Field Day Report - 12th & 13th - Margaret River

A.A.A. of W.A. Report

April 15th was the first delegates meeting for the Division for 2 months, due to the Australian Angling Carnival held at Albany in March. The meeting saw a large attendance of delegates, the Surfcasters being represented by Jim Strong and George Bolman.

A number of congratulatory letters were received re the Carnival run by the W.A. Division, including one from Ian Teasdale on behalf of TVW Channel 7.

Jim Strong, as Patron, wrote a very sincere letter expressing congratulations to the Association and the Clubs who helped make the Carnival the success it was.

A letter was received from the Fisheries and Wildlife referring to the letter it received from the Division re legal lengths and honorary fisheries inspectors. The legal lengths were at present under review and the recommendations would be considered. The appointment of two honorary fisheries inspectors was also being considered and there was every likelihood of this taking place. Their duties would be more of an advisory and observatory nature with an endeavour to educate the public on legal lengths and making them aware of these through advertising, notices on jetties and the like. They would also be a further means of the Fisheries and Wildlife obtaining relevant information to numbers fishing, fish caught etc. The two members put forward by the Division were Peter Mason and Dennis Gilbert.

Fremantle Club donated a further \$100 towards the expenses of running the Albany Carnival. Though there are no official figures available yet it is estimated the cost will be in the vicinity of \$17,000.

Some T-Shirts and Banners are left over from the Carnival and are available to Club members at a cost of \$2.50 for the shirt and \$1.00 for the banner. There is also a large amount of mulies available at \$1.20 a block (10 blocks in a carton - \$12.00). These are in storage at Fremantle.
