3 sharks, 1 kingie and 4 tailor to his credit from fishing the Bluff area.

JOHN COTTER came in with a couple of sharks and a nice Kingie of $22\frac{1}{2}$ lb and son PETER was highly delighted with his 17 pounder. It was good to see NEV. RISBEY performing well; his luck hasn't been the best for awhile, but this time he weighed in $88\frac{1}{2}$ lb of fish; "good on yer mate"!

JACK HARVEY had the misfortune to hurt his back before the field day and he and ARTHUR HORTON didn't fish, but they attended all the weighins. Jack was busy with his camera, so we should get some good shots for the Club album.

TED and DOUG SAVAGE, SNOW TATE, DOUG NEWTON and RON MANSFIELD, fished Wago and brought back snapper and small sharks. Doug Savage had a mackeral which went 21 lb cleaned.

The fish weren't quite as co-operative on Sunday night. However, COL BUCHANAN got lucky again with a couple of mulloway and three tailor and knocked off the overall bag with $186\frac{1}{2}$ lb. GARRY GILDERSLEEVE and GEORGE HOLMAN teamed up for an all-nighter at Chinaman's, but the fish weren't playing. George could only manage one mulloway and 2 tailor and Garry lost his touch completely and didn't get a bite.

SNOW TATE got a mackeral ballooning off Oyster early Monday morning. There were about eight of us bait casting madly at the same time but without success. GRAHAM BASKERVILLE added a couple of kingies to his bundle of sharks, one went $26\frac{1}{2}$ lb which was the heaviest for the competition.

Only 33 points separate the top four anglers. HEW is still leading with 444 points. GRAHAM BASKERVILLE is only 5 points behind with 439. GEORGE HOLMAN is running third with 429 and COL BUCHANAN has 411 points. It'll be on for young and old at Margaret River next month.

I would like to extend a special "thank you" to BOB LILLY for his help and co-operation. Having the use of his premises for the weighing and cleaning of our fish made things very pleasant for all concerned. Thanks again Bob.

Well that about wraps it up for this month. I think we can record this field day as a huge success. Let's hope the fish are as co-operative at Margaret River next month. See you there.

CASTING CAPERS

As tipped some months ago, GARY GILDERSLEEVE, by sending down three casts without B.O's, shattered his handicap. In fact he was the only competitor to do so. It was not for want of trying by most members, their failure was caused by the very stiff S.W. wind estimated at 15/20 knots.

Owing to a double wicket competition at our normal oval, we had a last minute switch to Perry Lakes Stadium, this being arranged by phone in the week preceding the casting. I had a forboding on Sunday morning that things may not go according to schedule so RUDY, WALLY and I left early to make sure we had things ready when members arrived. (It was previously arranged that RON KILDAHL and JIM STRONG would direct casters to the new venue. In this they did a stirring job).

On arriving at the stadium I was to contact a Mr. however the only person I could find was an Italian gardener. My Italian being what is is - non existant - and his Australian - such as IT was, we managed to make one another understood (I guessed a lot). As I feared he knew nothing about the arrangements and as our contact would not be there, the gardener would not let us enter.

Only one thing to do, shoot up and see the Ranger, good trick as he knew it all. We were soon back and entry was obtained.

By this time there were already a few members sitting around in their vehicles. To anyone who has been to Perry Lakes the grassed area is not very large and the only direction we could cast with any degree of safety was into the wind. Imagine JOHN DEVITT letting one go (a cast) with the wind. We would be measuring up in the top tier of seats.

So there we were - the three events all facing into the wind and parallel with one another. The actual starting point for the L.L. events was the new rubberized track (we were unable to use a small grassed area behind us as this was being watered and could not be turned off); and this was upsetting to some as there was a narrow ledge let into the compound and protruding slightly. Therefore some members on take off bounced their sinkers over this protrusion and no doubt upset them.

Anyway competition started somewhat late (about 9.30 a.m.) and the first event off the mark was the concluding OPEN for the year. Except for falling over and breaking an arm or leg or some other small ailment, it was a forgone conclusion that JOHN DEVITT would romp in and so it proved. John threw three easy casts and registered a distance of 432ft for his best. This gave John an overall score for the year of 1920ft - a very good effort indeed.

It was a close call for second place. RUDY had a slight edge on BOB prior to the days casting. In the end BOB TUCKER triumphed - putting down two good casts into the breeze which Rudy could not match. Their final points being 1602ft and 1592 ft respectively. (Close!) Other anglers to cast well during the Open were the eventual L.L. Hcp winner, GARY GILDERSLEEVE (362ft) also GEORGE HOLMAN (347ft), NOEL KNIGHT (347ft) and MIKE DAWSON (324ft). BOB TUCKER's best cast was 376ft and RUDY's was 340ft; enough to make the difference.

Twenty-eight members participated in the morning's events and an infrequent member in NOEL KNIGHT figured prominently in all sections to amass an all over total of 132 points and so win the day. Congrats Noel.

In the D.H. Acc. "DEADLY" DOUG proved too good for Noel by two points. Doug scored 49/80 to secure first position while Noel knocked up 47/80, from three scoring shots to snatch second spot from tied third placers in BILL MORROW and GARY GILDERSLEEVE with 46/80. Bill scored evenly with his four casts compared with Gary who seemed to shine at the shorter distances (180ft). RON KILDAHL 43/80 and BOB TUCKER 41/80 were others to have reasonable scores. By reasonable, I mean in excess of 40 points. (I would have settled for anything over sixteen points).

Already mentioned G.G. won the L.L. Hcp with 56 points and in doing so reduced his handicap by 140. (Food for thought). Nice to see BOB FREDERICKS send down even casts to equal his handicap. RUDY (scoring better than in the Open) fired three good ones. HEWIE after last month's good scores, must have found his own gear inadequate for the job. (We could say it was the wind if it is any comfort Hewie). RON KILDAHL and DENNIS GREEN (first time up) handled the conditions and gave creditable performances. METHOD OF MEASUREMENT: (Amendment to inside cover)

GARFISH are measured from the tip of the upper jaw to the end of the upper half of the tail; PRAWNS are measured along the body from eye to the tip of the tail; CRAYFISH are measured along the mid-dorsal line from the anterior edge of the pronounced ridge which joins the front edges of the rostral horns immediately posterior to the eye-stalks, to the posterior margin of the carapace; CRABS are measured from tip to tip of the posterior margin of the carapace spikes; MARROW are measured from the tip of the rostrum to the posterior margin of the carapace along the mid-dorsal line; all other fish are measured from the point of the snout to the end of the tail.
