So members who haven't been to drycasting -- how about making it a date on the first Sunday in July?

Also outside interest is growing as there were several onlookers following our activities. It was good to see Doug Clegg return once again to drycasting.

In the L.L. distance, the longest cast was made by R. Johnson with a nice cast of 454 ft. This is getting mighty close to the record of this event. The winner scoring most points was J. Devitt.

In the D.H. accuracy, targets were set at 84 and 64 yards. Members cast well for these distances, and scores were generally good. The winner was I. McLeman with 54/80, following by T. Smith was 52/80 and third was D. Clegg with 51/80.

S.H. Accuracy - This was the outstanding event for the day in so far as there were seven bulls scored and out of this, two direct hits. R. Tucker took this event with a record score of 35/40 - a mighty effort, Bob, congratulations. This was followed closely by Dave Latto who is really on his toes in this event, with 33/40, and R. Tichbon was third with 32/40. Up until now, the record has been 34/40 and was held by W. Bridger and H. Hoy Yew.

This month brought the first of our Single Handed Open and one again R. Tucker took it off with a nice cast of 287 feet.

SPECIAL NOTE: Starting time for next months drycasting on July 7th, will be 8.45.

This early start is necessary to include the Open Double Handed Distance event. This will be the first event for the day, members please note. junior footballers on the oval later in the morning have made it imperative that we hold this event first thing.

GARDEN ISLAND VENUE, 15/16TH JUNE, 1968

Thirty-one members, plus five juniors traveled to the Island. Weather conditions had moderated after the storm during the week. The beaches were in fair condition, heavy seaweed along the Northern Bays. Though the South Areas were quite reasonable. Once again the lads hit the jack-pot, and members found the Salmon eager and ready to take the bait. We exceeded last month's record tally, and the approximate weight weighed in was 1800 lb of Salmon. Lofty Griffiths lead the way with an excellent bag of Salmon, weight 172.1/2 lbs. A. Livesey took full honours with his Samson fish, weight 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs, congratulations Allan a splendid catch.

The juniors again to the fore, turned in some great bags of Salmon Garry Ross weighed in 137 lbs of Salmon, a great feat for a junior. Eric Hill weighed in the heaviest Salmon 12.1/2 lbs., this sure will be hard to exceed. The sections on the field day competitions are getting hard to toss early in the season. Our party arrived on the Island and after a quick lunch we followed Ron Kildahl, Ian Edgar over to the Northern Beaches. Keith Rundin, Bob Tichbon and myself looked for gutters or deep holes where the Tailor may abound. Phil Neri in the meantime was chasing Herring without any luck. Later in the afternoon we noticed a busy band of anglers hurrying towards us also looking for likely gutters etc. This party consisted of Hal Neil, Blue Hampton, Junior Allan Barron, Alf Rutland and Mike Dawson. Bob Tichbon had a strike and landed a nice Trevally and I then thought the Tailor would be on, though to our dismay the seaweed closed in all along the beach. Soon we were bending and straining to retrieve our rigs. Blue Hampton rushed up and assisted us with his gaff. His hopes of another 8 lb Tailor quickly faded away. Mike Dawson had problems when his rigs tangled with a large piece of seaweed and he was finally driven to his knees, before the line parted and he was thrown bodily to the beach. This, of course caused much laughter from all of us present (poor Mike). Just after sundown there was a steady stream of anglers leaving the northern Bad heading back to camp.

On arrival we were told of the run of Salmon caught around the Rifle Range. Ron Shirley was all smiles with his bag of Salmon, and Ron Kildahl hurried over to the Rifle Range to land several Salmon, however he again found the area heavily weeded and returned empty handed. All the afternoon the Salmon had been on and many good hauls were taken.

Rudy Leech had a birthday and weighed in an excellent bag. Eric Hill again to the fore and all other lads weighed in good bags. Allan Livesey returned with Allan Bunnett and between them they had carried back the Samson fish which sure aroused great interest. In all, anglers Juniors again did well and G. Ross staggered us with his effort. During the evening reports had been received of Lofty Griffiths' outstanding catch, though, as his trolley was in much demand, he had to wait his turn. When he finally arrived he remarked in his usual humorous way "the wheel bearings on the trolley had burnt out with overloading".

As the weigh-in progressed, the heaps of Salmon grew and grew, and the tally kept mounting. Bob Tichbon, Keith Rundin, young Gordon and Paul Fuller arrived and another 100 lb or so was added to the ever growing total. All anglers retired early preparing for a busy morning, and as all lads were going to the South end, we all intended to be there for SUN UP.

Pleased to see Ian Edgar on the venue and he is still a keen angler and would be an inspiration to the younger anglers. Our party also turned in early for a change, and only Keith Rundin and I remained chatting about angling topics.

Came the dawn and all the lads were on the move. On arrival at Skippy hole we found many anglers patiently waiting the first run of Salmon or Tailor. Allan Bunnett remarked on the number of anglers however 18 lads managed to get a line in the water. When the Salmon made their run we were all in business. Allan also landed several Salmon.

Our party finally chalked our first captures on the venue. Neri also landed five Salmon. In the morning this area was clear of seaweed.

Shortly after 7 a.m. our party left to prepare for the morning weigh-in. After checking our figures we noticed we had exceeded last month's total.

It appears that the schools of Salmon have chased the herring and tailor into deeper waters. Lets hope they soon return to fill our hearts with glee.
