Notes for Verbal Report by Auditor at Annual General Meeting 8th July 1981.

1. As has applied for some years now, the Audit Certificate is incorporated as part of the Accounts (RCX - read Audit Certificate from Accounts).
2. The Register of Unsecured Loans made by members was up to date at 30th April 1981 with the changes during the financial year having been recorded as repayments of \$20 and a new loan of \$10 to a new figure of \$350, a net reduction of \$10 from the preceding year.
3. Because we have heard many times during the year of financial problems and increasing costs, I would like to draw your attention to one or two items for you to examine when you have the Accounts and Balance Sheet printed in the Reel Talk next month -
  - 3.1 Rents from the Kalbarri property were \$1,893 for the year as compared with \$1,716 the preceding year.  
There is then a write-back of an amount written off as a bad debt last year. The net operating surplus is \$581 for the year ended 30th April, 1981, as compared with \$182 the preceding year. As \$206 of this was appropriated for curtains, crockery, and other utensils, we ended up with a net income from Kalbarri of \$425 for the year as compared with \$229. In other words we are not losing money at Kalbarri. The monthly instalment needed to reduce the mortgage cannot be treated as an expense of conducting the property as we are building up an asset in reducing that mortgage each month. The interest on that mortgage of \$328 as compared with \$349 the previous year has been included as one of the expenses before arriving at the net income mentioned.
  - 3.2 All other activities of the Club referred to as general activities resulted in a net income of \$890 in comparison with \$1,075 the previous year.
  - 3.3 The combined result is net income for the Club of \$1,315 for the year ended 30th April, 1981 as compared with a net income of \$1,304 for the year ended 30th April, 1980. Therefore you can see that the results were virtually the same for the two years. Naturally this does not allow for inflation but then we are not a profit making organization and if we merely broke even from year to year and maintained the assets of the organization intact for future members we would be doing a reasonable job. The fact that we have again increased the net assets of the Club by an income of \$1,300 for the year shows we are doing better than breaking even.

- 3.4 This means of course that the accumulated funds of the Club have increased by this amount of approximately \$1,300, being \$16,041 at book value at 30th April 1981 as compared with \$14,726 (12 months earlier). These book values include the Kalbarri property at \$15,476, (i.e. no change from the preceding year) whereas that property may be worth double that figure so we do have that hidden reserve or unstated asset in the difference between the book value and the market value of the Kalbarri property.
- 3.5 I would therefore like to take this opportunity of congratulating the President and his Committee on their stewardship of the finances of the Club for the year ended 30th April.
4. When you look at note 3 of the Accounts and see that the social activities for the year resulted in a net loss of \$74 as compared with a net surplus of \$723 for the year ended 30th April, 1980, do not blame your social organizer. I consider that Sid and Beth Whiting have carried on the fine traditions set by Hew and Hilary and again offer my congratulations and appreciation to Sid and Beth and all their many helpers for conducting the social activities during the year. If we the members, or through business commitments, other engagements, or unfortunately possibly lack of interest, do not attend these functions and do not provide the numbers in attendance then profits cannot be made.
5. A final word about my position as Honorary Auditor of the Club. I have completed, with this report, 19 years of service as auditor and there has been a lot of talk in the Club during the last 12 months that appointments should be limited to a 2 or 3 year term. There appears to be some contradiction as far as this particular appointment of Honorary Auditor is concerned.
- Those present at the June monthly meeting heard me announce that I would be absent from Western Australia for 3 or 4 months next year including the months of June and July and I suggested that you may care to appoint someone else as auditor for the coming year. If you wanted to appoint me again I was willing to carry on but the alternatives were to have someone else finish off the audit, or alternatively receive the Accounts at the July 1982 annual meeting "subject to audit". A resolution was passed that the accounts be received next year in that way.
- I would like to assure that whoever is elected as Treasurer for the new year will be helped by me in whatever way he or she (and do not overlook the possibility of a lady treasurer) requires my help. If then that person requires help in preparing the accounts and balance sheet next year for the Annual General Meeting, even though I have not referred the matter to him, I am sure that Dennis Green would be willing to supply help during my absence.

- 2.1 Accounts have been prepared using Historical Cost method of accounting.
- 2.2 Purchase of covers and wrappers for "Reel Talk", club badges, insurance, rates and other annual expenses are written off in total in the year of payment and are not apportioned.
- 2.3 The Kalbarri property is recorded at cost plus estimated value of members labour for additions and no provision for depreciation of the building has been brought to account in arriving at the financial result for the year. The Management Committee considers the property would have been, at the 30th April, 1981, and would now be, capable of realising at least Balance Sheet value.
- 2.4 All current assets are expected to realise Balance Sheet values in the normal course of Club operations and no provision for Doubtful Debts is considered necessary.
- 2.5 Depreciation of Plant and Equipment is calculated on the Prime Cost method (i.e. on original cost or valuation) at 10% per annum.

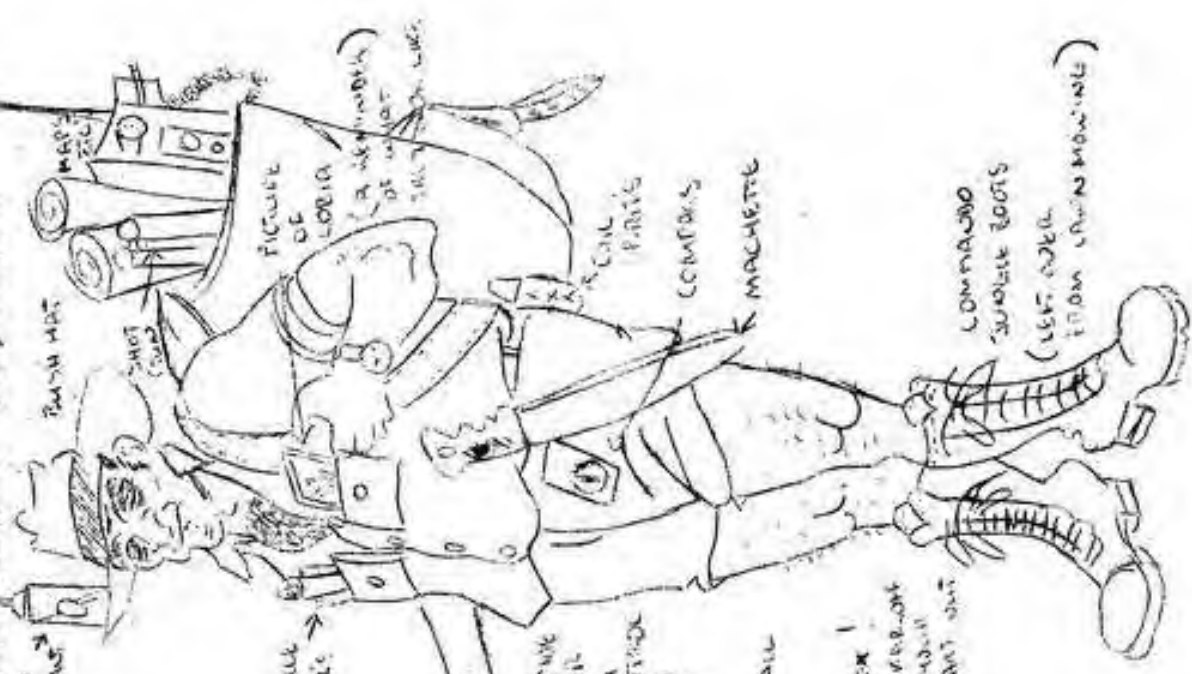

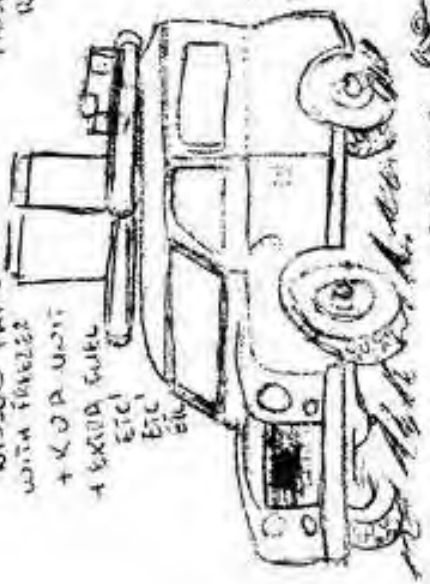
