JULY FIELD DAY: 14/15TH:GARDEN ISLAND:

Another wet and miserable Garden Island field day; a repeat of our earlier one in May, but with a better poundage and a very good rollup.

We all boarded the boat at approximately 10.30 a.m. and set off with prospects not looking very good. On arrival at the Island, all the gear was taken to the little huts where all members signed on. We managed 36 hardy anglers which was quite good considering the rain and wind that was bestowed upon us. After signing-on, everyone set out to their selected spots to start the fishing at 3 p.m.

A small team of very hardy anglers set out for the Guns to try their luck. The party consisted of L. SINGLETON 7lb15oz; S. RENSHAW 2lb10oz; G. RENSHAW 5lb12oz; G. BLOOMFIELD 4lb30oz; B. ROWLANDS 5lb7oz; R. ROWLANDS 5lb and F.D.O. 1lb 8oz. Weather conditions were not the best but everyone did their best. The bulk of the catch from the Guns was tailor, herring, flathead and mulloway; but, to our surprise, no skippy.

The remainder of the anglers fished the back beach and the south end of the Island and many varieties of fish were recorded; these being, tailor, herring, skippy, flathead, mulloway, salmon, rock cod, parrot fish, silver bream, king george whiting.

The total poundage for the field day was 112lb7oz.

The eventual winner was a visitor again in R. MAYZE 8lb4oz with salmon and warrag. Heaviest Scale Fish went to M. DAWSON with a nice 7lb3oz salmon. Most species of fish went to T. CORCORAN with 6lb of Parrot fish, Rock Cod, King George Whiting and herring. Heaviest Bag for the Juniors went to P. MARSH with 5lb15oz of tailor and Parrot fish.

After the weigh-in, the truck was loaded and taken to the jetty for unloading and then we were all ready to go, but, the boat wouldn't start. This situation was easily solved and one of the work boats towed the 'Trixon' back to Palm Beach. On the way back, Captain Graham Baskerville, decided to have a go on the helm, then everyone on board wondered what was going on. Graham must have thought he was in the Navy the way he was zig-zagging all over the place like a big mine sweeper. Happy to say Graham was relieved of his post very quickly much to everyone's delight!

After all that, we arrived back at Palm Beach to end another fine field day at Garden Island.

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT:

Let me first of all apologise for this report not being in the July "Reel Talk". A misunderstanding brought about this unfortunate oversight on my part.

This last year has been one of invaluable experience for me personally as many and varied things have taken place some of which I will mention briefly in this report. When elected to the position of President I gave a little speech on 'group' loyalty as opposed to club loyalty as I then believed that the former was undermining the latter. I must hasten to correct this error in judgment on my part, as, had I looked far enough I would have noticed that the club loyalty was still a dominate factor, and the majority of members still have the club at heart.

Your Management Committee has achieved much during the year which has had its ups and downs, but these ups and downs are to be expected when 12 people have a job to do and some definite and sometimes conflicting ideas on how to get that job done. It is hoped that the ensuing year with new faces on Committee will work with the zeal and dedication shown during 1972-73.

Four significant events during the year come to mind. Firstly the life-membership of Jim Strong. No-one can deny that Jim has proved to be not only one of the club's most dedicated workers, but a true friend of every angler.

After many months of patient sifting and thought, our Constitution has been redrafted and now awaits only legal opinion and members acceptance before final endorsement. The members of this club are to be congratulated on the way they handled this task.

A great honour was brought upon this club when our four-times "Sportsman of the Year", George Holman, was voted in as State Angler of the Year.

A further milestone in the Club's 1972-73 calendar was the formation of a building sub-committee which is investigating prospects of a joint building project with the Offshore Angling Club- once our most maligned adversary but now a true "brother club". Who knows? we may eventually realise that dream of our own building. The joint committees are investigating every possible avenue untill all are exhausted.

A work on competition:- Of our two main sources of competition, the dry-casting has settled down now to be one of the finest of its kind in the country- the envy of all clubs.

The angling side has undergone a major change. This year 1972-73 saw the acceptance by the members of a new conservation-orientated competition that not only evens the opportunities out but also encourages members to conserve fish while at the same time trying members skills to catch different fish

types necessitating more know-how and varied technique. While it is expected that there may be some problems to iron out the critics have been few so far and it is hoped that members have a good look at this- our unique competition- and be prepared to offer something better if they deem it necessary.

Finally, gentlemen, let me say that the prestigious prospect of trying to lead a club which boasts 140 members has its moments- good ones and bad ones, and this last year- our 21st- has had its share of both. We will, all of us, remember the good ones and learn lessons from the others so that 1973-74 will be a year of 'ups' and the Surf Casting and Angling Club of W.A. (Inc.) will be a club respected and envied throughout this State.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL 1973

Mr. President, Gentlemen,

I submit for your approval the attached financial statements and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th April, 1973.

GENERAL FUND

It can be seen that after allowing for depreciation totalling \$52, the Club experienced a surplus of \$192. This is once again a satisfactory result as was last year's surplus of \$31, and compares favourably with our budget for a surplus of \$200, to enable subsidising this year's "Annual Dinner and Presentation" night. This surplus can be attributed to the Club raffle which injected \$200 into each of the General Fund and Building Fund.

Main items which need commenting on are listed below:-

SOCIAL

Our social events for the year resulted in a net cost of \$28 and this, usually large item of Club expense shows a healthy trend when you compare against 1972's net cost of \$156 and 1971's net cost of \$300.

The result of the 1972 Annual Dinner amounted to a loss of \$13 income which was a particularly good effort. Our thanks must go to our then Social Organiser, Mr. R. Lerch, who conducted a small raffle on the night which helped reduce our loss by \$124.

Again, I must make mention that without the recent raffle which contributed \$200 to offset social expenses then the social loss would have been \$228 which would have prevented us from subsidising this year's Annual Dinner.

REEL TALK

The expense involved in operating our monthly "Reel Talk" reduced from \$361 in 1972 to \$213 this year. The reduction is due entirely to an abundant supply of paper carried over from 1972 into 1973.

DRY CASTING

This section of our Club usually is without expense but due to the Council now charging \$7 per month for the use of the oval, we will in future have to cater for the \$84 per year from general revenue.

In 1972 we had a surplus of \$34 as compared with this year's deficit of \$17.

NB: The Council commenced their charges in November 1972.

FIELD DAYS:

Revenue from Field Days increased from \$48 last year to \$85 this year. The increase is due to the good response from members in attending the Rottnest Field Day last August; which resulted in a surplus of income over expenditure on that field day, of \$39.

TROPHIES

The net cost of trophies increased from \$65 in 1972 to \$135 in 1973.

I thank all trophy donors on behalf of the Club and thank you, Arch Ticklie for your contribution in making sinkers for resale to members at most cost to the Club.

BUILDING FUND

The increase in the Building Fund for 1973 was \$560 as compared with \$329 in 1972. The increase is due to the Club Raffle introducing \$201 and increased investments resulting in increased interest.

CONCLUSION

It is my opinion that the Club has completed a successful year financially, but on anticipating this year's expenses and comparing to expected normal income and taking into account our surplus of \$192, it would appear that we will experience a deficit of approximately \$100. It is therefore recommended that a small raffle be conducted this coming year rather than increase subscriptions, to cater for the deficit.

I thank all Members for their co-operation and assistance during the past year.

A.A.A. OF W.A. DELEGATES' REPORT:

Jim Strong, myself and Roy Lundy (visitor), attended the last meeting of the above association.

This was rather a lengthy meeting as there were a number of reports from the team members returning from the Australian Championships, as well as other business.

A lengthy letter was received from the Boat Angling Committee which will be forwarded to all clubs for their perusal so that they may instruct their delegates how to vote when a motion is put on the points system for boat fishing competition.

A Notice of Motion was lodged by the North Shore Cruising Club which in effect is telling the A.A.A. of W.A. to "lay off" in their negotiation for boat ramps in the Whitford area as it may jeopardise the negotiation of the aforementioned Club in obtaining a boat ramp in the area.

Two fish were passed over for further identification and query- a Sea Pike (Snook) and a Tarwhine.

The Committee was formed for the State Championships to be held on the 15/16th September at Yallingup. The F.D.O. is Les Gadsby from South Suburban. Entry forms are to be forwarded to all clubs.

Final arrangements were made for the Convention to be held at Mandurah on the 4th August.

It is hoped that a good roll up of anglers and their wives will attend. The cost is \$3.50 per head for a well drawn up programme which will be thoroughly enjoyed. This includes luncheon and drinks for the women whilst enjoying a tour arranged for them.

Convention commences at 3 p.m. at the Brighton Hotel, Mandurah.
