"The present points system for the level line distance event be discarded and that a new system, of 10% of the average of three casts, plus the handicap, be adapted to take effect from the commencement of the new drycasting season."

DRY CASTING NEWS AND RESULTS:

To take advantage of existing conditions it was decided after prolonged discussion (lasting many seconds) by the D.C.O.'s to hold the D.H. Open Distance as the first event..

Numerous B.O.'s occurred during this, as any thoughts of a penalty were removed and most members really let go. DREW SHAW had a 6 oz sinker on his 9 lb line. This combination wasn't successful as there came a parting and I later noticed DREW switch back to a smaller missile.

In general the distances were below that of the L.L. Handicap. The OPEN was finally won by JOHN DEVITT with a cast of 458 feet. GRAHAM ROSS and GRAHAM BASKERVILLE had a keen tussle for second place, only 1 foot separating their best casts of 406 and 405 feet respectively.

After this event had concluded the normal schedule prevailed A-J's in accuracy and K's-Z on the distance. Much good natured bantering and heckling came from the former during the S.H. Acc and there must have been some rivalry between contestants. BILL UTTING scored a "Bull", his first for a considerable time. RUDY LERCH came close and finished with a 10. The winner of the S.H. Acc. was BILL UTTING with 22/40. A tie for second on 21/40 was RON KILDAHL and yours truly. Third place to BILL MORROW with 20/40. As indicated by the scores a close competition.

SNOW TATE scored his "Bull" in the practise session on the D.H. Acc. and DICK HOLLAND achieved his feat under the tense conditions of the contest. Consistant scoring won first place for DOUG TALBOT with 62/80. Next came RICK ROWLANDS 49/80 (we haven't seen Rick's name here for some time) followed by BILL UTTING (we've seen his) with 46/80.

Curiously enough the distances achieved in the L.L. Hcp. were better than those of the Open Dist, which had the advantage of better conditions and an early start. Best distance was gained by JOHN DEVITT with 471 feet (monotonous isn't it). Three new names appear in the placings at the conclusion of this segment of casting, BASIL MARSH, ERIC PARKER and ROY BARTON in that order.

The overall winner was RICK ROWLAND with total points of 96. Nice going Rick! Second place went to BILL MORROW (Bill was second last month) with 93 points followed by TONY SMITH with 87.

Thirty one keen competitors faced the whistle and the days casting started promptly at 9 a.m. Several visitors were observed during casting, notably one chap who collared BOB TICHBON to have a look at his overhead geared reel. Had to call Bob a bit loudly at times as he was tangled up with his work.

Overheard BOB TUCKER saying that owing to an electricity failure he was denied his morning cup-of-coffee. This apparently upset his casting (maybe). Well fella's there is one way to put Bob out of the running - nick round first thing and switch off his power. Of course other top casters may also have their Achilles Heel. If so beware!

RULES FOR THE USE OF CLUB HUTS ON BARE HILL-ROTTNEST

1. Huts shall be known as the top and lower hut.
2. Keys are available from Jack Harvey, 78 Eric St. Cottesloe.

3. Keys must be returned immediately on return to mainland.
4. No duplicate keys are to be cut.
5. A fee of 50 cents per person per week or part thereof to be paid to the custodian.
6. One hut to be kept available for the use of clubmembers only. Mixed parties may hire the other hut. Applications for the use of huts is to be made as early as possible, and will be allocated in order of application received. Keys to be signed for in key register.
7. Person obtaining key shall be responsible for collecting and paying in fees to key custodian.
8. Huts to be left clean after use.
9. No empty milk bottles, tins, etc., to be left in huts on departure.
10. All crockery etc., to be washed and stacked away.
11. Kero stoves (2) and lamps are provided. Fuel for same to be replaced by users.
12. Rubbish to be burried well clear of huts, as digging can cause erosion.
13. No fish or bait to be bought into huts except in ice boxes.
14. Any damage to huts or equipment shall be repaired or replaced by the person responsible.
15. Toilets - a bore pan and pedestal is provided and must be used at all times. Hessian and piping is also provided.
16. Huts to be securely locked when leaving.
17. Infringements of these rules could lead to a refusal of future hire. Your Committee would like to see these huts used frequently as this is our best protection against vandalism.
