Conditions were rough and care had to be taken in selection of places to fish. The team was split in two and fished different locations. One party found conditions a little rough for the type of fishing they wished to do but despite this, they managed to weigh in some good fish. SEPTEMBER CAST:

The weather ran true to form for the drycasting, with a couple of showers to keep us on our toes. Even though it was Father's Day and the start of the holidays for some, we had an attendance of 24 members, made of of 20 seniors and 4 juniors.

The winner of the day was RON KILDAHL with 118 points, followed by DENNIS GREEN with 114 and GEORGE HOLMAN with 113.

The winner of the juniors section was GEOFF RENSHAW with 81 points.

L.L. DISTANCE:

The event turned out to be a close one with six of the casters sharing the top three places. These were BOB TUCKER and GEORGE HOLMAN on 35, TOM CORCORAN on 34 with DENNIS GREEN, DAVE LATTO and RUDY LERCH on 33. The Juniors were not far behind with DON TAYLOR on 32 and GEOFF RENSHAW on 31.

LES REID, NORM RENSHAW and ERIC PARKER all had a breakoff each with Eric also casting the top six to eight inches off his rod as well.

D.H. ACCURACY:

In this event, RON KILDAHL showed everyone that he appreciated the absence of the vocal coaching of Bill Morrow and Brian Leicester, who were not in attendance, by scoring a well deserved 62. He was followed by GEORGE HOLMAN on 53, JIM STRONG 51, DAVE LATTO 48 and GUS SUSSEMEYER on 47. The leading Junior in this event was MARK TUCKER with 27 points.

S.H. ACCURACY:

DENNIS GREEN was the top scorer in this event with a total of 34, with ERIC PARKER 22, GEOFF RENSHAW (J) 20, JIM OXLEY 19 and RON KILDAHL on 18.

They tell me that BOB TUCKER was having a bit of trouble with his rod in this event and so he borrowed a rod and scored top points with one of his casts.

D.H. OPEN:

The casting in this event was fairly close with GEORGE HOLMAN throwing down the best cast with 398 feet, followed by BOB TUCKER with 377 feet, LES REID 375 feet, TOM CORCORAN and RUDY LERCH both with 370 feet and DENNIS GREEN and MICK GEDDES with 357 feet.

With there being a few noticeable absentees at the casting, the top twenty underwent some changes, with GEORGE HOLMAN clearing away to be on top with a total of 571, a clear 93 points ahead of BRIAN LEICESTER on 478 and LES REID on 462.

The October cast will also include the Single Handed Open that was cancelled at the August cast, as well as the usual morning's events.
