JUNE GENERAL MEETING:

Our first meeting in the new hall. All reports I heard were favourable. It's a bright, clean, new hall and with heaters on the walls!

George Holman chaired the meeting which proceeded very quickly through its business. He remarked after the meeting that it was pleasing to see so many members staying on chatting afterwards. That's a bonus when you have a short meeting.

George opened the meeting and presented two members with \$10 Debentures; Trevor Stam and Bob Klein. Thank you gentlemen- much appreciated!

Correspondence contained a letter of resignation from 'Blue' Hampton after many years in the club, and included in the letter was an application for two debentures. That's what I call "going in style"; a typical 'Bluey' gesture.

That's a member we will miss but Blue is not as young as he was, we understand his reasons and wish him well.

It was noted that a supply of Fisheries Dept cards with Legal Lengths etc was available from the Secretary.

General Business was opened by the President giving a resume of the Drycasting A.A.A. fishing reports centred on Kalbarri- Brian Leicester had a wipe out on his holiday but Eric Sullivan who was there one week earlier had a ball! Some of the beaches north of Frustration were reported to be looking good from the boat. Eric drifted back into a gutter and found good fish. Sonapper etc. 'Lambs' are hiring Honda 3 wheelers out on the north side of the river and you would need transport to get to these gutters, they are about 5-6 miles north. Eric spoke of Mackerel from the boats and Tuna 200 lb or more - too big to tackle. They were in feeding on baitfish that were thick all the way from Wago to Frustration.

Bob Klein reported on 'Eric' at Denmark at Ocean Beach Caravan Park. Eric is a tame Emu - too tame - its reported he ate someone's toilet key and cost them their \$2 deposit!! JUNE FIELD DAY: DENMARK-WALPOLE:

A.F.D.O. and family left Perth Friday night accompanied by Ric Parker, Dave Latto and Ken Jones and arrived at the Ocean Beach Caravan Park around 2 a.m. After breakfast a number of vehicles took off for a reconnaissance around Parry's Beach. The area looked deep and clean and was committed to memory for future reference.

On the way back to the park, most of the convoy detoured for a look at William Bay whilst George and I prepared for the sign on.

Following lunch, a small group of blokes, Phil Neri, George and I, Bill Utting and Bob Klein, Phil Isbister, Alby and Craig Norman, attempted to find what we had heard was an easy way into Bornholm. We tried every track between South Tennessee and the turn off that leads to the main road and even tried a bit of scrub bashing when one of the tracks we were following became prime fare for Sir Edmund Hillary. Eventually we followed the right road and after passing many conventional vehicles parked at various places on the sides of the track, arrived at a spot half way down a steep hill, which was obviously as far as 4-wheeled vehicles could go.

Bornholm is a small beach perhaps $\frac{3}{4}$ mile long and enclosed by cliffs which would probably be as high as a footy oval is long. Packing our bags with as little gear as possible, Phil, Alby, Craig, George & I started down, leaving Bob, Bill and Phil Neri to go their own way (they had wisely decided that the climb back up was beyond their physical limitations). On reaching the beach we pried our way in amongst a large group of anglers (Phil and Alby up one end - George and I up the other) and immediately began catching Salmon. George must have taken his ugly pill this day because I had five on the beach before he landed his first, however, to his credit, he later hooked the only good fish, then with uncharacteristic bad luck, lost it. With the beach deserted, we were joined by Phil, Alby and Craig who after a fish or two each set off up the track with George and I not very far behind. After a mighty struggle we finally made it to the top, stripped off our perspiration soaked clothes, loaded up, cracked a can each and buzzed off.

As a tribute to George's fitness, let me say that he relieved me of my fish, tore up to the vehicle, deposited the fish and then returned to help me. Needless to say, one J.R. Lee could be seen from now on running along the beach in an attempt to keep fit along with all the other old fogies. And, just for sour grapes, I'd reckon that anyone who wants to climb up and down Bornholm just to catch Salmon, has either no taste or a fetish for masochism.

The weigh in next morning was a non event, as the only blokes to weigh in were the Bornholm brigade. The rest of Sunday was spent at Lights Beach until about 4.30, then while the others went back to camp, George and I spent a little time trying to fish where the sea once was at Ocean Beach. By about 8 p.m. everyone had ceased fishing and was back at camp enjoying the food, drink and atmosphere provided by the companionship of ones' friends. Next morning, thanks to the food, drink and atmosphere, nobody went fishing. And so at a very casual pace we all went about eating a hearty breakfast and packing up.

JUNE FIELD DAY CONT'D:

Just as Ric, George and I finished loading our vehicles, a bloke approached me and asked if we might help tow two bogged vehicles off the beach. Conventional vehicles on Ocean Beach, close to the river mouth, is by no means rare, for once the bar closes, the sand packs down fairly hard, making for easy driving to within about 75 metres from the ocean- that is as long as entry is made opposite the caravan park.

These people obviously saw tracks leading from the boat ramp to where other vehicles were parked on firm ground and thought if they can do it so can we. How the heck they got 200 yards up the beach in fairly soft sand has got us beat. Anyway we asked them to deflate, then I took the Mazda (nice and light) and George took the Falcon Station waggon (about two hundred weight of gear and five people). The Mazda moved easily, but not so the Falcon. Eventually, after George bogged himself, we all got behind the waggon and pushed. Whilst we were inflating their tyres (once on hard ground) these guys got the message and decided that if it wasn't for us, they would have had a lousy weekend and so gave us \$10 each for our trouble.

Once again we had a pretty poor tally of fish for the weekend, but everybody I spoke to enjoyed themselves all the same.

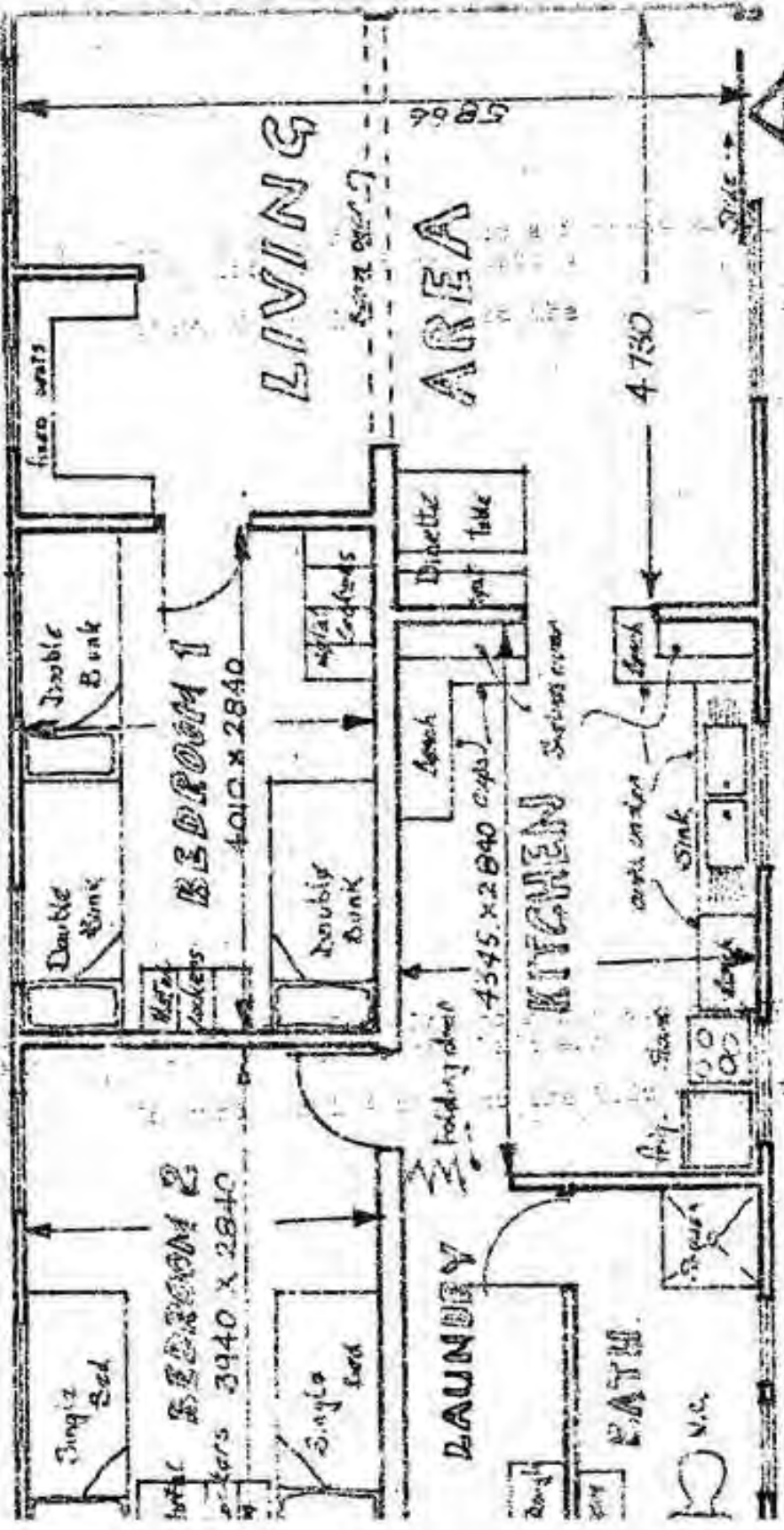
