RULES & REGULATIONS GOVERNING 3 IN 1 BADGE.

1. Standard fishing gear consisting of rod, reel and line.
2. Level line to be used, leader not to exceed 10-ft. (nylon or wire) Any poundage.
3. First 15-ft. of the line to be supplied with application of capture. Three tests to be made on registered testing machine (Linnetts Sports Store) and the average to be taken as the breaking strain of the line.
4. Fish classification to be as standard Club Ruler (Rays, Wobbys and Port Jacksons excluded).
5. Fish to be weighed on Government Tested Scales and name and address of owner of scales to be stated.
6. All applications must be accompanied by a photograph.
7. Dimensions of Fish, weight, length and girth to be stated.
8. Place and date of capture to be stated.

Rules and Regulations contd.

9. Declarations of witness to capture and weighing to be person not less than 17 years of age.
10. Fish to be hooked, played and landed from shore, jetty, groyne or wharf. Fish must be brought to gaff by the applicant without assistance.
11. Applications to be in the hands of the Club Recorder within 30 days.

FEBRUARY FIELD DAY 1969 -- PRESTON BEACH.

The F.D.O.'s party arrived at Preston Beach around 11 in the morning to be greeted by Jack Harvey, Jim Strong and Co., who were enthusiastic about the prospects for the venue as they had caught a few nice fish that morning. Lofty (Assistant F.D.O) and his party arrived a little later, and we all hopped in and soon had the tent erected.

Once we were organised we rolled the buggy off the trailer and set off along the beach to inspect the water and find the "hot spots". Tom Corcoran had his first ride in our buggy that morning, and to coin a phrase he said "I want one". Watch out Margaret. The water was excellent all along except for the North End and I personally thought that a good deal of fish would be caught.

On arriving back to base we told the members who had arrived of the prospects and at 1 p.m. the checking in started, and the issuing of receipts. May I say here that I was very pleased with the response by all members as they checked in in person, thus making my job a lot easier. This will be the trend for the future, I hope.

The Collie Club members were, on the whole a little late on the scene as they don't usually check in until four. Sixteen of their members attended including Juniors and Mrs. Dot Warner attended. It was good to chat with Fred and the other Collie Club members, and I look forward to their attendance at our Yallingup venue in April.

At four p.m. Tom and myself once more stoked up the buggy and set off down the beach. On the way we spoke to numerous members and witnessed a few fish being caught. On arriving at our spot, young Drew Shaw and Rick Rowlands were right amongst them, and had caught a number of fish before Tom and myself got under way. The Tailor were certainly there and by the time we stopped fishing we all had good bags. We visualised the same for every other angler on the beach as the Tailor seemed plentiful.

The morning's fishing produced only a few tailer and we later learnt that Lofty's party had seen a large shark cruising around but it didn't come close enough for a bait. A shark was also



also seen in the water directly in front of the camping area on te Saturday afternoon.

Back to the weigh-in centre passing Dave Latta's Wobby Shark 104 lb. on the beach, Dave must have had some fun landing him. There seemed a lot of happy faces back at the weigh-in. This was borne out with the number of good bags which were brought forward. The weigh-in went smoothly and all fish were soon weighed thanks to the co-operation of members. Tony Smith tried hard but couldn't even register 1/4 lb. with that strange looking fish (.) that he managed to catch. I'll bet it took some landing!!

Rudy Lerch got a shock when he found out he caught the largest scale fish (1.3/4 lb. Tailer) even though two juniors had larger specimens, their fish were restricted to the Junior Section. Heaviest bag of scale fish went to one of the best Tailer fishermen I have ever fished with in Richard Rowland, who managed a splendid 48.1/4 lb. He really gets them out of the water.

No sharks were caught other than Dave's Wobby which was ineligible so the sweep was a little fatter for the successful anglers.

Graham Ross caught a good bag of fish 36 lb. to once again take off the Junior section. However, Drew Shaw has been breathing down his neck and managed a splendid bag of 29.1/2 lb. of Tailer. Even though he dipped out, he had the satisfaction of catching the biggest Tailer 2.3/4 lb. and took off the trophy donated by Jim Strong.

I will announce the Mystem Poundage winner at the next meeting and I can tell you the successful member is in for a shock, so you had all better attend. The Prize is a good knife and sheath donated by Jack Harvey.

That about sums up the venue, but I would like to add that the co-operation that has been forthcoming by all members who attend the venues has been very helpful and the venues are becoming more easier to run. See you all at Kalbarri early in March. Good fishing
