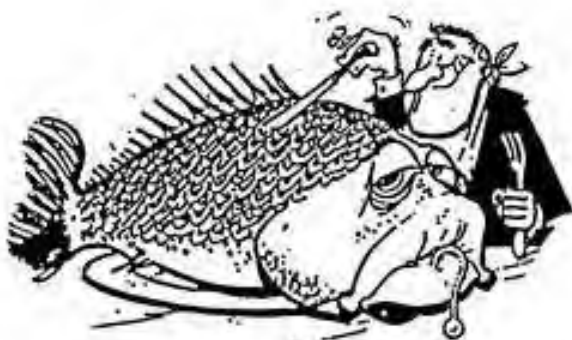
MEETINGS

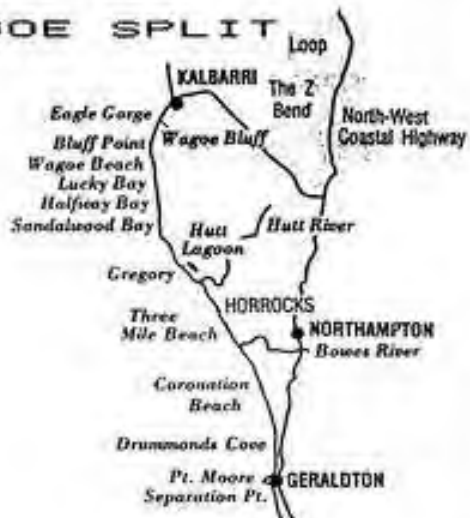

SPECIAL RESOLUTION

This club will be altering its financial year to come into line with the more traditional times...July 1st to June 30th. In conjunction with this the A.G.M. will be changed to August and this will assist our treasurer and new auditor with their respective accounting tasks.

The following resolutions were recommended by our retiring auditor Bob Klein;
