Our two delegates George Holman and Eric Parker were present at the February Meeting of the above as ociation along with 31 representatives of other clubs. The meeting was held at the Marmion Angling and Aquetic Clubs premises.

The Assistant Director of Fisheries, Mr. Peter Rogers was present and gave a talk (and accepted questions and gave answers) on a forthcoming decision to be made by the Minister for Fisheries regarding extra allocations on Salmon (an extra 7 tonnes per license) and Herring catches to the professional fishermen.

Mr. Paul Foster was nominated by this association for "Citizen of the Year" due to the work and effort he puts into angling and also State Chess.

The audit should be completed "in the next few days".

The State Beach Championships are to be held at Preston Beach on the last week-end in April.

Committees are to be formed for each of the various divisions to report on their activities at the delegates meeting in an endeavour to obviate extra discussion at the delegates meetings.

A motion was put, and carried, that the association pay \$1.00 per member (approximately \$500) toward the employment of a Pull time Secretary.
