PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 1975/76:

Members,

It is with pleasure I present to you this report on the past year's activities of The Surf Casting and Angling Club of W.A.

MEMBERSHIP:

Our membership saw a decline at the commencement of the year and for the first six months remained constant. However, the latter six months saw a good number of new members welcomed to our club.

FINANCE:

The club finance has been affected over the twelve months by inflation and it is becoming more difficult to meet the clubs commitments. It is credit to our capable Treasurer and Committee that we have finished the year in our present sound financial position. However, looking to the future, we will have to take measures to combat this and even moreso upon the successful negotiation of the purchase of the house at Kalbarri.

BUILDING FUND:

This year has seen the club take a positive step with the building fund in the purchase of a house at Kalbarri for the benefit of members and the club. This has meant a great deal of work by the Committee and in particular, our Treasurer, Dennis Green and our Property Officer, Ken Jones. The actual purchase is in its final stage and although there are a few minor problems it is hoped that these will be overcome in the next month.

FIELD DAYS:

The past year hasn't been a good one as far as our field days have been concerned, as we had to cancel one venue through bad weather, and the fish have been hard to find. This latter fact has, in my opinion, had a marked effect on our field day attendances which have been a little disappointing. I feel that the fishing in the future will not get better due to expansion, population, etc., and we will have to be very careful in our selection of venues and times to fish, if we are to be successful. However, our field days offer more than fish- they offer the companionship of club members.

DRY CASTING:

This activity has also seen a slight drop in attendances during the year and must be somewhat disappointing for our D.C.O., Eric Parker and his assistant, John Lee.

A New handicap section has been introduced in the hope of stimulating interest and attendances.

SOCIAL:

Our Social Organiser, Brian Leicester, has been a very hard worker over the last year and his efforts, and that of his committee, have been responsible for very successful social functions, culminating in tonight's dinner and presentation night.

TROPHY DONORS:

To our trophy donors goes the sincere thanks of the club. Their support is appreciated greatly by the club and even moreso by the recipients.

SURF CASTING AND ANGLING CLUB OF W.A. (INC.)Treasurer's Report for Year Ended 30th April, 1976

Mr. President, Members,

I submit for your approval the attached financial statements for the year ended 30th April, 1976.

GENERAL FUND:(a) Surplus/Deficiency

As can be seen, a deficit of \$143 was experienced after providing for depreciation of \$74. This does not compare favourably with the previous year's surplus of \$591.

I would also like to highlight that this year saw no major raffles organised unlike the previous year, which attracted income resulting in a profit of \$500.

(b) Subscriptions

Subscriptions were increased 20% to \$12 this year, but because of the "drop off" in membership, income from this source increased only 3.6% (i.e. \$39). If membership had remained static then we would have obtained an extra \$136 and would have only experienced a deficit of \$7.

(c) Reel Talk

Production of Reel Talk has felt the impact of increasing costs as can be seen by comparing this year's cost of \$546 against last year's \$259.

The production of Reel Talk is a cost per member of \$4.48 per year. Postage is not included.

SOCIAL:

In contrast to previous year's, our social events were conducted for the year to reflect a net surplus of \$15. In 1974 and 1975 our deficit was \$158 and \$250 respectively.

I compliment the Social Organiser for his alert awareness of costs and his success in conducting enjoyable social events without incurring heavy expense.

DRYCASTING:

This expense fell from \$80 to \$41 and is mainly attributed to the hire of the ground reverting back to a no charge arrangement for part of the year.

TROPHIES:

Without the generosity of all trophy donors this expense would never have been able to be contained to \$41.

Our thanks to all concerned. Special thanks must be given to Doug Clegg of Linnetts for his overwhelming support and to Eric Parker for his manufacture of sinkers for resale, which assist the trophy fund.

INSURANCES:

An increase of \$77 in this area this year was mainly due to the Personal Accident cover being allowed to lapse in 1975. However, it was renewed in 1976 at a cost of \$65.

The drop in membership this year was 8.9% as compared with the previous year's 2.2%.

BUILDING FUND:

The increase for the year was \$605 (11.8%) as to the previous year's \$567 (12.5%). The percentage of growth has fallen due to interest rates reducing to 9% during the year.

Income from nomination fees increased from \$54 to \$80 in 1976 only because of this fee being increased from \$6 to \$10. The intake of new senior members was 8 in 1976 as compared with 9 in 1975.

CONCLUSION:

Because of the continuing increase in costs, the trend in declining membership and the substantial increase in the cost of trophies in 1977 I recommend that subscriptions for seniors be increased to \$15, Juniors and Pensioners to \$8.

I feel that this increase in subscription will not cover our operating costs and that fund raising activities will be required in 1977 to break even.

I thank all Members for their assistance during the year.
