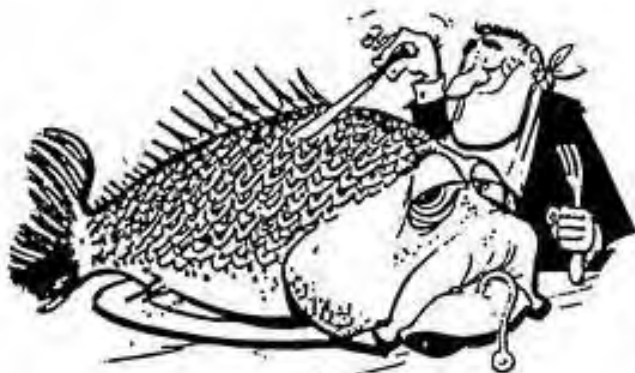
MEETINGS

An old member of long standing, Selwyn Bessell-Brown passed away recently and to his immediately family goes the condolences of all our club members.

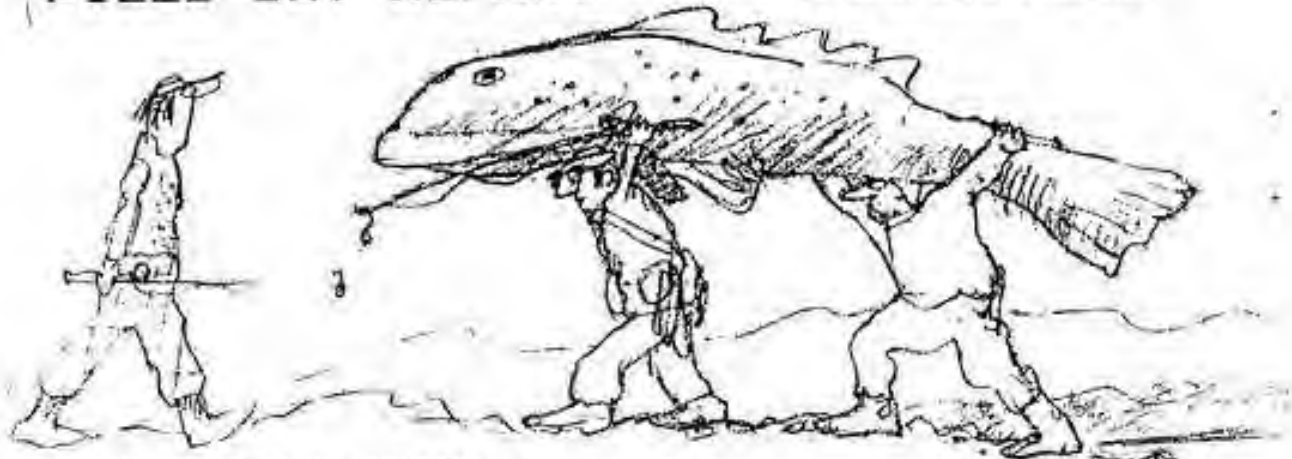

Joe Curulli also has a secret spot where he frequently manages to get some mulloway. This year he has had two over 3kg each, making us all quite jealous.

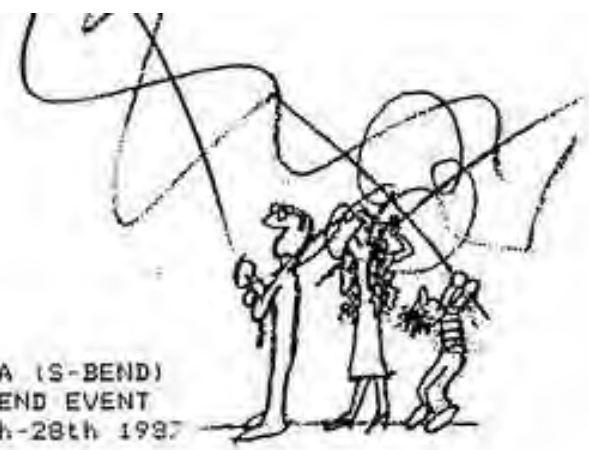

DUTCH OVEN

A-LA-SHARRONE CANADAR



MUSSELS- A LA SHARON

INGREDIENTS:-

1kg mussels
1 large tin vegetable juice
1 onion, sliced
2 sticks of celery sliced
1 carrot sliced thinly or in julienne strips
Worcester sauce to taste
Chilli sauce (optional)
Salt and pepper (crushed peppercorns are best)
Herbs to suit (eg. basil, chives)
1 bay leaf
Small amount of garlic granules.

METHOD:-

Soak mussels in large pot of cold water. Remove the beards from mussels. Discard any mussels that don't close by themselves.

Saute onions in small amount of butter. Add celery and bay leaf. Add tin of vegetable juice, worcester sauce, seasonings. Bring to boiling point.

Add mussels cover and heat gently until mussels are open.

Serve with brown bread and a green salad.

Serves 2-4, depending on how much you like mussels.
