ROTFEST ISLAND VENUE - SEPTEMBER 1967

The chartering of the "Panterai" was a most popular move, and 47 stalwarts boarded her at Fremantle, and shortly after leaving the inner harbour were reduced to about 10 stalwarts, and 37 not so happy anglers; notable of which was Hew Hoy Yew, who began burlying at a very early stage, and Doug Savage who seemed to show a great desire to keep him company.

Many thanks to the way the fellows helped me get my bookwork done before my eyes got out of focus!

On arrival at the Island, Bob Jensen and party chose to flog the old spot, now known as Jensen's Inlet, and the remainder split between Bald Hill Club Huts and Radar Reef.

A fairly stiff southerly wind made the conditions at Radar somewhat precarious, and tales of tripod anglers getting wet behind the ears were common.

However, two cyclists tipped us that Salmon were on at Ricy Beach and about twenty rods were soon bending to their weight, but a tip that large sharks were to be caught at North Point gave some of us a fruitless four or five hours.

Arriving back at the huts at 9.00 p.m., we found some of the lads already in their sleeping bags, and piles of Salmon in every direction. At this stage Doug Savage, Hew Hoy Yew and Jim Strong together with Ray Ginbey were the most successful, and were all knocking 80 to 100 lbs each. Lofty Griffiths arrived back from Radar with a long dismal face telling the tale of the scarcity of fish in that direction, and the lads closed their eyes and dreamed of massive salmon hauls in the morning.

As it turned out the salmon were on, but only from the reefs at the Eastern end of Ricy, and it was at this point that a lone Doug Savage was adding to his score, together with the odd tailor. He built up his bag to a record 168 lbs of fish. Great effort Doug!

The weigh-in at the jetty finally totalled a further record of 1176 lbs. fish, giving us a total for five field days of 2157 lbs. which is over half of our yearly total caught this month.

A few individual fish of note was Jim Strong's 12 lb. Salmon, Andy Mulgrave's 3.1/2 lb. Trevally, with one of 4 lbs by George Holman, Ray Hunt with a possible State record 4 lb. Harlequin fish and the first eligible shark this year. A massive 9 lbs. Whaler by Doug Newton.

The trip back was pleasant with calm seas and a mild breeze.

My apologies to members for the over-loaded truck. We learn from experience and will endeavour to hire two trucks in future. It is hoped that no gear was damaged, and that all members will bear with it on this occasion.

A final word to John Nicholls, the Alvey Representative, for his informative and interesting talk and demonstration, and we hope you enjoyed your weekend, John.
