CASTING NEWS. JULY 6th. 1969.

Last month, due to a human error in assessing averages, Rudi Lerch did not receive full credit for his score. Unfortunately, some members, owing to repositioning, lost 2pts off theirs. Eric Hill also suffered the indignity of having his name left off the published score sheet, although we did manage to include him in the Hcp reduction list. We apologise to all concerned, and assure Members that these errors have been rectified in the Records.

Sunday's casting result, saw some "shuffling" in the Top Ten positions. Bill Utting now heads the list, with Doug. Talbot 2nd and Bob Tucker 3rd. Bill also won the Day with a score total of 130pts. This ran him out a clear lead from 2nd place getter R. Tichbon with 123pts.

The dawn was cold with promise of a fine sunny morning ideally suited to casting. 32 members heeded the starting whistle at 9 a.m. whilst two tardy types came over the bank like a late sunrise. As the day warmed, so did the caster's prowess and humour. Much of the latter was directed to D (Dead-eye) Talbot whom it appears, was having an off day, in Acc. events. Open Dist. however showed him line he had forgotten existed on his reel. One or two others managed good scores in this event, causing the Handicappers to raise an eye, here and there.

Twelve reduced Hcps. by varying amounts, from Tom Smith's magnificent 48 to Bob Tichbon's 2. Tom also found some form to in the L.L. Dist. from Ian McLeman. "Mac" is a constant trier and it is nice to see him in the Top Scoring bracket, also pleasing to see Tom back with us.

John Devitt still wears the crown of the Day's longest caster, with 464ft. The first Open Dist. D.H. for the year also appeared to be John's territory with a top score of 472ft. Bill Bridger, one time master of Dist. events, managed a 2nd. place with 443ft. Next month brings the 1st. of the Year's S.H. Open Dist. and should produce some competitive scoring, as a number of members are showing keen interest in S.H. rod events.

Bill Bridger's score of 59/80 in D.H. Acc. was enough to gain him 1st. place in this event. Bob Tichbon, Bob Tucker and Graham Baskerville all shared 2nd. place with 57/80.

S.H. Acc. brought Bob Tichbon his third "Second" for the Day, when his 27/40 matched that of Bill Utting and placed them both 2nd. to Jim Strong, 31/40. It was pleasing to see Jim win this event, as his quick decisive casting technique sometimes fails him in Acc. events, although his enthusiasm and good humour never seem to.

August Casting will see me, no longer Casting Day Org. as I did not renominate for Committee. I would take this opportunity to thank all for their help and encouragement extended me during my term as Casting Organisor, in particular, my Assistant C.O. Brian Hanks, whose figure work made my job "a piece of cake". I am confident the Members of this Club will render the same assistance to the new Organisors.

The Members, Surfcasting & Angling Club of W.A. (Inc)

Mr. President, Gentlemen,

I wish to submit, for your approval, Statements of Income and Expenditure, Receipts and Payments and Balance Sheet for both the General and Building Funds.

The total Income for the year has increased by \$419. Due to total subscriptions increasing by \$121 for the year and Field Day Fees increasing by \$253. The remainder of the Income has not varied to any degree from last year. The increase in Subscription is due to an influx of new members. Field Day Fees have risen sharply on previous years, as costs on Rottnest Trips have been collected from Members and paid into the Club's Bank Account. These expenses (Boat Charter and Truck Hire) were then paid from Club Funds.

The total expenditure for the year has increased by \$433. The main items of expense to increase are as follows:-

REEL TALK \$50:-

During the year covers were purchased and this supply should last for some time.

BADGES \$115:-

Further supplies of Club Badges were purchased, and this item should not appear in the next year's expenses.

ROTTNEST ISLAND FIELD DAYS \$259:-

As explained above, this amount was paid out for Boat Charter and Truck Hire. Club funds only provided \$23. as \$236. was collected from Members.

Trophies this year decreased by \$44.

INSURANCE:-

During the year, the clubs "All Risk" Policy on property lapsed as an account for this was not received. This matter has now been attended to, and the policy has been renewed.

All other expenses remained constant.

The final result for the year was an Excess of \$132, as compared to \$146, the previous year.

The result is satisfactory, but the surplus is not excessive, as some costs will increase next year. It is known the Club has to rent a new hall and from investigations made previously, our rental will at least double the amount paid in the past. It is also necessary for the Club to purchase new scales and typewriter and even though these are not classified as "Expenses" it is still cash that has to be paid out.

The Building Fund has increased by \$599, during the year as compared with \$247, increase last year. \$172, of the increase is attributable to the Raffle run so successfully by Ted Savage, with the assistance of Les Tate. To those two members, especially, I would like to convey my thanks, as this function should have been performed by myself. The new Members' nomination fees also helped the fund increase as \$198, was received. Interest received from the Bank and the Investments in the Building Society also increased on last year.

As at 30th April, 1969, Club Membership stood at 156 which is an increase of 20 in the last twelve months. During the year 41 new members were accepted into the Club, but 21 old Members either resigned or failed to renew their subscriptions. On checking the records it would appear that in the preceding twelve months, the admission of 41 new members is the largest experienced by the Club.

In conclusion, I feel the Club has progressed satisfactorily financially, some Members may feel the Club's funds, especially the Building Fund, are not being utilised to its best advantage, and that these funds could be used elsewhere.

However, my own personal opinion is that this account should remain intact, and it is hoped will even increase. If and when premises or other accommodation becomes available the Club will at least have some finance available.

AUDIT OF CLUB FINANCIAL RECORDS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th APRIL, 1969.

The usual examination of the financial records of our club for the year ended 30th April, 1969 has been completed. All entries appear to be in order.

The receipts written have been correctly recorded in the Cash Book and money covered by those receipts has been correctly banked into one of the two bank accounts. All accounts passed for payment in the usual way have been covered by cheques drawn and have been correctly recorded. Receipts in support of these cheques have been sighted. Bank statements, for both accounts, for the year have been examined and the closing balances at the end of the year have been reconciled with the Cash Book records. Petty cash records appear to be in order.

The Balance Sheet dated 30th April, 1969, the Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year for the general fund and the building fund, the Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year, the Depreciation Schedule and the Summary of the Raffle results, as prepared by the Treasurer, in my opinion, correctly summarise the Club's financial transactions for the period under review.

Insurance premiums with the exception of the "All Risk" policy on property owned by the Club have been renewed as due and the Renewal Certificates have been sighted for the Insurance Policies. As mentioned in the Treasurer's report, the "All Risk" policy unfortunately lapsed during the year due to an oversight, but this matter has now been put in order and the Club's property is properly insured. The Registrar of members has been examined to ensure the names of new members, as recorded through the Minute Book have been correctly entered and that the payment of subscriptions, but members, has also been correctly recorded.

This year I have not been able to obtain the Property Registrar and there seems some doubt on the location of this record. This matter will be investigated and the result of that investigation reported to you in due course.
