D. Garnett opened his account with good scores, and won our D.H. Distance, followed closely by H. Barrot and third place to N. Knight. In this event the longest cast was once again by W. Bridger with a distance of 405 ft.

D.H. Accuracy - this top score goes to our Dry Casting Assistant, Eric Sullivan - even though he was kept busy throughout the morning, he put up a good show with a score of 53/80. There were two members who tied for second place, D. Garnett and W. Bridger with 47/80, and Ken Jones followed closely with 46/80.

S.H. Accuracy - this was won by W. Bridger with 28/40 and G. Holman second with 26/40, and R. Tucker 25/40 third.

This week we held our second series of the Open Single Handed Distance event. R. Tucker is still leading the field with his terrific cast, and gained top place with 229 ft., second place to N. Knight, with 220 ft., followed closely by K. Jones 219 ft.

The overall winner for the day was Eric Sullivan with 108 points, a well deserved win. Good going Eric, keep it up !! (from Tom).

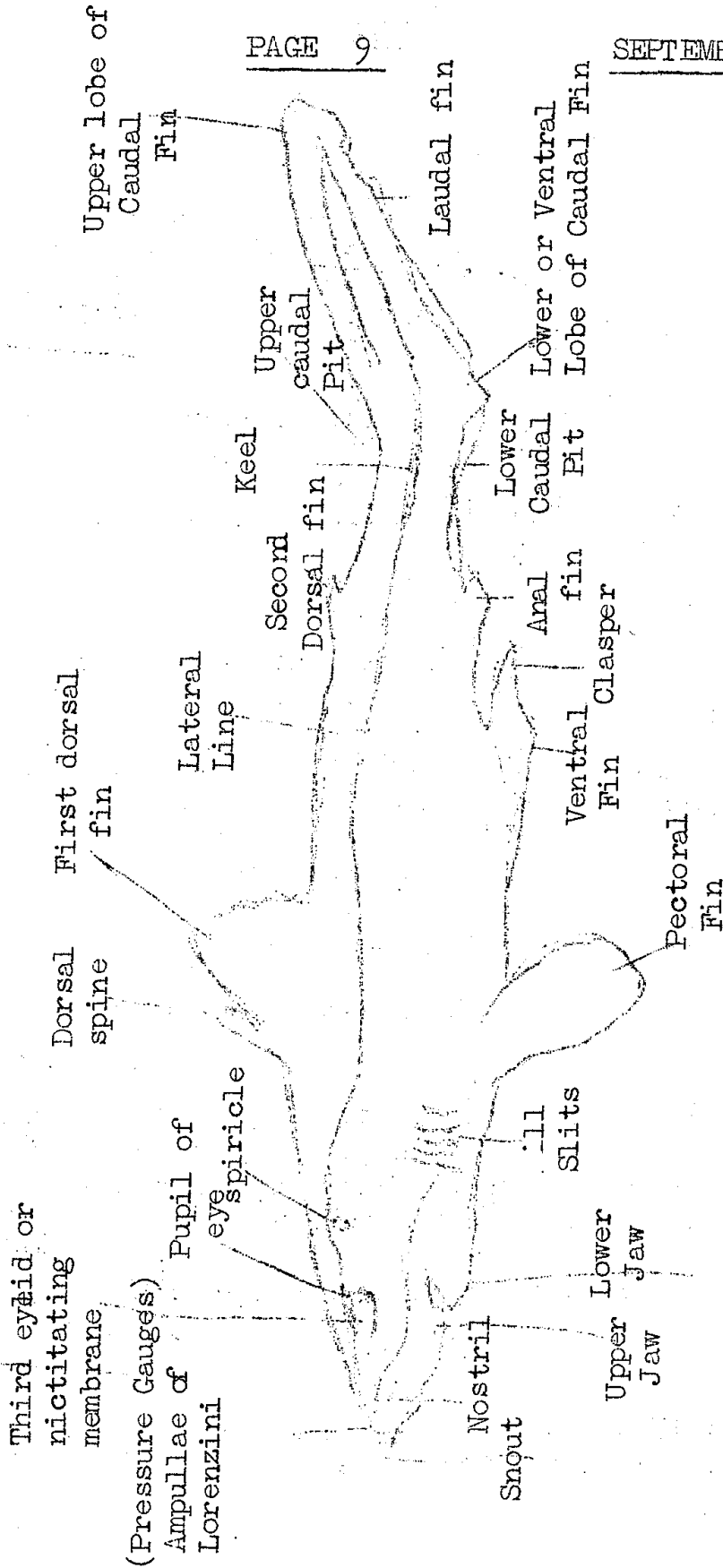

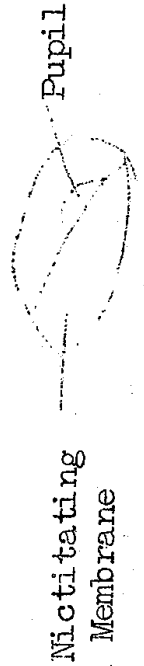
1 set of waterproof gear -- owner can have same after description. This was left after August F.D.
