DRY CASTING - 1ST SEPTEMBER, 1963

Twenty six members, three juniors and one visitor turned up to casting on Father's Day and although it was a beautiful spring day the atmosphere seemed heavy for after each cast the lines could be seen drifting slowly down taking up to ten seconds to drop after reaching their maximum distance but even so Bill Bridger sent one beauty 406 ft. down the lane. Following Bill came Allan Bunnett 380 ft., Bob Lilly 376 ft. and Noel Knight 375 ft.

Ken Wiggins top scored in the Level Line Distance event with 302 - 149 - 451 (the only Senior to reduce his handicap). Noel Knight and Allan Bunnett seem to be having a Royal Duel with Noel Taking second place with 363 - 76 - 439 and Allan close behind with 368 - 69 - 437.

Eight members scored with all four casts in the Double Handed Accuracy. Showing us how was Allan Bunnett again with 56/80 followed by Bob Lilly 50/80 and Bob Tichbon 47/80. Although no bulls were recorded three members had "near misses" - Bill Bridger, Bill Utting and Ron Kildahl.

The Single Handed Accuracy turned in some excellent scores, Allan Bunnett and Bob Tucker 29/40 were only one short of the record established by Bob Lilly last month. Bill Bridger was next with 25/40 followed by Hal Neil 23/40. Allan scored his 29 in only three casts, two bulls and a near miss (must have been practising).

Bob Tucker, Hal Neil and Keith Mulvay also scored a bull. Near misses were recorded by J. Harvey, H. Gregory, G. Greenham, R. Jensen, W. Bridger and R. Kildahl. Bob Lilly, Bob Tucker and Keith Mulvay scored with all four casts.

The longest cast in the Single Handed Open event again went to Bob Tucker with a cast of 237 ft. followed by Noel Knight 222 ft. and Bob Lilly 210 ft.

The only adjustment necessary to the handicaps was Ken Wiggins 149 - 134.

After five months Allan Bunnett has increased his lead by top scoring

for the September Casting day with 131 points, made up of 36 points L.L. Distance, 56 points D.H. Accuracy, 29 points S.H. Accuracy and of course 10 points attendance - a really creditable performance.

With the Single Handed Open event reaching the halfway mark Bob Tucker is building up a handy lead with Bob Lilly, Noel Knight having a tussle for second honours. Following is the list of scores as they now stand :-

FIELD DAY - NORTH END GARDEN ISLAND - 14TH & 15TH SEPTEMBER, 1963

Weather conditions : Squally North West winds with heavy showers during the night. Massive rollers crashing on to the outer reefs and rolling into the various bays made us wonder just when we are going to crack a fine weekend for a change. The adverse conditions apparently contributed to the poor attendance of 21 members and 6 juniors and the meagre catch of only 56lbs. plus a ray and a fiddle shark, but the prominence of the juniors with several good sized Tailor and Skips. was a credit to their ability.

On arrival at the Island, Jim Hawkins had the truck ready to go and after loading the gear we set off along the main road for about 4 miles and then turned off on a side track until we arrived at a suitable campsite. After unloading everyone set to with a will first of all to clear the area of all rubbish and dispatch sundry centipedes, spiders etc. with the axe and then to erect the large tent fly. G. Davidson, K. Wilson and R. Hancock set up the fire place and soon had the billy boiling while Ron Shirley, Phil Neri and Bob Klein set up their various tents which incidently aroused considerable interest.

After a hot drink and lunch we all set off to inspect the nearby beaches - what a sight - pounding surf and churned up sand everywhere. Tiger Lilly, Tom Smith, Ian McLennan and Jerry Windus settled their camp alongside a cliff out of the howling wind. Tiger "Kildare" Lilly was called upon to operate on Jerry Windus to remove a hook from the palm of his hand and a very competent job he performed. Incidently the first aid kit was kept busy, the rocky foreshore taking toll of toes etc.

Shortly after 3.30 p.m. the second truck arrived with another merry group led by Norm Clark, Allen Livesey and Snow Tate. I was pleased to see G. Hampton and young Stephen on the venue and Allan Bunnett proved to be a lifesaver with his tent. New member Ken Jones was observed busily preparing his bed roll although as events turned out he did not use it. When everyone departed for the beach he accompanied Bob and Rick Jensen and Kevin Clugston southwards. Later in the evening when Bob, Rick and Kevin had given up and headed back to camp in blinding rain and a howling gale, Ken braved the elements to carry on a while longer. The conditions were really against us as even in this protected bay, a cast of 40 yards against the wind was a mighty effort.

On returning to camp we found Killer Kildahl and Burley Shirley discussing the gloomy weather and lack of fish, although they assured me that they would more than make up the score at the next venue. We tried to liven things up a bit by telling Allan Bunnett about the centipedes and spiders but he didn't turn a hair.

Came the dawn and many of the lads moved off to do battle with the elements again but the results were disappointing. Bob Tucker did manage a Tailor and several Skippy from a Northern bay but by 8.00 a.m. the weigh-in, which was very brief, was complete and the awards made. Two incidents occurred while we were waiting for the truck's arrival that made me feel proud of our club spirit and they were Bill Utting's gesture in donating his award to the building fund and Bob Jensen handing his award to the juniors. Another member worthy of note while on the subject is Snow Tate with his now popular contribution and Phil Neri was very glad to replace some of his lost line with six new spools!

THE NORRIE CROSS TROPHY

Norrie Cross, our popular member, who is at present stationed at Darwin with the R.A.A.F. has very generously donated a Cup for the most improved caster in the club.

The trophy will be known as "The Norrie Cross Trophy for the most Improved Caster". It will be competed for annually until such time as a member wins it outright by being the first member to average 450ft. in the Level Line Distance event.

The following is the method by which the points will be allocated :-

First two casting days at commencement of Competition not to count.

First two casting days of new members not to count.

1 point for each foot of handicap reduced to 150ft.
