Asked TREVOR STAM how he fared, "not too good I was too busy watching Jack". This shark was quite large from all accounts and if caught there would have been a new name added to top anglers.

DOUG NEWTON and his villians fished in the Hill River area and their catch was disappointing except for STAN CHAMBERS (V) who caught a bronze whaler (7 $\frac{3}{4}$ lb) and a few herring. Saw Doug laying into something, rod bent and quite a bit of effort. Shark? Kingie? No, a bloody stinger.

BOB TUCKER who brought along two visitors in JIM BERRYMEN and DON WALSH fished the south point but only found shallow water and a bundle of wood.

Many were disappointed, however there is always the hope that the next field day will be better.

CASTING CAPERS

This month's points winner, GEORGE HOLMAN, last headed the table exactly twelve months ago. An Anniversary you might say George. The major portion of his points came from the D.H. Acc. where he won easily with 63/80. This is the best figure so far this year, surpassing RON KILDAHL'S effort of 62/80 in September.

The record for this event is 72/80 held by H. BARROT and judging by the scores of late, this should be broken before too long. Maybe!

Three of George's casts were sheer perfection to watch and gave one the feeling that this would be hard to emulate. It certainly was. Next in this event was DAVE LATTO, fresh after his trip to the East, scored 52/80. Dave didn't lose his touch while touring the country and if truth has it, he was probably practising astutely up at Surfers Paradise.

A few points behind Dave was very accurate BOB TICHBON with 50/80. Bob is one of the old stagers and can certainly cast a mean line.

JOHN NUICH with 46/80 and BOB TUCKER with 42/80, cast well in this event. (There is a slight rumour to the effect that Bob played 36 holes of golf on Saturday and was tuckered). TOM CORCORAN, BRIAN LEICESTER and RON KILDAHL were a little unlucky not to be in the placegetters.

The S.H. Open event developed into a close struggle between BOB TUCKER and GEORGE HOLMAN with the former ultimately winning. Bob's distance was 290 ft, beating his first cast which was less than George's best of 279 ft. Finishing third was BILL UTTING with 223 ft. DOUG TALBOT, TOM CORCORAN and RUDY LERCH also had good distances in this section.

Convincingly winning the S.H. Acc. was BRIAN LEICESTER with 31/40. Brian frightened the "bull" twice during his four casts and was unlucky not to have hit it. To his credit he also finished third overall with 128 pts. BILL UTTING gained second place in this event with 29/40, actually this was not one of Bill's better days. A miss in the D.H. Acc. lost Bill points and also his distance in the L.L. Hep was slightly lower than he can cast. Never-the-less, we shall certainly see Bill figuring in future results. Third was TOM CORCORAN, even after missing with his first cast. Tom jagged a "bull" on the shorter distance contributing to his score of 26/40.

Others to rate a mention BOB TICHBON 25/40, NOEL KNIGHT 23/40, DAVE LATTO and BARRY REYNOLDS with 22/40.

RON KILDAHL scored a "bull" in this event on the short target, overall Ron was slightly astray. During practise two "bulls" were scored. BILL UTTING jagged one and I managed the other. The practise didn't do me

much good but appeared to help Bill.

Winning the L.L. Hcp was NOEL KNIGHT with 54 points. As a result of this effort I can knock 27 from his handicap. Noel always gives a good account at his infrequent appearances and Sunday was no exception. Do come along more often Noel.

There was some excellent casting from this segment with RUDY LERCH having a good day. Rudy lost 27 from his Hcp, a pity about the penalty. He also gained the longest cast with 420 ft. These three casts would be a personal best and must be satisfying.

BRIAN HANKS free from the worry of the organising, turned in three lengthy casts. However, Brian's accuracy was astray and he incurred the maximum penalty. He too had his handicap reduced, only 11.

JOHN NUICH reduced his handicap by 27, caused by some good casting. John has steadily improved and would be pretty close to his top form. Improve in the S.H. Acc. and you have got it made John.

Newcomer, GARRY GILDERSLEEVE, looks like slathering his handicap when he gets three away. Two casts and still loses 2 from handicap. Lookout next month.

Including those discussed, ten members faced handicap reductions of amounts ranging from 27 to 2. Nice to see these members keen to improve their distance.

Twenty six members and three visitors enjoyed the day. JACK KENDALL came along, not to cast (crook back) but for something to do. Assisted ably at the table with the score sheets.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT (Amendment to inside cover):

GARFISH are measured from the tip of the upper jaw to the end of the upper half of the tail; PRAWNS are measured along the body from eye to the tip of the tail; CRAYFISH are measured along the mid-dorsal line from the anterior edge of the pronounced ridge which joins the front edges of the rostral horns immediately posterior to the eyestalks, to the posterior margin of the carapace; CRABS are measured from tip to tip of the posterior margin of the carapace spikes; MARRON are measured from the tip of the rostrum to the posterior margin of the carapace along the mid-dorsal line; all other fish are measured from the point of the snout to the end of the tail.
