Despite the apparent lack of numbers, a creditable 398 lbs total was weighed in, with Eric Sullivan, burnt out clutch and all, returning 43.3/4 lbs. for the top weight, Bob Tucker turning in a 5<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> lb. Malloway for large scale fish. The highlight of the venue was a massive fighting Bronze Whaler, which after a stupendous battle, was weighed in by Alan Bunnett at 2.1/4 lbs. to take off the heaviest shark. This must be an all time record of some kind. We're working on it!

Well fellers this wraps up 1967, and its been a mighty successful year with a grand total of 4020 lbs of fish over 8 field days.
