(As you may have noticed the current Sunday Times fishing column featured a paragraph regarding fishing etiquette) On this point, I would ask Club Members to remember that it is up to us, as representatives of a reputable Club, to ensure that we are never guilty of such ill-mannered conduct, and that while our previous unwritten rule of allowing 25 yards between rods is somewhat unpractical these days, at lease don't foul up your neighbours fishing by crowding too closely.

As things turned out, the beaches close to the river mouth were the bonanza spots; and I must confess I was one of the lucky ones.

The Tailor were on the bite by 4.45 p.m. and almost every cast produced a fish. Terry Fuller, Jim Strong, the two Ron's and several others were all giving it a go in this area, but the biggest

The morning caused a certain amount of dismay to the boy's on the North Reefs. Far from getting the expected easterly the wind was still blowing fairy strongly from the Southeast and the expected haul of Tailor did not materialise.

The sea had increased quite a bit, and with the tide out was pushing some fair sized rollers up the beaches, bringing more weed and sand close in.

However the Tailor were still along the beach and luck still seemed to be on our side, and many added quite a bit to their overnight tally. All in al, quite a reasonable aggregate catch of 299 lbs with 38 from a total of 47 weighing in.

The total catch for the year so far has reached 2640 lbs. which shows an average catch over 9 field days of 293 lbs, which I think you will agree is quite good.

With three field days to go, let me wish you all a run of personal records, and a run-a-way start to 1967. Wishing everyone a happy and prosperous 1967, and, good fishing!
