1. ESTUARY CHAMPIONSHIPS: Swan River November 24th/27th 1988.
2. MANDURAH 500: January 14th/15th 1989.
3. Stories from clubs are required for publication in Western Angler.  
e.g. Fish tales, humorous stories, photos etc.
4. A.A.A. will donate \$5000 from the raffle funds plus \$5000 from the government for a total of \$10,000 for the National Team.
5. NARDELUP AREA: Draft management plan. The Inlet is open for recreational boat fishing and there is access for 4WDs for fishing with a definition of protection of defined 'fragile areas'. (Walpole Area.)
6. Opinions from Clubs are asked on fishing rules ie. bag limits, size etc (as to State Laws). This is to be put up to the Recreational Council for recommendations in conjunction with the research done by the Fisheries Department. These opinions or recommendations could go into state laws.
7. Recommendations for bag limits for Mulloway:-  
a) bag limit of five at Carnarvon.  
b) state wide bag limit of five or whatever.
8. Notice of motions by John Antas to be held over until January 1989.
