The Difference between 'FAST' and 'SLOW':

Imagine two drivers, each in identical cars, setting out on a 1600 km trip, one of them determined to cover the distance in the shortest time possible within the law and the other more concerned about avoiding unnecessary risks and pacing himself as the traffic flow permitted. This situation was set up experimentally in West Germany with surprising results.

<u>Factor</u>	<u>'SLOW' DRIVER</u>	<u>'FAST' DRIVER</u>

The 'fast' driver finished only 29 minutes ahead of the (slow' driver, which was not much of a saving on a 1600km journey over 20 hours. He braked twice as often causing twice as much wear and tear on his brakes, and also passed more than 3 times as many cars, thus subjecting himself to three times as much accident exposure.

Finding these test results hard to believe, a West German motor club repeated the experiment over a 1280km course only to confirm the original findings and to further conclude that the 'fast'driver used 45 more litres than the 'slow' driver.
