We welcome them all to the club and trust they enjoy our competitions and other functions.

Ric Parker's report of correspondence included a letter from the Stirling City Council requesting a delegate from this club to a Committee of Users of this hall, also a note from the Geraldton Club- they will be at Cuvier in March.

A letter from the Minister reference the "Off Road" Bill, confirming that it will be before Parliament during the March Sitting.

The various officers gave their reports and it was mentioned in passing that members can get 10% discount at Perth Ice Works but show your badge- or WEAR your "TEE SHIRTS".

Social Report confirmed the Sheraton Venue has fallen through and the Annual Dinner Dance will be at the Wembley Lodge as usual, but changed format with separate tables of about 8 people and a smorgasbord meal.

During the A.A.A. Report, Jack Harvey voiced his disgust at the sight of rubbish bins full of rotten herring being weighed in. Delegates were asked to put a vote of 'yes' to the motion of a max. of 100 of any one species, in any one bag, for future A.A.A. competitions.

The Gloucester Park Dry Cast Venue was discussed and the 10 o'clock start required because of horses using the track in the morning, meant a late start for us. The motion to change our Dry Casting venue was lost.

General Business.

Bob Klein gave a report on the latest developments at Quobba Station. Some restrictions have been imposed on camping, in order to reduce damage to stock fences etc. Camping is permitted at the homestead in the shearing shed area up to approximately 4km North of the coast for a small tariff. Campers are required to call at the homestead before proceeding.

FEBRUARY GENERAL MEETING CONT'D:

Shearers Quarters are \$3 per person per night.

Small cottages are \$3.50 to \$4.00 per person per night subject to a maximum of approximately \$140 per week. This includes gas stove, fridge, cooking and eating gear. A freezer is being installed (30 cu.ft.) - this will provide bait and ice and storage.

John Lee called at the S-Bend Caravan Park (Greenough River). Robbie sends his regards to the club and invites members uncertain of the conditions there, to 'phone him for an up to date report. The current record for one fishing session is 27 fish, held by one of Robbie's brothers (a morning session 6-10a.m.) Members are challenged to go up there and break it.

Basil Marsh has been to Bremer Bay area over the holiday and found the tracks a bit too rough for the Kombi, 4 W.D. country round there. Caught salmon and salmon trout, some herring. Recommended Peaceful Bay; campers at \$2.80 per head per night.

Prevelly Park, Margaret River. DOGS BANNED. A man lost his thumb trying to separate dogs over the holiday and now dogs are OUT!!!

For instruction period, Lofty gave a report on Peter Bristow's big game fishing boat.

Lofty went out with a party and found the trip very interesting. Peter gave them a lecture on hooks, gear and bait, showing them how to fillet and mount the bait correctly and how to troll. The ideal distance behind the boat is 120 ft. Peter has the lines marked so that the setting is very precise! Speed 7 knots. Troll just below the surface with the bait breaking the surface occasionally causing a stream of bubbles. Ideal water temperature, 73 degrees to 75 degrees. Lofty picked up a few tips on gaffing too- got him in a corner some time and ask him about it - there is a lot more to it than I can report here!

Jack Harvey followed with a brief report on his trip to Queensland. He stressed the strong vehicle control all along the coast- NO VEHICLES ON THE BEACH.

He was very impressed with Adelaide and the care taken to preserve trees under power lines; cut off low, but not bulldozed like we do here.

He sampled some Fresh Water Lake fishing getting a few tips from the locals and using a bit of his own experience, got broken off (using 5lb line), but caught some 'Yellow bellys' (Perch) 5 to 6 lbs.

The President thanked both speakers for their reports and after drawing the \$2 Board (won by Lofty), closed the meeting.

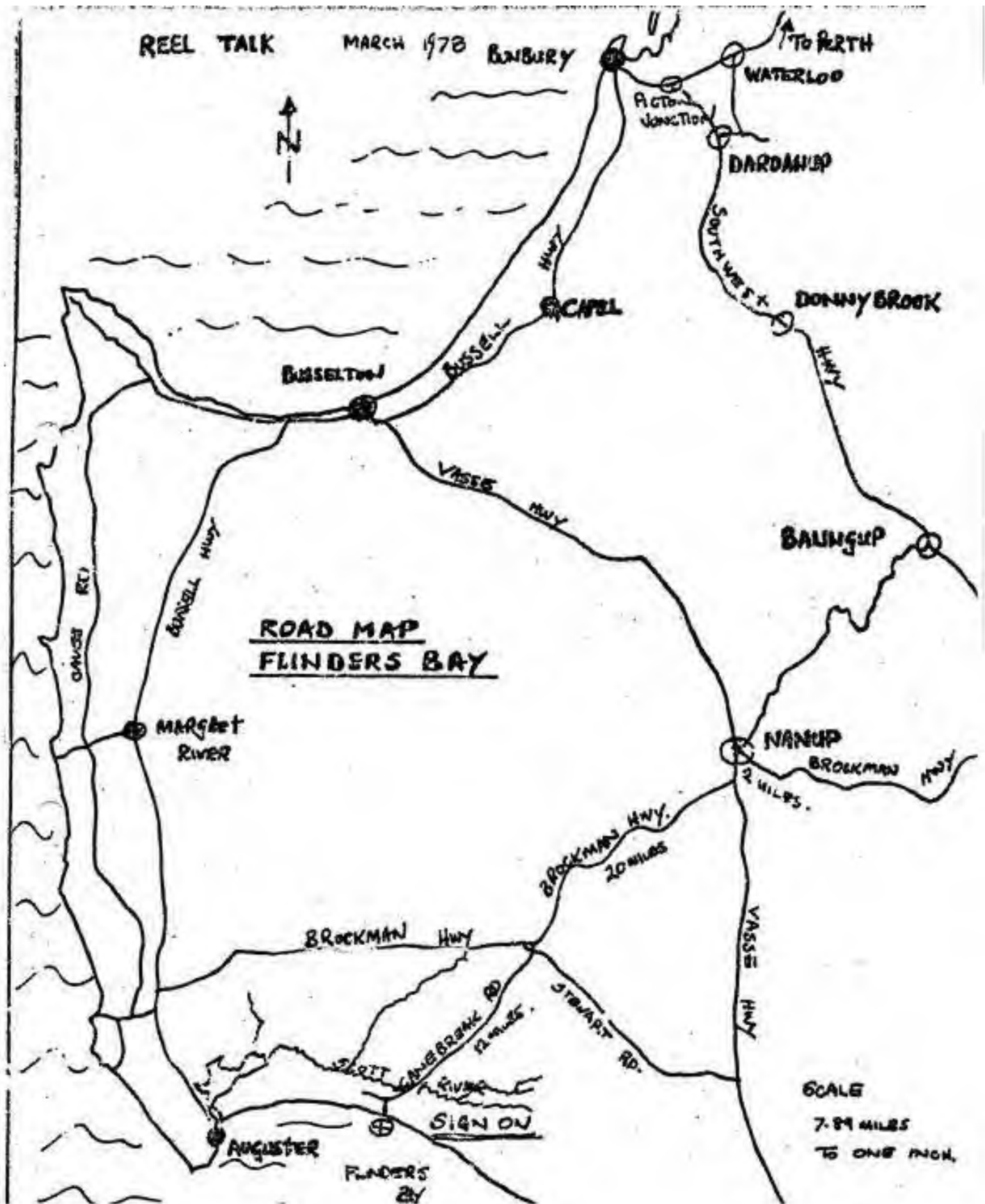
