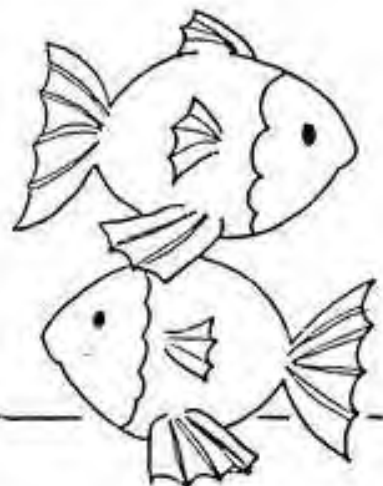

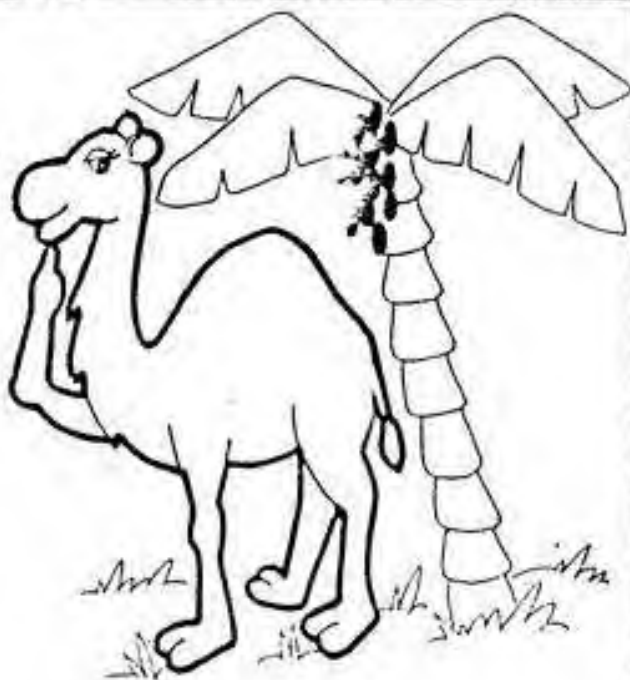

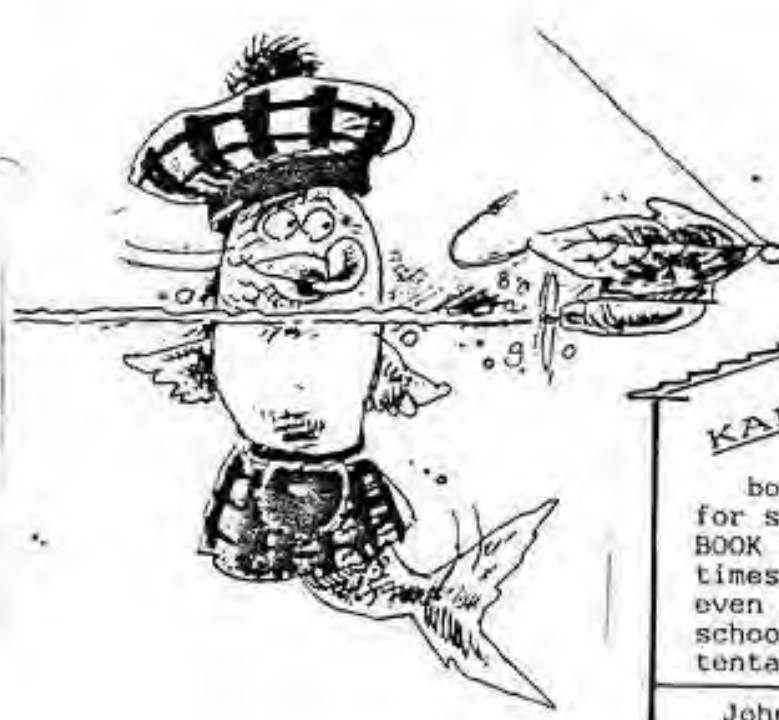

Wishing you all the Best for Christmas and the New Year and hope to see a few more members at Drycasting in the New Year.

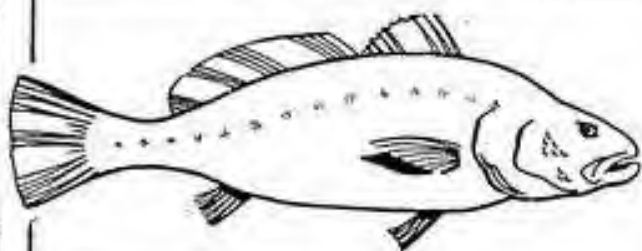

KING GEORGE WHITING

King George whiting are marine fish which spend most of their juvenile life feeding and growing in inshore waters. Mature fish may reach a maximum weight of over 4.5 kg, and a length of over 69 cm.

Mature whiting spawn in the ocean at about three years old, when fish measure around 40 cm long. The eggs hatch at sea, and the larvae and juvenile fish gradually make their way with the help of ocean currents to the sheltered waters of marine embayments and estuaries. The seagrass beds and drift seaweed of the shallower waters provide shelter and a rich source of food for the small fish, which feed on minute crustaceans and other animals. During the summer the

young whiting remain in the estuaries and shallow bays, but move down to the estuary mouths or out to deeper water during the winter months.

At about two to three years old the whiting

migrate seawards into deeper water to spawn. Each female lays between 500,000 and 2,000,000 eggs per spawning.

Large adult whiting tend to keep to sand gutters down to about 10 fathoms, and are rarely caught in shallow water.

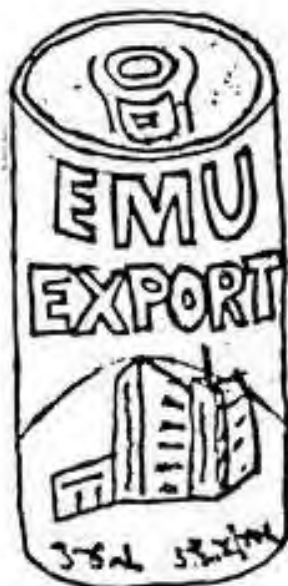

SAUDI ARABIA CONTINUED

FROM SID WHITING

THE HEAT IS ON

Things started to warm up from March onwards, and the relative cool of the Greek Islands in May was a pleasant change. (Won't bore you with details of that trip!) On our return in early June, it was obvious someone had decided it was time for summer to begin. We are talking major heat here. Right up until now (September) it has been over 40 every day, generally 45 or more, with occasional scorchers up around the 50 mark. From mid July the humidity set in. When you walk outside your palms instantly feel oily and your clothes stick to your body. Your glasses fog up for several minutes until they heat up, and the windows of the airconditioned buildings run with condensation. And they say it hasn't been too bad this year.

The cold water tap produces water too hot to shower in. So we turn the power off the hot water system and let the water cooling in the storage tank provide us with a luke-warm supply. By late August the pool had heated up so that after a couple of laps you'd be sweating; a couple more and you'd be in danger of overheating. (Would you believe ARAMCO have refrigeration units cooling their pools?) This doesn't stop the kids of course. From not swimming a stroke to 100 metres non-stop in 6 months tells the story (that's free-style for Debbie, dog-paddle for Darren).

It's important to keep up one's fluid level in these conditions. If your not going to the loo regularly then you're in trouble, and not just from dehydration/heat stroke, as I found out recently after a painful midnight visit to hospital suffering from a bladder stone attack.

GETTING MARRIED

When one of the Saudi's at work got hitched, I was invited to the reception at a Dammam function centre. I never saw the bride - she slipped into the ladies section with all the ladies where they no doubt did whatever ladies do at Saudi weddings. The "groomal party" arrived around 9.00PM - about 50 cars screeching off the main road with horns blaring and motors revving. Once inside, we all sat around for hours drinking tea and coffee. Finally they rolled out the grub, a standard kabsa (meat, rice, salads, eaten with bare right hand while squatting/sitting/kneeling on the floor - most uncomfortable), after which we all went home.

THE BEDOUIN MARKET

After an earlier attempt to get to the Nariyah market which had come to grief in a gigantic dust storm, we finally got there. The local Bedouins are very friendly and pleasant people (even allowing for the fact they are all trying to sell you stuff). The ladies got hold of Beth and gleefully fitted her out with a Bedouin-style veil - eyeslits and all (doesn't suit her - eye slits too big!). We purchased an old sword and a hand-woven rug to hang on our wall.

HAJJ

During this last month of the Muslim year the annual pilgrimage to Makkah takes place by followers of the faith world-wide. They're all supposed to do it once in their lives (health and finances permitting). Travel by air nationally and internationally is to be avoided at this time due to the heavy congestion of these facilities. There is a sacrifice day when most of the population and pilgrims each slaughter an animal (sheep, goat, camel) and give 3/4 of the meat to the needy. Professional slaughter/butchers do quite well out of this at around 100 riyals a time. (Ever wondered what happens to all those Australian sheep?)
