DUTCH PICKLED FISH

This recipe was much sought after following its tasting at one of our club meetings.

RECIPE INGREDIENTS:

Fresh Fish - approximately 1½ to 2 kg size. Tailor wash well.

Oil for Frying

- | | |
|---------------------------|-----------------------------|
| 6 Large Bay Leaves | 2 rounded Tbsp Flour |
| 6 Onions, sliced or rings | 1½ Tsp Salt |
| 3 cups Brown Sugar | 1 Tbsp Black Peppercorns |
| 1 cup Water | Freshly ground Black pepper |
| ¼ cup Sugar | 1 cup Sultanas - optional |
| 1 Tbsp Vinigar | |
| 3 Tbsp Curry Powder | |

METHOD

- Fillet Fish - cut into strips or cubes (this sauce seems to cover much more than the suggested 2 kg: six fish)
- Fry Fish in oil for 1½ mins. each side or until just cooked through.
- Season well while cooking. Set Aside.
- Simmer onions in Vinigar, Water, Bay Leaves, Sugar and condiments 10 - 12 mins. Add sultanas.

Cont'd

- Thicken the sauce with flour which has been mixed to a smooth paste with water.
- Place alternative layers of onion, Fish and Sauce in an Airtight container.
- Seal container and re-fridge-rate.
- Fish is ready to eat after 3 days and will keep in fridge for up to 6 months.

Here is yet another recipe for Raw fish marinated. This recipe comes from Alar Stephenson who guarantee's it's flavour especially with a light white wine.

SEVICHE (marinated raw fish)

Using 500 grams of Diced Fish Fillet no bones or skin or small fish headed and tailed.
"Poddy Whiting Magnifico"

INGRED:

1. $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Lemon Juice
2. $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Tomato Juice
3. $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Olive oil
4. $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Green Chillies chopped (see alternatives as stated)
5. $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped onions
6. $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Tomatoes - peeled - chopped - seeded (use canned)
7. 2 Tsp Salt
8. Small Pinch Cayenne Pepper
9. $\frac{1}{2}$ Tsp Dried Thyme or alternative (as stated)

Cover and marinate Fish in "Frig" for 24 hrs

ALTERNATIVES

4. Capsicum
9. Mixed Herbs, Rosemary

ADDITIONS PER (AS STATED)

White Wine - spiced Vinegar and/or Preservative/ drained liquid from Gherkin or Cucumber.

Spices - Oregano, Basil-powdered, Bay Leaf a few Peppercorns (White), some cloves.

See 6: Add some home made chili sauce if required.
