DRYCASTING - 7TH FEBRUARY, 1965

In February 1964 we had A.B.W. Channel 2 televising some of our boys in action and now we have in February 1965 Bob Jensen and Frank Van Zalen busily recording the boys at casting. I hope that both Frank and Bob will one night show us their results. Bob was very busy alternately casting and shooting.

Also noticed Norm Giles down for another look and Norrie Cross also turned up and had a few casts although not taking part in the competition.

Twenty seniors and one junior took part in the days casting and although no great scores were recorded in the D.H. or S.H. Accuracy events three members exceeded their handicaps in the L.L. Distance. They were Ian McLennan with 287 - 180 - 467 to take top place, Doug Talbot 320 - 142 - 462 second and Ken Jones 343 - 107 - 450 third. Bill Bridger with 405ft. had the furthestmost cast in this event followed by Allan Bunnett 380ft. and Ken Jones 377ft.

Three Bobs, Bob Jensen, Bob Tichbon and Bob Tucker scored with all four D.H. Accuracy casts at targets which were set to our longest casting distance of 92 yards and 62 yards. Bob Tucker also recorded the only bull in this event, on the 92 yard target.

Bob Jensen top scored with 45/80, Allan Bunnett and Eric Sullivan tied for second with 40/80 and Bob Tichbon was third 39/80.

The S.H. Accuracy resulted in a win for Bob Tucker 21/40, B. Tichbon second 19/40 and Ken Hunt 18/40 third. Ken Hunt, Jim Strong and Bob Tucker were the only three to score with all four casts. Ken Hunt and Ken Jones recorded bulls and Allan Bunnett and Bob Tichbon scored a near miss. These targets at 102ft. and 132ft. are only four feet short of our maximum distance. Bob Tucker was the only caster to score with all eight accuracy casts.

Don Bridger was the only junior present. Don's scores were 32/80 in the D.H. and 14/40 in the S.H. Accuracy.

FIELD DAY - GARDEN ISLAND - 13TH & 14TH FEBRUARY 1965

Weather conditions:- Howling southerly gale, turbulent ocean plus lots of weed made conditions difficult for all anglers. Attendance was quite fair with 35 members, 3 juniors and 3 visitors journeying over to the Island - 25 on the first boat and the balance on the second - the landing point now being the Gantry jetty. The lack of fish was most disappointing, only a few members contacting the tailor at all.

I was pleased to see Ken Wiggins along with new member R. Mansfield and Bob Tucker bought his son Mark who looked as if he was enjoying himself, especially catching the small herring from the Gantry jetty Sunday morning. Other members I noticed were Harry Barrott, Terry Fuller and Ron McQueen who incidently came into the picture with heaviest bag including a tailor of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Another fish to arouse interest was a fine Skipjack caught by Ted Savage which took off a section in the competition.

I journeyed up to the gun area with all of the lads from the early boat and I think that we could quite easily enter Joe the truck driver in the Open competition at Claremont speedway - he would leave them for dead on fowlhouse corner. However we arrived in one piece although one rod was damaged and more care will be needed in future. First job for those staying all night was to prepare their camping area and then we all headed off to our chosen spots. "Blue" Hampton, young Steven and myself walked south from the gun looking for a likely area but the pounding surf and heavy weed did not look promising.

Later in the afternoon we walked north along the beach and chatted with Doug Talbot, Tom Smith, Bob Tucker and young Mark who were fishing the bay directly in front of the gun. Near the same spot were Hal Neil, Ian McLennan, Ron Shirley, Bob Klein, R. Mansfield and visitor Bill Schaap. When Bill landed a tailor at about 3.45 p.m. we decided it was time to head back to our spot and see what we could do. Later in the evening we were joined by Don Beadon, who had "Blue" speechless when he landed a tailor with his first cast. Don again tangled with a tailor later on and what a beauty it was. It lept several feet out of the water to throw the hooks and we estimated its weight at about

81b. My turn came next when I hooked into what may have been a shark, but when the backing on my spool showed up under the 27lb. line I galloped down to the water's edge for a final effort but the line parted, showing that he was way out of my class.

I was successful later in landing a Mulloway and "Blue" was highly pleased with his captures although Hal Neil tried valiantly to no avail. We finally decided to give it away and after a cup of brew supplied by Don we struggled up the track to the gun, which was very soft and rugged, and after a breather tramped back to the hut. On arrival we were greeted by Ron McQueen who weighed in a fine bag of Tailor including a $4\frac{1}{4}$ pounder.

Next morning I prepared for the weigh in expecting fair hauls of tailor but most anglers found it hard going, even the boys from the far north who reported a lack of fish in all areas. "Lofty" Griffiths weighed in a good selection of Bull Herring but most captures were very light. Personally I believe the whole area is being extensively netted and many boats have been observed trolling close in the bays taking large quantity of tailor.

So closed another Field Day and although captures were not impressive all members had a good time. As we were waiting at the Gantry jetty, Ted Savage had the misfortune to drop his glasses overboard. Ken Wiggins was stripping off to go to the rescue when a cheerful skindiver did his good deed and recovered them. Ken had to hastily dress again as a party of lasses arrived to catch the boat.
