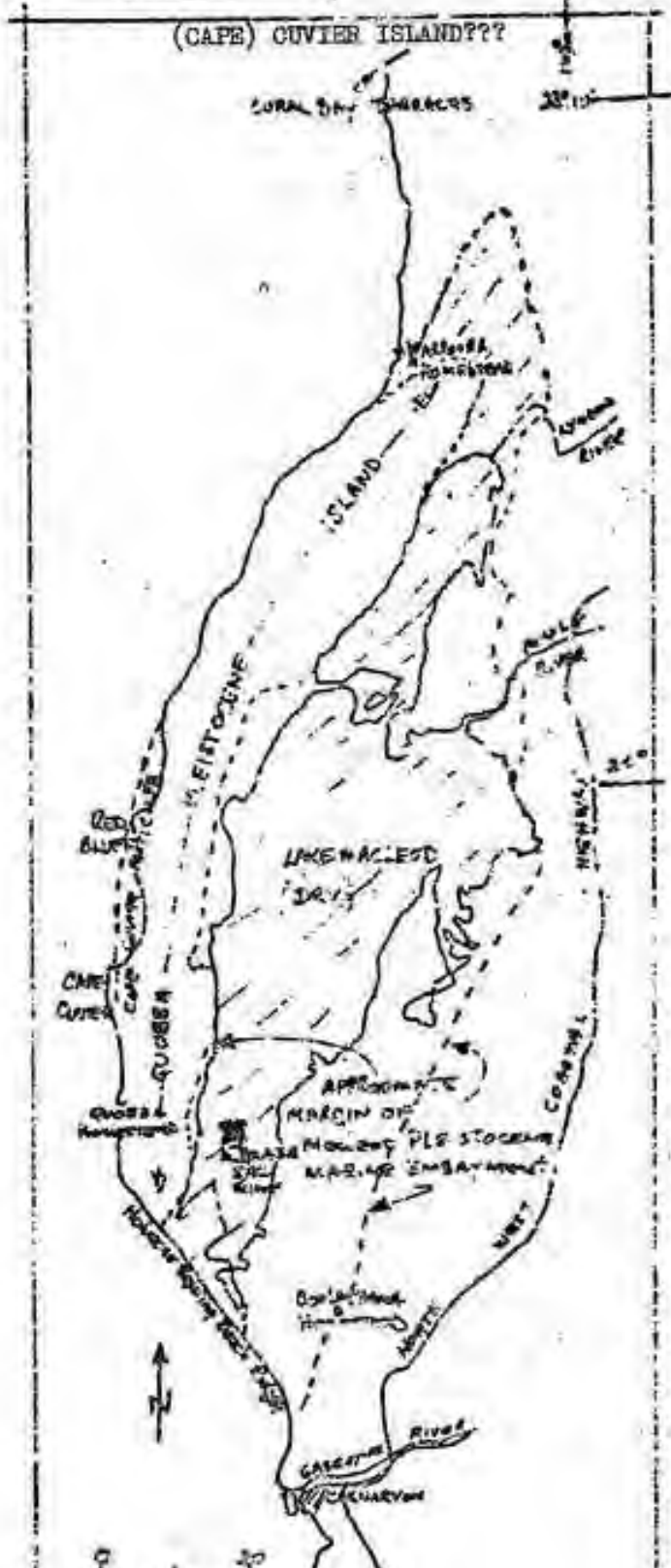
A great big thank you must go to those people who helped in any way with the organising of this major event.

Emergent marine erosion terraces and terrace deposits occur extensively throughout the Lake Macleod area, with elevations ranging from below present sea-level to some 10 m above it. At Cape Cuvier *IN SITU* corals and algal material occur at two levels, 3 to 7.4 m and 9.4 to 10.5 m.

Altimetric data in the Warroora homestead-Lyndon River area show a broad area below the 5 m contour with a 2 to 3 km-wide connection to the sea. The occurrence of corals up to 7 m elevation thus indicates the Lake Macleod embayment was open to the sea both in the north and the south.

A northern connection with the sea also explains the prevalence of oceanic salinities in the lake area, as indicated by the abundant corals. If the embayment had been open only in the south, one would expect higher salinity gradients than would allow coral growth (e.g. Heckel, 1972,) as is the case in Shark Bay (Hagan and Logan, 1974).

The extent of the original embayment indicated by mapping of Pleistocene marine sediments, must have been about 50 per cent greater than the present area of the lake, with a southern opening to the ocean about 25 to 30 km wide. The Quobba Pleistocene Island would have had a northern strait similar to today's Dirk Hartog Island and its 3 km-wide South Passage, which allows oceanic salinities east of the island (Logan and Cebulski, 1970).

The closing of the northern end of the embayment appears to have been mainly a matter of a relative drop in sea level although some coastal dune building took place. In the south however, the shifting of the Gascoyne Delta and building up of the Bejalung Beach Ridges, described by Johnson (1974), appear to have been important factors in

the closing of the embayment.

Tentative correlation of the terraces and terrace deposits with the Bundera Calcarenite units of the Cape Range and with radiocarbon dating at Shark Bay (Noakes and others, 1967) indicates the terraces and terrace deposits are older than 40,000 years and probably not older than the Riss-Wurm Interglacial, or about 150,000 years.

Emergent marine erosion terraces overlain by marine deposits occur at 2 to 4 m and at 7 m above Mean Low Water Springs level along the east side of Lake Macleod. Two similar terraces and deposits occur on the coast at Cape Cuvier and Ref Bluff but at elevations 1 to 3 m higher than those east of the lake.

Late Quaternary tectonism is indicated by the slope of the terraces and marine deposits in the Cape Cuvier region and by their greater elevations compared with those to the east. This evidence of folding, together with previous work, indicates that the western Australian coast between North West Cape and Shark Bay has been tectonically unstable during the Quaternary.

The marine erosion terraces and terrace deposits may have emerged because of a Pleistocene eustatic sea level fall, or as a result of uplift due to tectonism or, most likely, a combination of both.

The elevation of shoreline features and distribution of marine deposits indicates that the Macleod Pleistocene marine embayment was once to the ocean at both its southern and northern ends. This configuration allowed normal oceanic salinities to exist in the embayment, and permitted the growth of corals that mark the shoreline benches.

SURFCASTING AND ANGLING CLUB (INC.)

Mr. President, Members,

I submit for your approval the attached financial statements for the year ended 30th April, 1977.

The year has been a successful one financially for our Club. Our over-all surplus of Income over Expenditure was \$1096 of which \$387 was attributable to the Building Fund and \$709 to the General Fund. The Club also wisely converted its cash investments to Property this year and the value of the property appreciated substantially more than cash investments would have.

GENERAL FUND:

As stated, a surplus of \$709 was achieved as against the previous year's loss of \$143.

The surplus was generated mainly from profitable social activities, raffle net proceeds of \$200 and the increase in subscriptions.

SUBSCRIPTIONS:

Subscriptions were increased 25% this year without loss of membership and resulted in an increase of income from this source of \$352.

REEL TALK:

Costs to produce our monthly Reel Talk totalled \$476 plus \$123 for postage. This compares with \$576 in 1975/76 plus postage of \$77.

However, this year saw the introduction of using our Reel Talk for advertising purposes and \$125 was received to offset our expense.

SOCIAL:

For the second successive year our social activities have been conducted profitably. This year saw a surplus of \$404 as against \$15 in 1975/76.

TROPHIES

Trophy donors increased their support during 1976/77 to \$173, as compared with \$109 previously. Cost of trophies and certificates of merit increased from \$150 to \$257.

Personal Accident Insurance was ceased during the year as previously reported.

BUILDING FUND

During the year our cash investment with H.B.S. was converted to property investment.

Building Fund expenditure totalled \$4918 and consisted of the deposit of \$4450 for Lot 273 Kalbarri plus initial purchase expenditure plus the freezer.

Building Fund income totalled \$387.

CONCLUSION

The Club's financial situation is quite sound and no increase in subscriptions is suggested. However, our liquidity should be watched as cash of \$100 each month must be found for our mortgage in addition to approximately \$600 interest on mortgage payable \$300 in September, 1977 and \$300 in March, 1978.

NOTE 2 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING PRACTICE

- 2.1 Insurance, rates and other annual expenses are written off in total in the year of payment and are not apportioned.
- 2.2 Acquisition, borrowing and initial establishment costs of the Kalbarri property, have, by the decision of the Management Committee, been written off as Extraordinary Items.
- 2.3 The Kalbarri property is recorded at cost and no provision for depreciation of the building has been brought to account in arriving at the financial result for the year. The Management Committee considers the property would have been, at the 30th April, 1977, and would now be, capable of realising more than Balance Sheet value.
- 2.4 All Current Assets are expected to realise Balance Sheet values in the normal course of Club operations and no provision for Doubtful Debts is considered necessary.
- 2.5 Depreciation of Plant and Equipment is calculated on the Prime Cost method (i.e., on original cost or valuation) at 10% per annum.

AUDITORS REPORT

The accompanying Accounts, Balance Sheet and Notes forming part of the Accounts, are, in my opinion, properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Club as at 30th April 1977 and of its results for the year ended on that date.
