This month's poundage was far better than last month's weight, but could have been better if the weather was a bit more gentle to us. Strong winds prevailed throughout the weekend and through the following week. Maybe the fog that was around had some bearing on the fishing also, but everyone tried their best and 30 catching fish out of a total of 68 was quite good really.

A.A.A. OF W.A. - REPORT

Tuesday, 16th. October.

There was a large attendance of delegates present representing their clubs and during the course of the evening another two clubs were welcomed into the division. The first was the Whitfords Seasports Club, (membership of approximately 120); the second, the R.A.A.F. Sergeants Mess Fishing Club (membership of 30 odd).

The most important decision of the evening was the selection of the Sportsman of the Year nominee for this year, to represent angling. After two ballots, Les Boddington from the Fremantle Club was selected. Congratulations from the Surfcasters Les. Runner up was Murray Pope from Rockingham (he was also runner up last year). There were seven nominees from the clubs.

In answer to a letter sent by the Association to the Nedlands Shire Council re the retention of the Nedlands Jetty, the Shire wrote informing us that every possible effort would be made to retain it for the enjoyment of anglers.

Only one record was passed, even though two others were presented, but until positive identification was made they will be held over. The record passed was for a 7lb 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz Skippy caught by Adam Zenich from a boat.

A good deal of other business was discussed culminating in a report by the Federal Convention Secretary for 1975, John Butler. This report was very enlightening and indicated the vast amount of work that John and the Federal Convention President for 1975, George Brown, have done towards this coming event over the past two months. Most of the foundation work has been done already and it now remains for all the clubs to chip in and do their bit and this function will be a successful and enjoyable one.

One point which will be voted on at the next meeting of the Division is whether or not Sharks should be included in the Australian Championship in 1975.

For those interested, the Australian Convention in 1975 will be held between the 7th. and 22nd. March, at Albany.
