APRIL CASTING NEWS.

Easter Sunday's sultry and over-cast weather was ideally suited for competition casting. The 27 members present, of whom eleven reduced Handicaps, used the calm conditions to make close of competition for 1968/69 a most interesting one. Normally a score of 100 is enough to win the day. 7 members achieved 100 and over. Doug Talbot emerged the "giant" with a total of 141 points. We believe this to be a record for a day's total. Doug made the hat-trick by winning both D.H. and S.H. Acc. In addition to carrying the field with 466 pts for L.L. Dist. Hcp. Competition's final figures show him the over-all winner with a total of 1165 pts. A win in L.L. Dist. with 304 pts Second in S.H. Acc., and third in D.H. Acc. We feel sure Doug's achievements this year must be something of an all-time record in the annals of the Clubs casting history. Over-shadowed by all this glory was a bull on the day's D.H. Acc target. All members will join us in congratulating a fine sportsman on a great effort.

Out of the dust of the Talbot Turmoil, there show other faces worthy of mention. On the day was Brian Liecester's attempt with 115 pts. Brian had D.H. Acc. sewn up with 61/80, until Doug's final scores showed 63/80. We mention here Brian failed by one point to gain a place in the top ten. Next year we could see a change.

Ron Johnson figured in the unusual (for him) role of second place in S.H. Acc. with a score of 25/40. Ron is well known for his distance casting having added a new dimension to these events by having a handicap of 4 most of the year (revision 6). Ron usually turns in the day's longest cast. This year he won top honours in D.H. open with a total of 1869 pts. Could it be he is turning to Acc. events to gain further honours?

It will depend to some extent on your point of view how you see the next "face". John Devitt recorded this month's longest cast of 467 ft. July of this year saw John score 474 ft. for a Dist. record. This month's hcp. reductions show him to have -2., something, we believe to be unique in this Club's casting history. Revision 8. The most chilling feature to dist. aspirants is the fact that in practice after the day's events John made two casts over 500 ft. With casts of this content, and minus hcp, some consideration will have to be given to a revision of casting procedures, as, at present rules do not give directions on these matters.

Second on the Total Scores list was that wily exponent of the "flick-stick" Bob Tucker. Bob caused the leader some anxious moments as can be seen by his score of 1148 pts. As tipped for a place some time previous, another "old dog for a hard road" in Bob Tickbon gained third with 1009 pts.

On the final day of the S.H. Open, Bob Tucker got away a cast of 300 ft. His year's total for this event was 1134 pts. Gen. Holman notched up 892 and Bill Utting managed 808. "Tuck" also won the section for D.H. and S.H. Acc.

John Nuich gained 2nd place in L.L. Dist. Hcp. with 282 pts, and 3rd was Show Tate with 278. In the D.H. Acc Section, Bill Utting scored 512 and second, while S.H. Acc. saw Bill Bridger, that master of the gear reel 3rd with 229 points.

We the Casting Organisers offer our congratulations to the winners of allevents, and hope all place getters will be spurred to even greater efforts in the ensuing year's comp. We also thank sincerely all who helped us willingly and unselfishly over the year to make the Casting Comp., the pleasure it is to run. D.LATTO/B. HANKS.

"ROTTNEST SPREE" 1969.

Arrived home from the Murchison on the Friday night after two week's fishing holiday with the fishing not so good as expected, Alan McClachlan and Lofty, we decided to spend our last few days over on Rottnest Island.

On Wednesday morning as planned, pushed off from Fremantle in the rain with the Club's keys to the huts on the Island, on arrival at the bottom hut it was evident that we had boarders, soon cleaning up came across somebody's sport coat hanging on a nail, on removing it, was amazed at the number of mice that had made their home inside the lining. The weight was 502 lbs. not bad fun indeed.

So on our way home on Friday and gave Preston Beach a thought, and hope to do well there. I don't know what happened but there were no fish where we were anyway chaps gaffed a Malloway there for a lady, 40 lbs, I think.

Well it's all over and now back to work on Monday, and what a thought!!
