Attendance was exceptionally good, and we would like to see this continue throughout, as those who participate enjoy themselves and new and old members are welcomed to this section of our Club's activities, which is held on the first Sunday of each month. (vs)

It was pleasing to see new members doing so well with their casting as the following results show ---

Tom Corcoran took top honours with 125 points - he is now qualified in the field of drycasting and should be able to teach his juniors! Also another new member in Eric Hill has taken off this month's L.L. Distance - keep it up Eric.

D.H. Accuracy - G. Holman gained first place with 67/80, not a record George, but not far to go -- very fine casting. Following closely was R. Tichbon 61/80, and T. Corcoran third with 55/80.

In the S.H. Accuracy, Bob Tucker scored 29/40 to take first place with J. Strong second 27/40, and third place goes to D. Talbo with 25/40.

It was noticeable this month, that with the help and co-operation of all members, dry casting ran smoothly and was completed early, so chaps keep it up next month as we will be including our first single handed Open of the year in June.

These Handicaps should have been in last month. Handicaps are revised every six months, using the average of the last six casts, over a twelve month period, and subtracting from a base figure of 450 = handicap.

41 Members, Junior and Visitors travelled over to Garden Island. Conditions were ideal for angling and with a total bag of 1162 lb. of fish the season commenced in a terrific fashion. 134 Salmon being taken mainly from the Back Beach and all anglers agreed they had a ball.

The steep hill at the Back Beach took its toll as the anglers struggled to the summit, there they collapsed and regained their wind. Most bags carried exceeded between 40 - 80 lb in weight. (w) Eric Hill and John Hilton made it I will never know, Eric's bag of fish weighed in at 149 lb, mainly Salmon, and they fished near the 4th Bay.

Bob Tichbon, Doug Salt and myself strolled over in the afternoon to the Back Beach. The Entire Area took on picnic air. Many anglers landing Salmon. Doug and I carried on and found Doug Edward, who on catching Salmon was handing them over to the Scouts who were over on a camping trip, and later when he had caught enough Salmon was returning them to the water, where they promptly caught them again. His two rods appeared to be working overtime. Doug Salt and I were amazed at the number of Salmon he landed though he gave most of them away. The tailor he caught were carefully given Pride of Place. Our old stalwart Blue Hampton was also going great guns. His 7 lb.-14 oz. tailor was a beauty and he also weighed in a good bag. "Good Luck Blue", we may see more of you during the season.

Ted Savage and Ron Kildahl joined us, and were soon in business. Alf Ruthand after taking a lot of ribbing from Doug Edwards finally luck form and soon had 4 Salmon on the Beach. Ted weighed in the heaviest Salmon at 10 lb he also weighed in an excellent bag. Also Ron staggered back with a good bag of Salmon and Tailor.

Most anglers retired early with all they could carry (some how). Doug Salt, Bob Tichbon and myself arrived back in camp and collapsed. The Lads that fished the rifle range area found the fish scarce.

Bob Tucker landed a $4\frac{1}{2}$ lb Cuttlefish which aroused much interest. Lofty Griffith fished for many hours to land over a few herring and skips. This was the general picture of this area.

However we were late arriving at Palm Beach Jetty due to the vessel breaking down though of course this was out of our control.

We were fishing off the back beach of Garden Island on Sunday morning when Graham had this mighty run. The fish headed straight out to sea and must have taken out at least 150 yards of line. At first we all thought that it was a shark, but as it stopped its run and lay doggo over the end of a reef, we thought that it was a Ray. However, young Graham stuck with him, giving him a nudge occasionally to try and get him moving. I climbed to the top of the sandhills to see if I could spot a fin or something to give us an indication of what it was. Fortunately the fish broke surface and I made out the shape of a large tail. Upon seeing this, and judging by the way the fish was performing, I thought that it was a sea kingie or Samson fish, and this proved to be correct.

(Not long after Graham had hooked his fish, my mate also had a terrific run which stripped plenty of line from his reel, but after playing it for about half an hour, the trace parted, chaffed through, but not bitten off.)

After battling for nearly an hour, Graham began to move his fish, and with continual pumping, the fish left the reef area and moved out across the clear water. Graham soon moved him in, and as the fish swam parallel with the beach I spied him in the waves. I shouted to Graham and informed him that it definitely looked like a Samson Fish, and what a glorious sight it was. It looked like a mini-sub as it glided through the water. Young John Dehring did a good job with the Gaff (apparently the lecture on gaffing at the meeting wasn't wasted, and hauled out the fish. Details of the capture --
