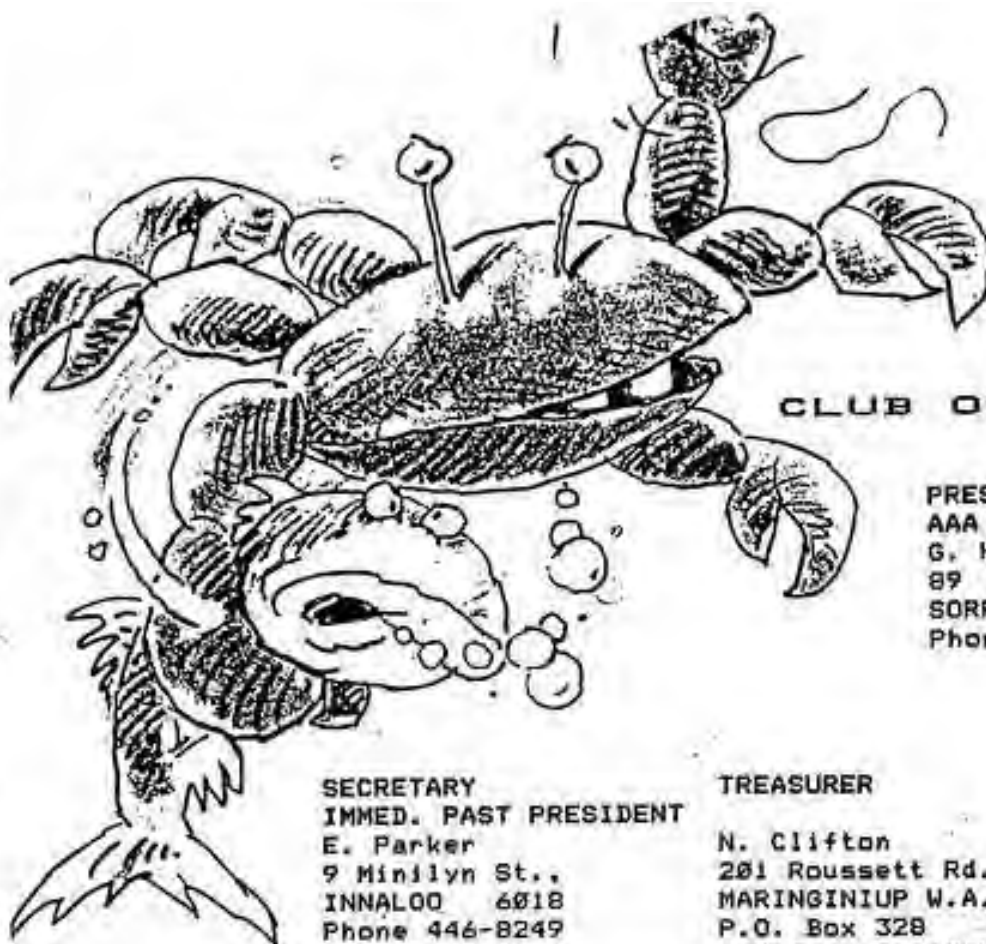

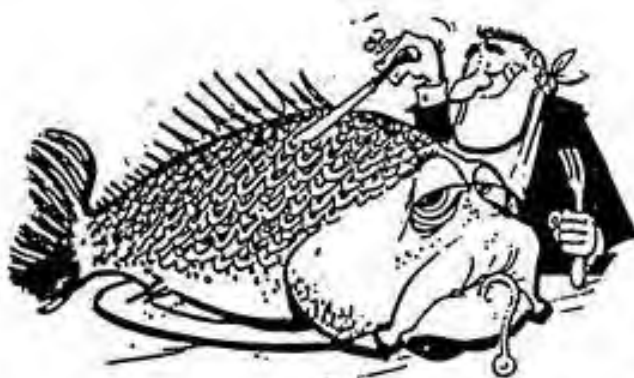
MEETINGS

Please assist the Treasurer by paying your subscription within 28 days of the Annual General Meeting. Arrears of 3 consecutive months may cause forfeiture of membership.

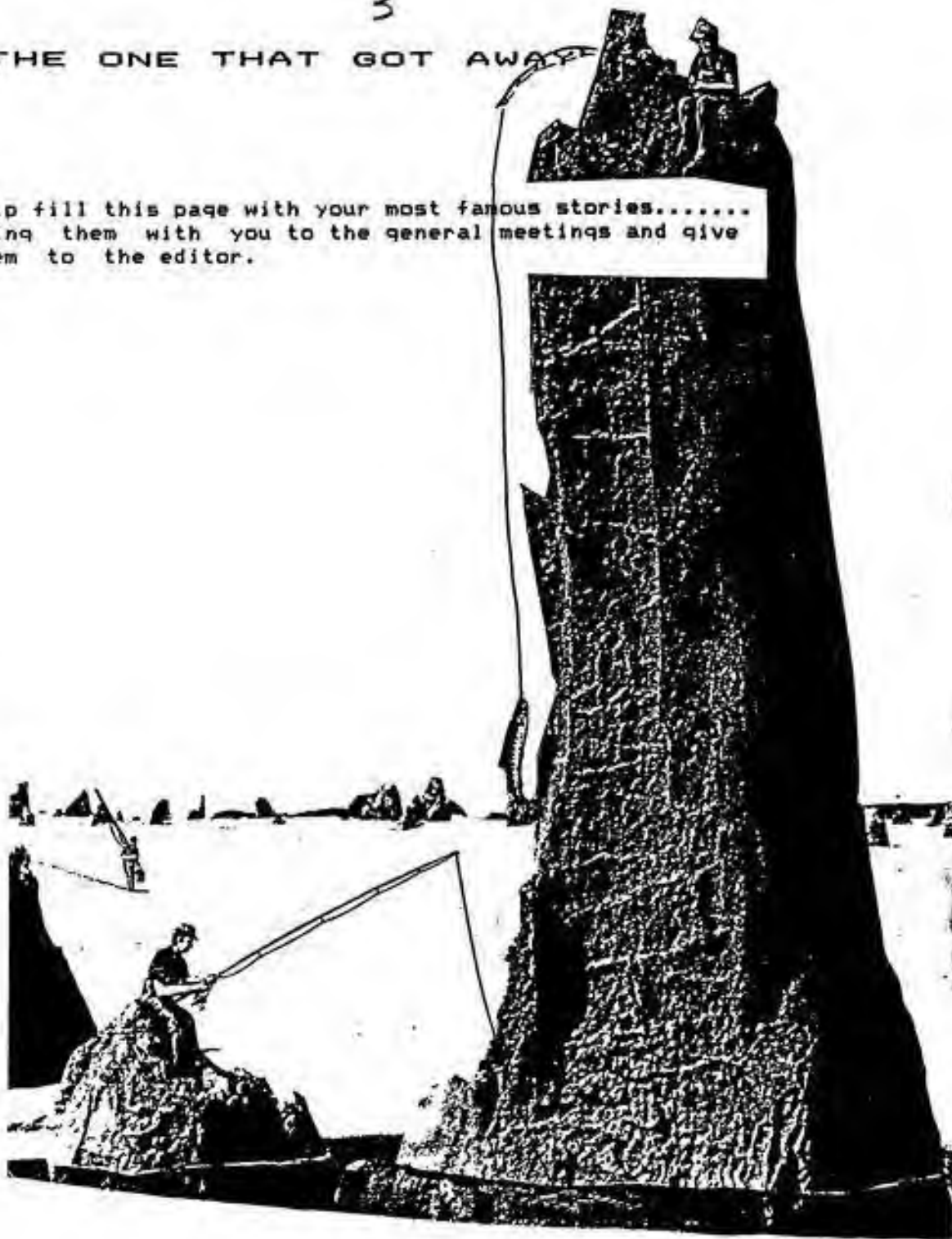

FIELD DAY REPORT
YALLINGUP

11TH-12TH JULY 1987

SEA AND WEATHER CONDITIONS

Sea conditions on the Saturday afternoon were rough with a moderate swell. The wind was from the W/NW at about 25-30 knots with some rain. By Sunday morning the winds had backed to the W/SW and blew at about 15-20 knots. Seas were moderate on a moderate swell. Tides ran at 1.3m/ .4m on Saturday and 1.2m/ .4m on the Sunday.

WEEKEND REPORT

After an enjoyable dinner in Bunbury on the Friday night followed by a good nights sleep at Mike and Rose Harper's, the Cliftons and Ian Cook headed for Dunsborough with hopeful expectations. They had with them Don Smiddt....the local expert..... and his nephew Kevin Feasdale.

The 'sign on' in Dunsborough close to the local bakery proved to be very popular.

It was pleasing to see Eddie Korin and his family attend a field day again.

Most people headed towards the south end of the venue. On the way down Cookie managed to do an hours horse riding after finding two horses that had unsaddled their young lady riders in the bush near Whaleback. The horses were returned to two very relieved and tired young ladies after they had walked about five miles through the scrub. In the meantime, 'The Clifton's' had looked at Little Inqi and Whaleback before heading for Elephant Rock. The Reeley's and Eric Parker's group were already fishing when we arrived. After fishing for a couple of hours into a very stiff breeze for almost no results we packed up and moved to Deep Deen to set up camp for the night.

It was good to see the Juniors and Mini-Juniors trying so hard in these conditions. We had an enjoyable tea followed by 'light refreshments' and retired to enable us to get an early start on Sunday Morning. George Holman and Dave Maxstead drove down on Saturday night and camped at Conto so as to get an early start as well. This is what you call 'real fishing fever' to drive down for six hours fishing. The National Park now has toilet facilities and apparently now charge a fee of \$2.00 (I believe) for camping in the area.

Sundays weather was an improvement and we tried Elephant Rock again. John Reeley was being a good parent by assisting the younger members of the family across the gap between Elephant Rock and the main rocks amidst the moderate waves. The only problem was that he mistimed his own crossing and this resulted in rather an invigorating saltwater immersion. After one and a half hours of non-productive fishing we headed up the coast to try elsewhere.

While the less adventurous fished the point for squid (which seemed to be in reasonable numbers) and enjoyed a fed of mullies, Leigh and Ian waded out to the outer rocks and not long afterwards they hooked a couple of snook. Later they were joined by Don and Nella after some interesting instructions on 'how to get across between waves as the water was about four feet deep when the swell came up. Debbie gave up after a couple of near ducking. The fish went off the bite just as quickly as they started so Don used the available specimens to photograph for a fishing article he was writing.

After a stiff climb up the sand hill it was back to Dunsborough for the weigh-in and more of the Bakery's food. The other club members had found the fishing just as poor.

Eric Parker has found that now he is able to open the throttle on his Landcruiser fully he has a real GO-MACHINE.....

The weekend, although enjoyable, proved to be disappointing with the amount of fish caught. Not a patch on the usual catch for the Yallingup Trip.

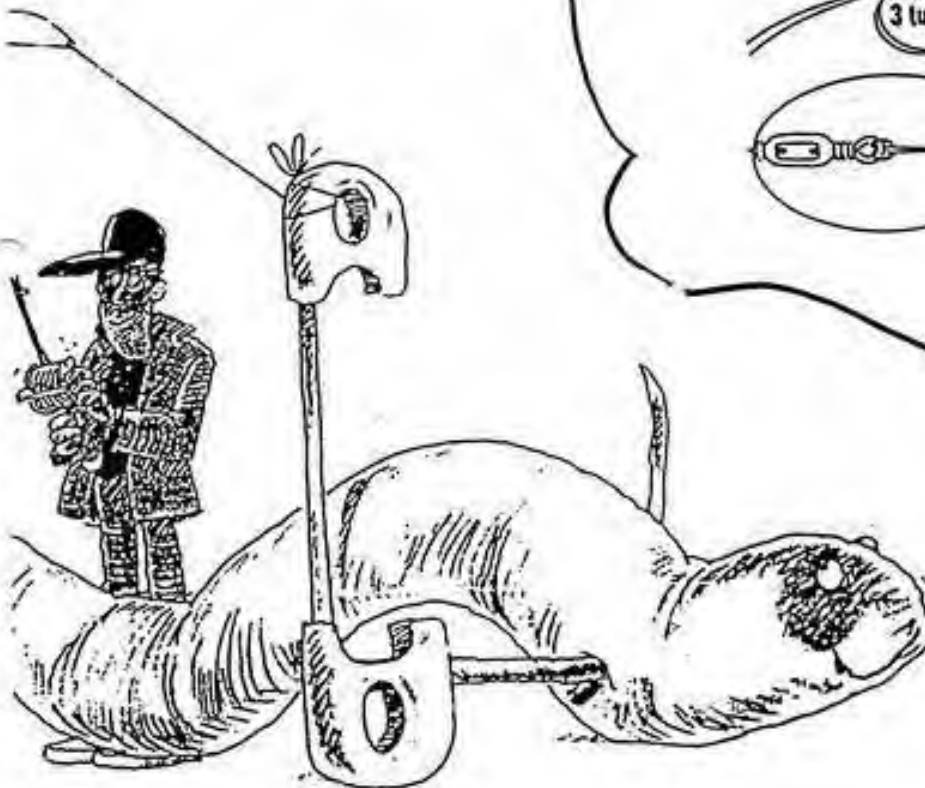
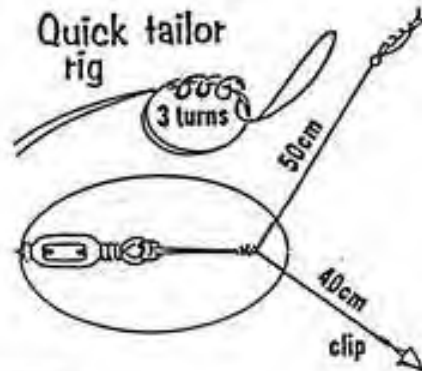

Air beds will now be needed for the hut as the mattresses have been removed.

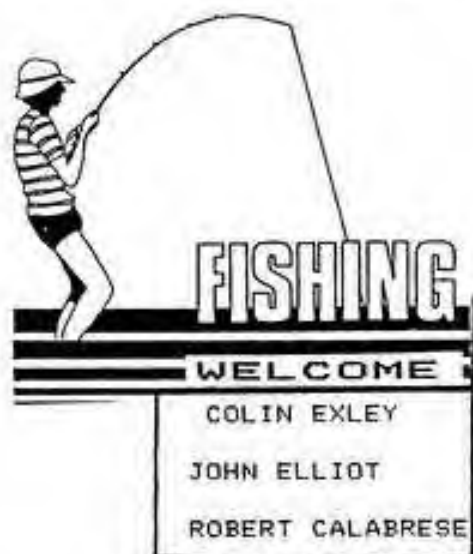
"THE MICE LOVED THEM"

The telephone directory project for the club is a step closer....

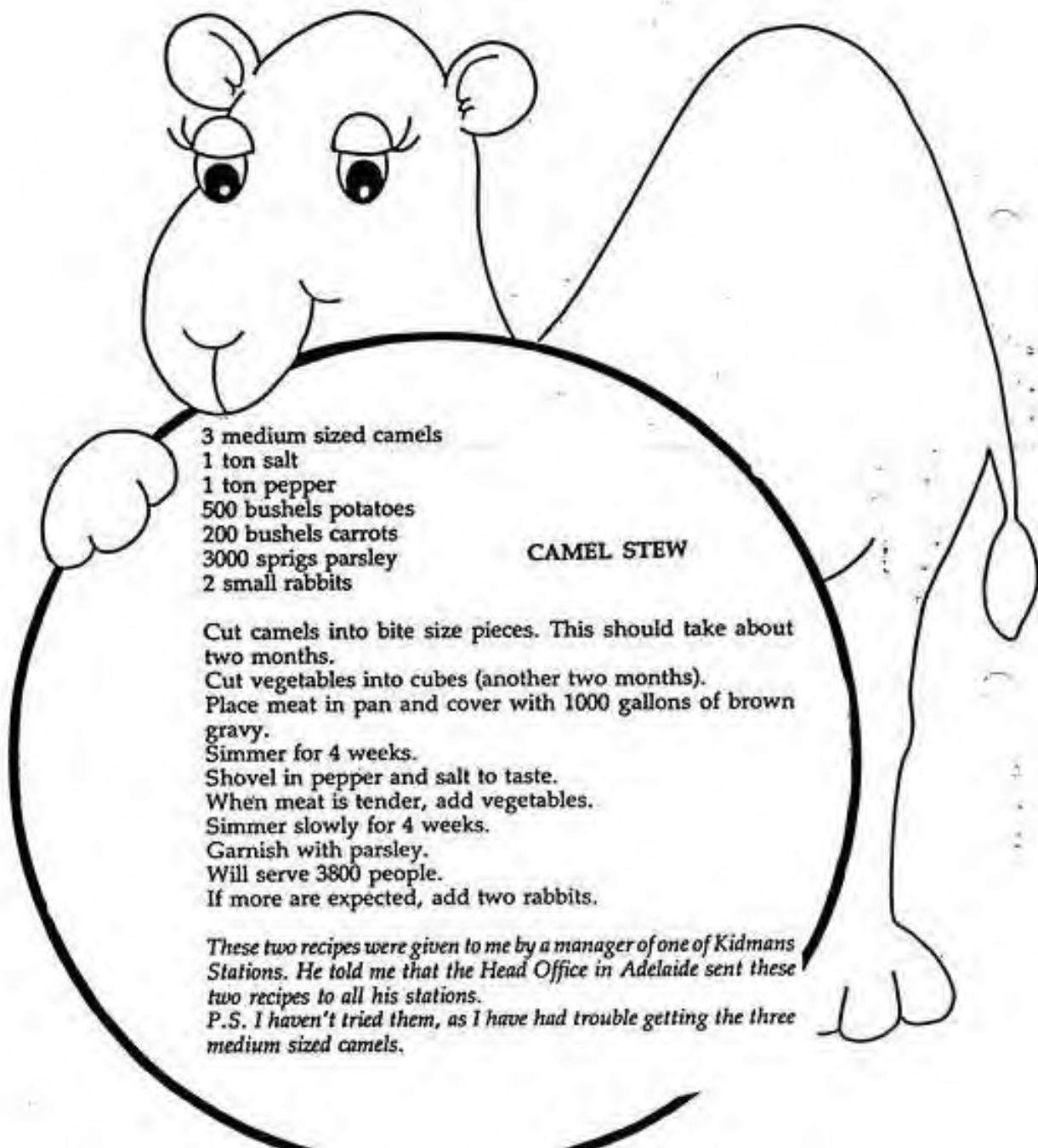

- 3 medium sized camels
- 1 ton salt
- 1 ton pepper
- 500 bushels potatoes
- 200 bushels carrots
- 3000 sprigs parsley
- 2 small rabbits

CAMEL STEW

Cut camels into bite size pieces. This should take about two months.
Cut vegetables into cubes (another two months).
Place meat in pan and cover with 1000 gallons of brown gravy.
Simmer for 4 weeks.
Shovel in pepper and salt to taste.
When meat is tender, add vegetables.
Simmer slowly for 4 weeks.
Garnish with parsley.
Will serve 3800 people.
