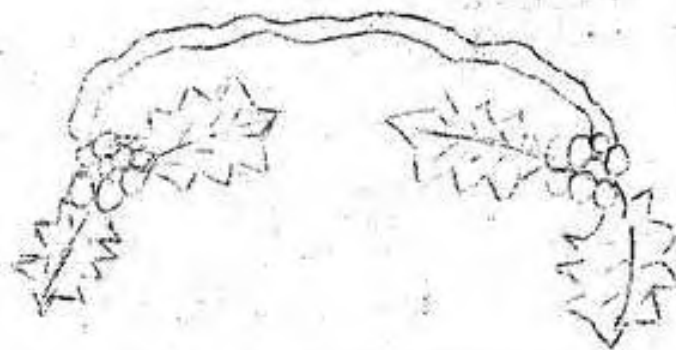

A.A.A. OF W.A. REPORT:

The November Delegates meeting of the above was held at the new meeting hall in Walter Road Dianella with 22 persons in attendance. Business dealt with:-

Motion re perpetual trophies to be returned two months prior to next event. Carried.

Motion re selection of Angler and Junior Angler of the Year ("Sportsman and Junior of Year") was carried with a small alteration at the bottom of the motion- the word "may" altered to "will" be considered.

Motion re forming of Steering Committee for the 1985 National Angling Championship to be held in W.A. was carried.

Motion re State Teams Initial Selection Committee proposal and its format as put was carried.

Surfcasters put a motion re the payment of subs to the Association by the clubs on the basis of up to 50 members \$10; up to 100 members \$40; over 100 members \$60.

Jim Strong has been made a delegate of the Anglers Club of W.A.

The position of State Patron (Jim Strong) is being further prolonged so that a legal person can clarify whether something needs to be included into Constitution or not. A bad situation.

Drycasting proposal for a squad to promote a team for Ballina in 1983 and casting as a whole was finally passed.

A report on the netting of fish north of the Causeway Bridge in the Swan River was given and is being looked into. The Association supports netting bans up river from the Narrows Bridge and also the Canning Bridge. The Association is still without a Treasurer.

A motion was tabled from Bunbury Club for 8 accuracy casts to be included into State Drycasting events for women in the future.

There were no fish records passed or general business dealt with because of time running out.
