Travelling north Mark Tucker wanted to see some famous coast near Boranup so we headed in along Formation Road taking the right fork (which proved to be wrong) and after a 5 to 6 mile tour of some very impressive young Karri country came back out onto the main road completely dis-orientated not knowing which way was north, south, up or down! The weigh-in of the first dozen anglers didn't inspire anyone and it looked like things were going to be a little grim. Craig Risbey's 3.0 kg bag was the most impressive to date. However with 10-15 minutes to go the crowd from down south arrived with some good bags. Cosy Corner produced nothing but Hamelin Bay produced a couple of salmon and some herring, while big bags of herring came in from further north together with a few salmon and 2 lonely small tailor. Two salmon, one caught by Alan Hair and another by George Holman, were tagged - in N.S.W!!

18 anglers weighed in 67.3 kg of fish from good bags of George Holman 17.5 kg, Robert Ingram 10.7 kg, Ric Rowland 10.4 kg and Tony Richardson 5.8 kg down to a single herring weighed in by Brian Rowland for 0.1 kg.

With the first of the new seasons field days complete it was back to Perth. But only for 2 weeks. See you at Greenough.

The Angling will be held on the 27th and 28th September.

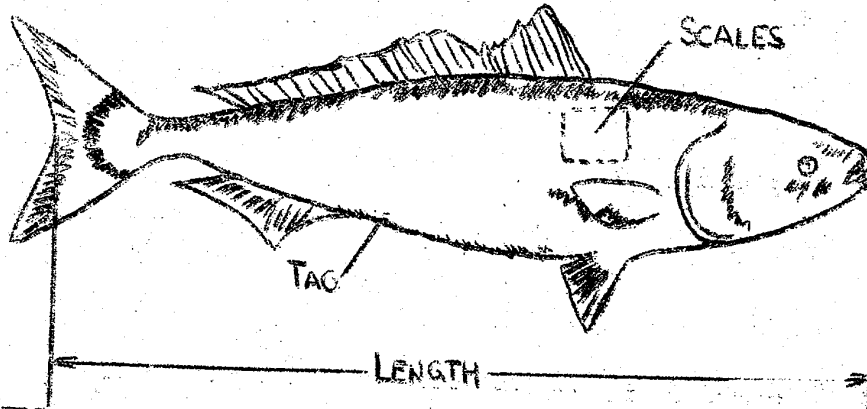

TAGS consist of a white plastic tag (5 cm x 2½ cm) inserted in the fish near the belly. A yellow or brown streamer will indicate its presence and position. The tag will be inscribed "C.S.I.R.O., Box 21, CRONULLA, N.S.W. Please measure" and a serial number.



FINDERS are asked to freeze the specimen, contact Mike Walker at Western Australian Marine Research Laboratories (Tel. 471366) or the nearest Fisheries Inspector.

- If they are unable to do this, they should record
- Exact place and date of capture
 - Exact length of fish from snout to centre of tail
 - A dozen or more scales from the area indicated in the diagram
 - Return tag to Cronulla.
