FEBRUARY DRYPCASTING:

February was one of our better attended casts with 29 seniors, 8 juniors and 1 senior visitor participating. With all competitors casting into a very stiff Easterly breeze, it was obvious that no great distance would be achieved. But as the morning wore on the breeze dropped slightly and Hewie cast 135m. to record the longest cast for the day. A very good performance under such conditions!

Our visitor for the day was Tom Armstrong (friend of Ron Kildahl's). Didn't record any great total but receives top marks for his participation. We hope to see some more of him. Harold Salfinger broke down on D/H accuracy which goes to show he hasn't been doing his practice lately. Peter Conroy won the D/H accuracy event with a magnificent total of 63 points, then promptly bombed out in S/H accuracy with a total score of 1. Up until this event, Peter virtually had the day won. Peter has shown a lot of determination and concentration with his casting this year which reflect in his overall scores and position in the top ten. Gary Gildersleeve, another caster with a lot of ability, seems determined to take over Stan Renshaw's place of last season, namely 3rd position. Gary was 3rd in L/L distance, D/H accuracy and S/H accuracy. Gary is a true top line caster and with a little more practice he has the ability to take off an individual championship. Ron Flynn, who we don't see a great deal of, could be a force to be reckoned with (with a little more practice). Ron finished overall 7th on the day which is a pretty good performance.

I noticed that Alby Norman had a break-off in the L/L distance event which is nothing unusual in itself, but what is unusual, is that his mate, Phil Isbister, had a break-off on the very next cast. I rather strongly suspect that Phil's break-off was deliberate so that he wouldn't have to listen to Alby whinging about his.

The day proved quite a tussle for our two lady casters, Mrs. Lundy and Mrs. Tomsitt, but in the end we couldn't separate them both with a total of 36. Will be interesting to see who wins the tie breaker next cast. You'll both have to get the old man to do the washing on Saturday morning so you can practice your S/H and D/H accuracy!

The junior winner on the day was Craig Norman. Craig has always cast well on Yokine Reserve. All we need from Craig is more attendance. Troy Latta is still on the top of the list and casting steadily, certainly not at his top form of a little while back. There's not a great deal between Craig, Troy and Joanne Tomsitt. Could be interesting junior results this year. Clayton Freind, our new junior member, turned in a very good total score of 48 (for first cast). He borrowed Hewie's rod for one cast in the open event and improved from 70m to 105. We haven't many juniors that cast this distance and Clayton could certainly make his presence felt in the competition next year.

Another new junior member, Steven Sussmayer, didn't do quite as well, but that doesn't reflect his casting ability as I have seen him do much better. Just a little practice required Steven!

FEBRUARY DRYCASTING CONT'D:

Pressy Leicester won the S/H accuracy event and was runner up in the D/H open. Hewie had quite a good day- won the L/L distance, D/H open and longest cast. Yet the overall winner was the maestro, George Holman (hard man to beat). Dennis Green still plugging on consistently. Still overall winner on points. But it's an open event and none of the top 4 casters at this stage can afford many booboos. Bob Fredericks proved to us that he could cast- turned up on Sunday, first time for the season. Quite a reasonable score of 72 points, including a bull in the D/H accuracy. Wonder if he will turn up next cast and better it, just to prove it wasn't a fluke.

Sincere thanks to all the willing helpers, too many to mention. Congratulations to individual and overall winners. Next cast MARCH 11th, Yokine Reserve. Usual events plus S/H Open. Come down and be in the fun. Till then, Cheers!

PHOTOGRAPHY:
Audiovisuals:

I was at a Camera Club meeting recently when they were planning a coming audiovisual competition.

The thought struck me that some of you might find this a more interesting way of recording your fishing trips or holidays.

All it is in simple terms is a slide projector and a cassette recorder. If you want to get really involved it can mean a special lap/desolve projector coupled to a special recorder that changes the slides by a silent signal put onto the tape at the appropriate intervals.

If you have a camera and a cassette recorder, your ready to go.

After the slides are all back from processing sort them out into some sort of sequence and put a spot about the size of a match head in the bottom L.H. corner when the slide is viewed from the way it was taken. When you load the projectors magazine the spots all go in the top R.H. corner facing you and your slides will always project the correct way up.

The next step is to work out approximately how long you want to view each slide and you record a tape with a commentary and background effects to suit the slides. Some of these effects you record when you take the photos, others you can fake- seagulls are everywhere- the sound of the sea is much the same, anywhere etc.

This recording of the accompanying tape can be as elaborate or simple as you like.

All that remains then is for that set of slides to be stored with that tape and whenever you feel like it, pop the slides in the projector, start the tape and just change the slides to suit the tape manually.

The first audiovisual I ever saw was of a set of slides set to a piece of music. Another one was to record a famous actor reciting a poem.

It really can be very effective. Give it a try.
