DRY CASTING - 4TH AUGUST, 1963

Once again an excellent roll-up of thirty one members and three juniors took part in the casting and although the weather was threatening we were able to complete the events with only one down pour and that before the casting started. Hugh Gregory, with a mighty cast of 391ft. just pipped Noel Knight and Bill Bridger both with 390ft. and Bob Lilly next with 387ft. for the longest distance.

Hugh Gregory top scored in this event with a mighty 369 - 153 - 504 (with the result his handicap has been nearly halved). Noel Wilkerson after two months absence came back with a vengeance to take second honours with 299 - 166 - 465 and Jack Harvey taking third position with 282 - 180 - 462.

In the Double Handed Accuracy we saw Alan Bunnett score all four casts including a near miss to take top honours of 60/80, four short of the record, with Hal Neil second 48/80 and Bob Jensen third 42/80. These three members were the only ones to score with all four casts.

The Single Handed Accuracy record was broken by Bob Lilly with four mighty casts 8 - 5 - 8 - 9 for a total of 30/40, second was John Bellman (two near misses) 26/40 and third place was shared by Ron Shirley and Bill Bridger 24/40. Eight members scored with all four casts.

Alan Bunnett was the only member to score with all eight casts in the accuracy events.

SEPTEMBER FIELD DAY Despite extensive effort by members of the committee the field day to Rottnest will have to be deferred until satisfactory transport arrangements can be made. The alternative venue will however break new ground for the majority of members as it is proposed to visit the North end of Garden Island.

Two boats will run as usual, departing from Palm Beach jetty at 9.30 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. on Saturday. Two trucks will carry members and gear northwards from each boat, with the advance party on the early boat to set up camp. It is also proposed to have hot water available for everyone at the campsite. Jim Strong will be in charge of the 9.30 a.m. boat and Norm Clark with the 2.00 boat.

When the second party have arrived and settled in, a briefing will be held regarding local geography etc. and everyone to depart for the beach at the same time. The weigh-in will be held at the camping site between 8.00 and 8.30 a.m. Sunday morning with the trucks commencing the return trip at 9.00 a.m.

If anyone has a tent they would be prepared to lend, could they contact Jim Strong before or at the General Meeting. Further details will be given at the Meeting, and members' interest will determine whether this trip will be the forerunner of more to the same area.

FIELD DAY- GARDEN ISLAND - 17TH & 18TH AUGUST, 1963

Weather Conditions: Gusty North-West to Westerly winds with heavy showers during the night and early morning which of course made angling difficult, though as usual the lads just plugged on. Eighteen members, one visitor and four juniors attended the venue - probably the adverse weather report plus problems on the home front kept many members away.

The northern beaches were really stirred up and plenty of weed moving through the whole area. Though of course no-one fished this immediate area, Ron Shirley, "Killer" Kildahl, Bill Utting and junior R. Hancock fished down from the gun position which has some protection from the westerly winds. This party were rewarded for their efforts with a catch between them of six Mulloway and several Tailor, including among which was the heaviest scale fish, a 4½lb. Mulloway caught by Bill Utting. Also in this area Ron Shirley reported that they noticed several snakes, most of which slithered away into the bush and one five or six footer which just gave them a glassy stare.

Earlier in the morning, Phil Neri, Bob Tichbon and myself strolled over and examined the back beaches - which we decided were unfishable - and then moved down south, after leaving word with Jim Hawkins for the benefit of Norm Clark and the boys on the afternoon boat. Meanwhile, Alan Livesey and "Snow" Tate had their lunch and set off for their hot-spot near the whiting hole. That it paid off was evident at the weigh-in next morning when Alan took off the heaviest bag with mainly Skippy and an excellent King George Whiting of 2lb., while "Snow" managed his share of the Skippy.

When our party commenced fishing at the Flank, it appeared that Phil's special burley would leave Bob and I for dead, however later in the afternoon we managed a dozen or so Herring. Towards the evening, Bob switched to a blob and Mulie rig and succeeded in getting his name on the board for a while after he battled the howling westerly and rocky ledges to land two good sized Tailor. However the conditions eventually beat us and we returned to the hut where some of the lads had prepared a piping hot cuppa.

Norm Clark arrived back at the hut soon after, with a nice bag of Skippy and preparations began with gear for the mornings' effort. Bob Tucker was noticed instructing Alf Rutland in the intricacies of Skippy rigs and Tom Smith also rigged similarly before lights went out at 10.0 p.m. Most of the lads intended rising about 5 a.m., though heavy rain through the night caused a few of the saner types to remain in their bed rolls. Norm Clark braved the elements however and was rewarded with three Tailor.

Hugh Gregory and myself joined Bob, Alf and Tom to slosh our way southwards to the Plank but the Herring and Skippy failed to show. Bob took Alf to his Skippy hole and indicated where to cast. Alf, eager to go, cast in the general direction - but that's where his problems started. The air got bluer and his rigs got fewer until eventually he decided that rock hopping was strictly for the birds and he would stick to beach angling. Some one took their life in their hands when they invited Alf to attend dry casting, but seriously when you want to reach a spot 80 yards out, surrounded by reefs, Floreat Park is the place to attain the required accuracy.

The weigh-in was conducted with the usual enthusiasm and interest and it was very pleasing to receive the help I did with the necessary chores of cleaning up etc. The boat was loaded without incident and the trip to Palm Beach successfully negotiated. After unloading the boat many members were observed beating their heads on the jetty at the sight of a 20lb. Snapper which had just been landed.

Well that just about wraps it up for another month, congrats. to the award winners - they were hard earned. A couple of points I missed on reflection were Phil Neri and J. Harvey catching Herring from the gantry Sunday morning - the absence of Bob Lilly - new member Ken Jones being taken for a tour of the beaches by Norm Clark.

Don't forget to let Norm or I have any news of incidents that occur on the venue - it all helps to make a story.
