Other noteworthy final throws were Nick Crouch 117, Mick Doscas 99, Alan Livesey 119, Doug Savage 113, and Bob Tucker 100. The fairly strong headwind that was encountered was not conducive to record breaking, but John Bellmans second cast of 128 yards was full of merit and well up to Club record standard.

And so to lunch:

While Mum sipped tea from an urn provided by the Air Force, and Junior and his sister syphoned gallons of Ginger Beer from the keg providentially remembered by the Social Committee, dad slaked his near unquenchable thirst in the cool environs of the Officers Mess. (A Dastardly plot by an RAAF type so he could scoop the pool in the accuracy events).

The kids S. H. Blob Accuracy over 20 yds attracted nine starters in the girls section and ten in the boys. Both Competitions were keenly contested and we saw Francis Cook (9) just head off Cherry Cross (7) and Lyn Crouch (5) in the "Miss" Division and Rick Jensen (13) just scraped home from Greg Wright (12) and Rod Edward (10) in the "Masters" Section. Mum had ago then and after several false starts and oodles of unauthorised practise, the Ladies S. H. Blob Accuracy over 30 yds resulted in a clear win for Mrs Cross (48) from Mrs Tichbon (41) and Mrs Giles (40). Now compare these results with our own efforts, even making allowances for the 20 foot tape being used for Mum and the Kids.

As above mentioned, Norrie Cross scooped the pool in accuracy events. His score of 39/60 in the Blob Accuracy (D.H.) equalled the record set by Bob Tucker in August and his 25/40 score in the S.H. eclipsed Nick Crouch's previous record but only for a couple of minutes as Nick came in with a score of 28/40. Doug Edward was second in the "A" Grade Section of the Double Hander with 26/60 and Bob Tichbon 20/60 third. "B" Grade went to Arch Ticklie (34) followed by Bob Tucker (21) and Hal Niel (15). Doug Savage, also with a 34, topped the score in "C" Grade. Ron Flood (24) was second and Dave Wright (20) third. Doug Edward and Arch Ticklie scored with all four shots, and Norrie scored the only Bull (at the Yellow target).

Noel Knight 21/40 was runner up to Norrie Cross in the S.H. "A" Grade with John Bellman (18) third. Bob Tucker (17) got another second in "B" Grade followed by Arch Ticklie (15). Ron Flood (16) took "C" Grade honours from Snow Tate (14) and Keith Mulvay and Doug Savage each with twelve. Four bulls were scored in the S. H. event. One each by Norrie Cross, Nick Crouch, Arch Ticklie and Bob Tucker. Nick and Ron Flood were both in the target area four times.

The competition is at a very interesting stage. Only one point separates Doug Edward and Noel Knight in "A" Grade and two points between Keith Mulvay and Ron Flood in "C" Grade.
