The October meeting was attended by 24 delegates of affiliated clubs at the Dept. Youth, Sport and Recreation, Perry Lakes. Club delegate attending: George Holman.

Recorder pointed out that a new book on Poisonous Fishes will be on sale from the W.A. Museum prior to Christmas.

Drycasting Officer reported on forthcoming State Open Drycasting to be run by the Surfcasters and expressed disappointment at the number of entries, particularly in view of the excellent work put into the event by the organising club.

The date for the Bunbury cast looks like being 29th March, 1981.

The Sportsman of the Year presentation night will be Friday, 21st November and held at the Sheraton Hotel and will be televised. Our delegate, George Holman, is this year's nominee for Angling.

It was moved and carried that any monies received from grants to State teams going away next year to the Australian Convention be divided equally between team members and officials.

The 1981 "Day of Sport" will be held on Saturday, 6th June (not long weekend) and it was suggested that the A.A.A. of W.A. run the State Estuary event on that date.

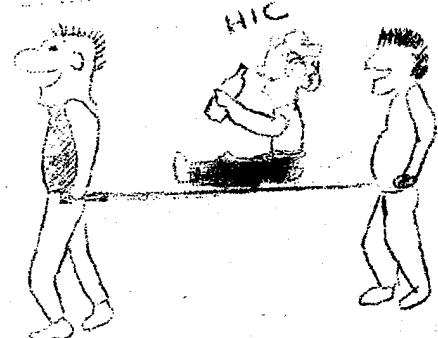
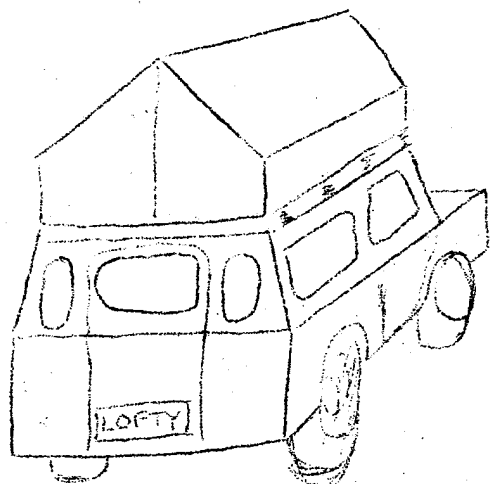

That in November WE'RE DUE BACK HERE!!!!!!!!!!

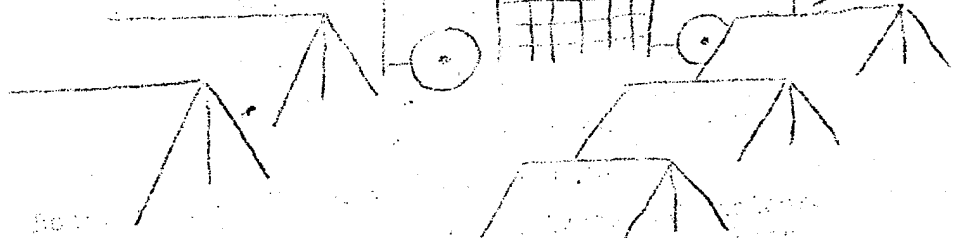
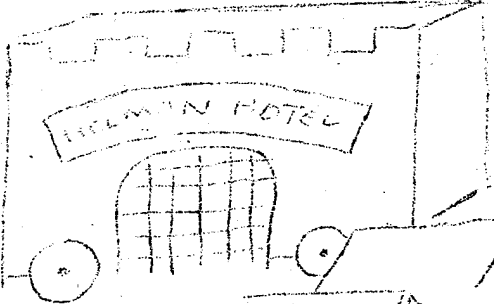

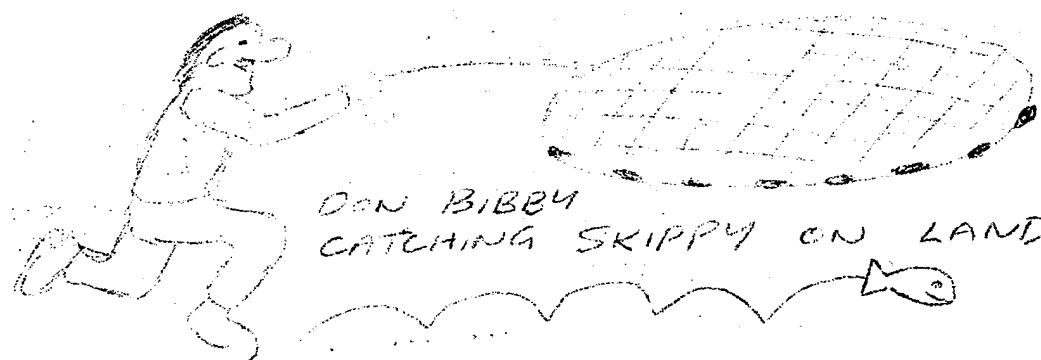
