Field Day Report - 12/13/14th October - Wagoe

After an uneventful and quick trip up, Mark Tucker (J) and F.D.O. ploughed straight through to Port Gregory and completely missed the ruins and so had to back track. The ruins found, camp was made and sleep in big demand. The Dennis Green party arrived shortly after but no words were exchanged until morning.

At 5.30 on Saturday morning "Tea Cosy" woke the entire neighbourhood with a friendly bellow and a small party were discussing whether or not to venture in to see how bad the track was. Arthur Horton's note had been discovered and Bob Klein's addendum had been read and a gloomy prospect seemed to be awaiting us all.

While waiting for a possible 8.00 bulletin from Bob Klein the bikies unloaded their machines for a quick check on the Port Gregory beaches where Rudy Lerch and son were plugging away in a murky heavy sea with little result for their efforts.

So back to the ruins where a sizeable convoy of vehicles had gathered and where it was discovered that the Flynn-Rowland party with Dennis Green and Ron Kildahl had ventured forth to see for themselves about an hour beforehand.

No word from Bob so with an appropriate sign erected it was off to Halfway. A mile or so down the track the gloom again descended when Bob and Ron Shirley arrived to inform us that Dennis had been stuck and things were just a little messy up ahead. The convoy was to wait at the mud hole for Bob's return from Gregory with John Speak. Three gates and some dust further on we saw it - a boggy mess with enormous ruts in the road and nice greasy soft ground on each side. There was Dennis, Brian, Ron Kildahl, Ron Flynn, Neville Risbey and party on one side and the convoy on the other. Things looked a little bleak!

With more information supplied it was decided to go into Lucky Bay and give Halfway a miss - all except Ron Kildahl, Neville Risbey and T. Richardson who pressed on into Halfway - and made it!

It was by no small effort on the part of Bob Klein that the party - all of them - reached their destination. He had spent many hours endeavouring to see us all safely through. The Club is greatly indebted to such a member for this great help. Thanks a million Bob - we could not have made it without you.

With camp established and gear unloaded the members were faced with a half mile drive, hike or whatever to the beach at Lucky Bay where the wind was in but not strong and the water looking pretty good. Wagon was already turned on but that didn't deter the Fremantle anglers who by now had gathered in force. The afternoon and evening promised some fine results.

56 Surfcasters signed on and a great deal of organising took place by people like Dennis Green, Lofty, Ron Flynn in a buggy and many others to see that no members had to walk - and none did! This is great Club spirit a little reminiscent of what often takes place on our field days in particular at Flinders Bay. The Fremantle club anglers also did the same.

So, in the setting sun, some eighty or so anglers settled down to drown mulies, mullet, etc in preparation for the weigh-in on Sunday morning.

The F.D.O. and his partners Mark Tucker took over an hour to do the trip back to the camp on this night - a distance of about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles. They were hopelessly lost for some time. It is interesting to note that they weren't the only ones. Lofty Griffiths - lost - tailed onto a Landrover which in turn tailed on to a 3-wheeler ridden by Bon Fardig - lost - who in turn tailed onto another rover - also lost; and this merry convoy drove around for some time each thinking - incorrectly -

All arrived back at camp tired and reasonably early. It had been a long day and for many an even longer trip back from the beach. Besides, no member wished to venture out from the camp too far at night for fear of a sabre-toothed sand flea that roamed the area. The gentleman who reported hearing this beast howling at the moon was mistaken - that was Snow snoring again!

The Sunday weigh-in brought forward only fair catches on the whole. The tailor weighed-in were of a good size but not plentiful. Fremantle anglers fared much better, producing snapper, tailor and one big mulloway 17.1K. Gary Gildersleeve who fished all night caught S.C.A.C.'s best fish a 16.5 K mulloway. The other kingie won the carton of cans which was promptly disposed of among members of both Clubs - Fremantle Anglers reciprocated beautifully with a block of cooked prawns. The barbecue had to be abandoned because of the danger of fire at this campsite but much friendly co-operation took place on the beach, tracks and at the campsite all through the weekend. Good catches were in from the Lerch father and son team, Gary Gildersleeve, Phil Isbister, and Wayne Shaw - this comparatively new junior weighed in the heaviest tailor - 3.0 K.

Sunday afternoon was sleep and eat time in preparation for the final onslaught that evening. With a weather change imminent anything could happen and all sorts of strange things did:-

1. Ernie Bailie mixed up the goulash for the Flynn-Rowland contingent using super grade petrol instead of water - lucky he didn't light the gas!
2. F.D.O. and Mark fell off the bike - second time.

Apart from Ken Jones' argument with a roo - tick and Sharon Lee's collection of one too, nothing else exciting seemed to happen. It was feverish packing for the trip home - sunburnt, tired, dusty and with pleasant memories of another Wago field day to take back, and a few fish too.

This Club's total of 143 K (about 312 lbs) compares with the previous effort of last year, as does the attendance. Best captures were made by Gary Gildersleeve 21.9 K (Mulloway and Tailor), Rudy Lerch 14.8 K (Tailor), Phil Isbister 11.9 K (Mulloway and Tailor), Ralph Lerch 10.0 K (Tailor) and Wayne Shaw's 3.0 K (Tailor) - the rest of the catch was in the main, made up of 1 to 2 K (2 to 4 lbs) Tailor.

Once again, thank you Bob Klein for your help and thank you to those members who assisted in transporting other members to and from the beach - without such help the field day could have been disastrous.

Until Cervantes in November when a record attendance is expected to bring in a record catch - see you.
