LENCELIN - WEDGE ISLAND VENUE, JANUARY 1968

1968, and our first Field day came scorching in at a temperature well in excess of the century, so much so that a few boil-ups were in evidence on the Lancelin Road, including my own.

An attendance of 45 was reasonable, and with the exception of the F.D.O., all were spread out North and South of Lancelin. The track to Wedge had apparently improved, and the lads were pelting through with little trouble.

Thanks to Geo. Holman for registering a number of members. My boiling radiator slowed my arrival on target.

The evening's fishing commenced under light southerly conditions and it may be said that Tailor and Malloway were on the bite from Albany to Carnarvon, which means that depending on your choice of spot, you got fish in varying quantities and sizes. The larger tailor were obviously on from about 2 or 3 miles North of Lancelin whilst south of this the 1/2 and 3/4 pounders were the order of the day, with the occasional 2 or 3 pounder.

No reports were received during the evening, and the only happening of note was a stranger who called into camp for treatment for a scalded chest and arm, which adds up to the fact that if your radiator boils, be mighty careful how you take the cap off!

The following morning a light to stiff Easterly flattened out the water, and quite a few balloons were to be seen well offshore, but despite the perfect shark weather, none were brought to gaff and once again no sharks were weighed in.

By about 6 a.m., it was obvious that all traces of Tailor and Malloway had disappeared, and on my arrival back at camp a good number were ready to weigh-in and beat the heat back to Perth.

Ted Savage described the killing of a five foot snake on the beach, which they came across on their way back from Wedge. You aren't even safe on the beach fellers, so keep your eyes

skinned during the hot weather!

A special mention must go to Ron McQueen, who, despite century heat, walked two or three miles along the beach, complete with gear, and back again, plus 22 lbs. of fish. I'd say he earned them.

The field day ended with Ted Savage returning an extremely good 72.1/2 lbs. of Tailor and Mulloway to take top honours, with Brian Hanks 9.1/4 lb. Mulloway being the largest scale fish. Bob Tucker took off the section for the largest catch of Mulloway with six, totalling 28³/₄ lbs. Altogether 645.1/2 lbs. of fish was caught with a total now of 4666 lbs. over nine field-days.

To complete the picture, a party consisting of Jack Harvey, Jim Strong, Phil Neri, Archie Ticklie, Doug Salt, and Ian McLennan, who, I am informed, totalled a further 100 lbs of fish between them, held their own private Field Day, and failed to turn up in time for the weigh-in, so, unfortunately their catch cannot be included in the total. I am informed however, that their own sweepstake was carried off by Jim Strong for the first tailor caught. As a reminder, though, don't let the clock beat you fellers! We like to weigh-in all fish caught.

See you all at Garden Island next month, and the reports confirm some 20 lb. Tailor in this area, so best of luck.

GARDEN ISLAND VENUE - FEBRUARY 1968

The Venue will cover the entire Island. Ferries will leave Palm Beach hetty at 7-45 a.m., 10-15 a.m., and 2-00 p.m. and 5-00 p.m. and return at 10-00 a.m. on Synday morning.

Fishing commences at 4 p.m. Saturday and ceases at 8.00 a.m. Sunday. The weigh-in will be held on the Jetty from 9-00 a.m. until the ferry leaves, but fish will be weighed in at all times when F.D.O. is in attendance at the huts. Beds in huts 75c per head.

All members wishing to make use of accommodation in the huts, MUST book and pay the fee at the next General Meeting. Those not using huts after booking will forfeit the booking fee.

Those unable to book at the General Meeting may book on arrival at Island, but the extra accommodation will be limited and you may miss out.

Registration fees will be collected on the ferry or before 3-00 a.m. at the huts. If you go North or South overnight, you will require water.

NOTE: Confirmed reports have indicated the presence of Tailor in the 20 lb. class on the back beaches, guns area etc. but they are reluctant to take baits. A variety of baits or the use of live bait may do the trick, so flick rods may be of use for bait catching with small skipjacks being the most favoured if they can be caught.

When using live bait, a two gang 4/0 or 5/0 hook rig, without a treble is a good rig. Put the top hook through the back of the live bait as near the tail as possible, but avoid the back bone. Leave the bottom hook swinging and use wire traces.

The bottom hook should be ganged with the barb on the opposite side to the top hook pointing away from the body of the live bait, otherwise it will pierce the stomach and kill your bait.
