The State Fishing Competition at Greenough showed some of the familiar faces who seem to consistently give their time and effort for the success of these venues. Jim Strong, Laurie Birchall, Stan Renshaw and Ron Flynn being some that I noticed. They certainly had a fine array of trophies. All in all, two good films, both well put together. Standing orders was then lifted so we could proceed with our normal business.

The Committee has decided to get a valuation on the Kalbarri House. Once this is obtained, the Club can then decide whether we should quit the house, or hangon a bit longer.

The Committee handling the Teams Drycasting Championships on 20th July, have things pretty well in hand, the nomination forms for this event have been printed and will be distributed to the various Clubs in the next few days. They will be looking for a minimum of 12 members to assist on this day, so keep it free and give Eric Parker a ring if you can help.

Tony Richardson gave the March Field Day Report, with Ron Flynn taking the Senior section and Heath Holman the Junior. There was no Drycasting Report as this event is not until the 20th April.

Our Recorder, Brian Cusack, has an application from Don Bibby for the Open section, a 13.6 kg Sampson fish caught at Denmark. This of course will be dealt with by Committee.

The bookings for the Kalbarri House are still not great, but hopefully the ads will have the desired effect. The broken glass in the front door of the house has been replaced and the cracked toilet pan will be replaced by Eric Parker who will be spending a week there in the near future. Both these items will of course be covered by insurance.

In the fishing reports Peter Osborne told how he caught his first Salmon in W.A., an 8 pounder captured at Triggs. Good on you Peter. Hope it's the first of many! Brian Leicester told us how he watched two young fellows at the mouth of the Bow River land a shark in the 30 lb range. While the angler held his rod straight down pointing it at the shark, his mate walked arm high into the water to gaff it. Sounds like a good way to lose an arm or leg. And Basil Marsh, with Trevor Stam, told us of quite a good days fishing at Cervantes. They bagged approx. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ doz. fish with flick rods, catching gardie, herring, whiting and tailor. Tony Richardson spoke of his recent trip to Steep Point. Certainly not as good as their first trip, but the excitement is still there as once again sailfish was sighted. If you like good heavy fishing, then this is the place for you, as sharks are still abundant.

DRYCASTING REPORT: 20TH APRIL 1980:

Well it had to come. The magic 160 metre barrier has been broken.

The weather was kind to us for most of the morning. A slight wind assistance made casting easier and therefore high scores were the result of the day.

In level line distance George Holman cast 161 metres to break a long standing club record. Geo showed the usual consistency by taking off the event with 47 points, followed by Hewie and Jester Leicester on 46 points. Brian had an excellent day to score 141 points which is his best ever result. Troy Latto gave his best ever performance with 89 points to win the Junior event. That's more like the true ability that young Troy has. (Notice he even beat his Dad on the day.)

Sid Whiting couldn't do a thing wrong in D.H. Accuracy. Scored 57 points for top caster in this event. Andy Tuvik followed closely behind with 55 points and Geo Holman on 54 points, third.

Jester Leicester fired a fine 34 points in S/H Accuracy followed by Gus Sussmayer on 30 and Dennis Green on 29.

Well by now you will have guessed that the top caster for the 79-80 season was Geo Holman who averaged 118.6 points for the 11 casts. Congratulations George. Also the fine 2nd placing of Hewie with Gary Gildersleeve in 3rd spot.

Ladies event saw Mrs. Tompsitt having the top score for the season, congratulations Kath. Second Glad Freind and Maureen Lundy 3rd.

Clayton Freind just scrapped home in the Junior section with 909 points and an average of 91 points per cast. Make the most of it Clayton, we see you in Seniors for the new season. Seriously though, congratulations on the excellent casting you have produced all year. Second was Joanne Tompsitt. Consistency pays off doesn't it? Third was Troy Latto. Well done.

May I take the opportunity in this report to thank my assistant, Graham Reeley for an excellent job in helping to make a casting days work so much easier.

Thanks to all those casters who came down to cast regularly and those who just came once or twice. I hope we can see you make a new start to the casting season by all turning up next cast- Sunday, May 4th.

As you probably know by now, the format for the events will alter slightly this new season. We will have four casts in the distance event. Two casts with 4oz (112 gram) level line and two casts with either 2oz (56 gram) or Artificial bait. The other events remain the same except the "open" will be on only four times in the season. This will consist of S/H distance and open L/L (no weight restriction).

I trust all members will give this change a fair go. I am sure it will assist in all of us casting better when we are at the beach, and that is what it's all about.

Once again thank you all for your co-operation this season.

MAY 1980.

A.A.A. OF W.A. REPORT:

The April meeting of the above Association was held on the 15th instant with approximately 18 delegates attending.

A report on the mid-term A.A.A. Convention, held in the Eastern States and attended by George Brown and Laurie Birchall, was presented by George. Most of the business dealt with the forthcoming championships in South Australia in 1981 and included a good deal of information on drycasting. A copy of the report will be posted to our club for us to peruse.

Peter Wise presented the report for the forthcoming State teams dry-casting to be held on the 20th July this year.

George Brown, on behalf of the Fremantle Club, reported on the progress of the forthcoming State Beach titles to be held at Yallingup on the 28th/29th June, 1980. Any of our members interested in being in our club team should let our F.D.O. know as soon as possible.

Marmion Club reported on the State Boat Championships to be held April 26th/27th.

The motion on the alterations to the \$1.00 per senior club member was passed by a large majority.

The Concistitution came back from the Attorney General and the Crown Law for the delegates to confirm its acceptance with all its amendments. This was carried.

George Brown and Paul Foster were nominated for Certificates of Merit to the next Convention to be held in South Australia in 1981.

A social night involving all the clubs is being looked into for a date later in the year. This is also to present various awards as well as an endeavour to get all members of the clubs together in a social atmosphere.
