1981 DRYCASTING STATE TEAMS REPORT:

The 1981 State Teams Drycasting Championships was conducted at Yokine Reserve, Cnr Alexander Drive & Wordsworth Ave., on Sunday, 26th July and was conducted by the Surfcasting & Angling Club of W.A. George Holman was Casting Officer.

There were 9 Open Teams, 6 Women and 6 Junior teams competing for a total of 98 competitors.

Conditions were overcast with some showers and still to slight following wind until 2 p.m. when the wind strengthened considerably for the tailend of the artificial bait event and the accuracy event.

Competition was keen throughout and some good casting was the result. Ron Thomas scored 140 out of the possible 200 in the accuracy for a new State Record. George Holman topped both 112 gram V Court distance and 112 gram artificial bait and also had longest cast in both events with 151.03 metres and 139.36 metres respectively.

In the womens events, D. Thomas had longest cast in 112 gram V Court with 104.55 metres and the 112 gram artificial bait saw F. D'Alonzo cast 98.87 metres. D. Thomas obtained 100 per cent on both distance events. S. Vandenberg had 57 out of 100 to top the accuracy.

The Junior 112 gram V Court saw P. Haynes get the 100 per cent and also put down the longest cast of 106.34 metres. The artificial bait event saw Chris Waddams cast the longest with 95.57 metres and also take off the 100 per cent. H. Sattel topped the accuracy with 62 out of the 100.

As can be seen the Executive is in big trouble. The position of Secretary and Treasurer are vacant, so, if anyone thinks they can fill these positions please come forward. The position of Secretary carries an Honorarium of \$750 per year and a lot of work.

Minister for Recreation has sent the \$630 we paid towards the travelling expenses of the recent team to the South Australian Angling Championship.

The recent Fishing Clinic saw a profit of \$1507 made. A lot of goodwill was created and augers well for the future of events of this kind. The attendance was 300-325 each night and initially around 200 applicants were turned away because of a full attendance.

The recent Open Beach Tournament that the Association was asked to run on behalf of the Boat Show Committee was conducted on the 16th August between the North Mole and the Cable Station. Conditions were appalling and entries low (120 approx.). There was a lot of doubt as to the validity of some of the fish that were weighed in bearing in mind the quality of the trophies. (Boats and motors and the like!)

Northern Districts reported on the forthcoming Estuary Championship to be held on Saturday and Sunday, 29/30th August. Everything was well in hand. Minimum length of fish not listed is 18cm.

The Surfcasters gave a report on the recent State Teams Drycasting along with details which were given to all participating clubs.
