All was in readiness, and away we went at a quarter to ten on this warm Sunday morning. Attendance figures were 21, and even though the competition is drawing to a close, we would like club members to maintain interest. Practice at dry casting helps to improve fishing - ask Dave Latto about this!

The boys showed their ability at casting this month, was it because there was something 'special' about the ginger beer, or was it because of the visitors and many onlookers? Good casting chaps, we would like to see more of it.

In the Single Handed open which was the final of this event for the year, Allan Bunnett took top score for the day with 242 ft. R. Tucker second 235 ft., and E. Sullivan third with 219 ft. Even though Allan performed exceptionally well on the day, final figures for the year show that Bob Tucker is the overall winner of this event -- Congratulations Bob.

In the L.L. Distance, W. Bridger had the longest cast of 405 ft. This event was won by R. Tichbon, R. Kildahl second and D. Talbot third.

D.H. Accuracy - this event showed keen interest as one of our members, R. Kildahl equalled his own and R. Tucker's record of February 1964, with a score of 65/80, followed by D. Talbot with 52/80 and third was R. Tucker with 51/80. There were eleven members who scored with all four casts in this event.

S.H. Accuracy - these were set at 132 ft. and 102 ft. There were five members scored with all four casts, and the winner of this event was E. Sullivan 28/40, R. Tucker second 26/40, and H.H. Yew with 25/40. Four members were successful in scoring in all of the eight accuracy casts.

The overall winner of the day was R. Kildahl with 126 points R. Tucker 121 points and R. Tichbon 120 points. There was one member who reduced his handicap, and this was R. Tichbon from 151 to 143.

Our party headed to the Tip Area and travelled further South and settled down behind a likely channel behind the Reef. Further south we could see the other parties along the beach. Thank goodness the southerly was blowing and helped to clear the air.
